PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The sudden death of HM Queen Elizabeth II has saddened us all and Monkton Parish Council were proud to follow the official protocols required of parish councils. This meant a flurry of activity on the day after her death with the purchase of a book of condolence which had to be available for people to sign on that day and notices being put on the notice boards and on Facebook. We are extremely grateful to Sara, our Parish Clerk, for guiding us through the finer details of the strict procedures. The frantic rush ended on Monday 12 September with the reading of the official Proclamation, which announces the death of a monarch and acknowledges the accession of a new one.

This ancient Proclamation ceremony dates back to Norman times and was the only means of passing on this news in the days before the internet, railways or even newspapers.

To return to more local events, we are very pleased to announce the Grand Opening of the new play area. This will take place at 1pm on Saturday 1 October at the Recreation Ground. We are offering the opportunity for the Play Area to be named after your child/grandchild.

All names of eligible children (those who live in the village, have grandparents in the village or attend Monkton school) who turn up will go in a hat and a name drawn on the day. The winner will also be asked to cut the ribbon for the official opening.

At the last Parish Council meeting, Jason Button was co-opted to the council. We very much look forward to his contribution to our team. He has made a great start by attending a Climate Literacy training course, which will hopefully help the parish to lower our carbon footprint. All villagers are welcome to attend Parish Council meetings and there is an opportunity for you to have your say on any issues that you feel need addressing. There have been no significant planning applications recently, but we are still awaiting the outcome of the Heyhill appeal.

The ongoing saga of the buses continues. The No 11 was initially axed, but following action by Sir Roger Gale and Preston Parish Council, the route was reinstated for school travel and a very limited service during the day, which would enable residents to access Westwood Cross, but not Canterbury. The No 9, which used to run between Westwood Cross and Canterbury is now limited to a service between Monkton and Ramsgate. This is now an hourly circular route, which enables people from Monkton to get to Minster, but the return route to Monkton is via Ramsgate (an hour's journey!) There is now no useful bus service to Canterbury and the suggested route entails a 30 minute walk to St Nicholas to catch the No 8.

VIEWPOINT

Pastoral Reflection: Sally Willins – Licensed Lay Minister to the Wantsum Benefice.

After so many weeks without rain it was a joy to hear the water-butts filling! We have seven; four of which take water from the shed and run in a regimented line with a feed hose from one to the other.

Water-butts are a useful analogy for the nature of human generosity. Just as the rain falls from the skies, finds its way into a receptacle for storage, and is then allowed to flow out for the benefit of our flowers and vegetables; so it is with whatever comes our way.

If we are on the receiving end of a particular talent; if we have free time; perhaps a little spare cash; or feel deeply impassioned about something – then a generous nature inspires us to freely pass on the benefits of whatever we store in our metaphorical personal water-butt! The tap is turned on and we share for the benefit of others: a teaching skill, a creative skill, time to give to family, friends, organisations; donations to charities; energy and vision to a particular cause close to our heart, and so on.

It's all about acknowledging who we are and what makes us tick, and then sharing: passing on ...

I personally believe it's this water-butt way of thinking which helps create 'society-frameworks' in which people can thrive and flourish.

For those of us who call ourselves Christians one of the ways in which we are called to exercise our faith is by sharing the blessings we have received. And for each of us, that will be demonstrated differently. However, it's always useful to re-evaluate the extent of our sharing from time to time, and to honestly assess whether the impact of that continues to be felt in ways which enable others to spiritually flourish: to ask whether the tap is turned on sufficiently and for the right reasons, perhaps!! And I acknowledge that it's not always easy to discover the answer to that particular question, so we continue to walk closely with our Lord and Saviour, seeking his guidance and prompting.

At a recent Parochial Church Council meeting at Minster, we began by looking at a few verses from Psalm 40 and I close with the words from verse 10.

I have not kept the good news of your justice hidden in my heart;

I have talked about your faithfulness and saving power.

I have told everyone in the great assembly of your unfailing love and faithfulness.

Ann settled comfortably at first, then her condition worsened and she died peacefully on 27th August. The funeral service and cremation was held in Reading on 27th September in the presence of family and friends.

In consultation with Ann's family, it has been agreed that we shall have a special Commemoration of Ann's life amongst us included in the Benefice Service at

St Nicholas' Church at 10.30am on Sunday, 30th October.

MEMORIES OF MONKTON

Monkton Marshes

Last month I referred that the marshes in the Parish looked a lot different in the 1960's than they do today. Just about all of our marshes would have been under grass. The fields were laid out completely different than they are today. Not many fields exceeded 15 acres [6 hectares] in area and they were of all shapes, and most of them outlined by shallow dykes with Hawthorns and Brambles along their banks. It was a time when dairy herds and sheep were seen on most of the marshes in Thanet, and would have grazed the fields from March/April until October/November. How long they were on the marshes depended on when they were dry enough for the animals and not too wet as to destroy the grass.

The water table on the marshes would have been two or three feet higher than it is today with some of the fields being under water for several months during the winter.

Towards the end of the 1960's the change started. Mr Willett of Parsonage Farm [Docker Hill Farm] sold their dairy herd and started to plough up his marshes and sow them in wheat and barley [a late friend of mine, the late Vic Ward, was contracted to plough the fields, and spent nearly all winter doing it with a 50hp, two wheel drive David Brown tractor and a three furrow plough].

An even bigger change happened at the beginning of the 1970's when the marshes were drained. At a time when the government wanted this country to produce as much of its own food as possible. The marshes produce excellent crops of cereals and some root crops [although the latter depended on how soon the ground dried out in the spring].

The Hawthorns and Brambles were grubbed out and most of the old dykes were filled in and new ones, in straight lines, were dug. Most of the fields on the marshes had tile drains put across them.

By the early 1980's nearly all the dairy herds and sheep had gone and most of Thanet's marshes went under the plough. Joining the Common Market in 1973 with its subsidies for growing crops, the over production of milk [remember the butter mountain], and other animal products can be blamed for a lot of the change. Many blamed the farmers for being greedy and implementing these changes. Having spent most of my life working the land I have always been of the opinion that most of these changes would not have happened the way they did without the encouragement and financial backing of various governments at that time.

STARGAZING IN MONKTON

If there was a silver lining to be found from our imposed lockdown in 2020, it was a new found fascination for all things astronomical. It was a colleague at work who had mentioned in our "let's all check in daily" WhatsApp group about Elon Musk's Starlink. So, in April 2020 we found ourselves on a clear night looking up at the sky wondering what to look out for. How on earth had we not spotted satellites whizzing across the sky before? And that was that, watching those little trail of lights moving across the sky started a night sky gazing obsession. Of course, there's nothing like catching an actual shooting star or two, rather than man made space hardware to make it all worthwhile. August has the best meteor shower of the year, the Perseids, but there are more throughout the year. October sees the Orionids, associated with the Orion constellation with the peak around 21/22 October from midnight. The shower comes from the most famous comet of all, Halley's comet.

I recommend taking the time to turn off the TV and get yourself outside. Look up! It's free entertainment and although it sounds like a bit of a cliche, so good for a bit of mindfulness. And if you can't quite tear yourself away from your phone – just download one of the stargazing apps and use that to learn the constellations. Give it a go – I guarantee you'll love it.



MONKTON BELL TOWER

OPERATION LONDON BRIDGE AND THE BELLS OF MONKTON

The death of her Majesty Elizabeth II was marked in Monkton by the ringing of bells and the reading of official proclamations but behind this was an impressive amount of organisation under the auspices of Operation London Bridge.

The advent of the computer means that information can be disseminated almost instantly. On Thursday night texts flew between captain of the bell tower, vice-captain and the clerk of the Parish Council when the news became official. We knew bells would need to be rung and on the death of a Monarch they would need to be muffled but not when, how long or in what way. A quick google soon gave us all the answers. Every detail of the time between Her Majesty's passing and the day of the funeral was captured in one 2 page document. This was just a tiny part of the whole operation. It started with the how bells could be muffled or half muffled for the announcement of the death. Depending on the time of day the bells would be required either on the same day or because the announcement was at night this happened at noon the next day. Hurried arrangements were made and the tenor bell of St Mary Magdalene rang out with its muffle attached to one side for one hour on the Friday. A practice with the full 6 bells took place on the Friday evening before being cleared of muffles for a glorious ring on the day of the Kings accession announcement. Once again ringers were rolling around in the belfry attaching the muffles again for the day of the funeral. A big thank you goes out to all who rang, rolled in the dust several times attaching rubber matting to the clappers and ringing up and down in between several times. So Monkton marked this historic occasion, a once in a lifetime experience for so many.




