22 Matters Arising therefrom:

1) Matters arising there from (excluding outstanding actions in relation to NCC)

- h) Community Emergency Plan – Clerk has spoken to Mr Claydon in relation to this following him contacting the PC – it is not just to look at issues in relation to flooding, it is all emergency scenarios and they would like both PCs to be involved. He asked the Clerk if there was still a copy of the original emergency plan which was looked into over 15 years ago and Clerk stated no copy help by TPC, it was a FPC initiative following the flooding at The Mill. 23 Report by County Councillor Sanderson –

The spring has proved tough for weed spraying and we are behind. I've asked that we review his and when we apply the first spray and how often we follow this up. We have 15 Quads equipped with sprayers and the staff are fully trained up but weeds have grown pretty quickly as gardeners will know this year. Of course the talk is that glyphosate might be removed as our main spray which will cause really big problems.

The developer of the Data Centre is wanting to move to build more space and is applying to do so which is encouraging - the space already spoken for through planning has been fully taken up. We are moving quickly with the new Amble school and have put the new Berwick school into planning.

You will have seen that I've written to the Secretary of State for Transport with my letter countersigned by the Mayor. I want this new effort to be totally free of party politics, and I'll be putting a Motion at Full Council next month which I'm hoping will be agreed cross party.

It's safety that is crucial but I want the government to know that the road is simply incapable of carrying the level of traffic given how both tourism and business growth have taken off in the County. We know this thanks to the rat runs but it is common to see the road grind to a halt because it's not suitable anymore.

24 Report back from Meetings and Representations on behalf of TPC

Cllr Day attended the Community Action Plan meeting which was attended by the Church, CAN, Village Hall and Garth Rhodes – Clerk to Longframlington PC. It was proposed that Mr Claydon look at the L'fram emergency plan and adapt it to see how it would fit for Felton and Thirston. The next meeting will take place in September and Mr Colin Hall from the Flood Dept of the EA will attend. Community would need to initiate a flood plan for the area – it has not been requested yet. L'fram PC led on the initiative as seen as an organisation that would continue into the future. For Felton and Thirston parishes, if the PC's chose not to lead, it could be Village Hall led. If the emergency was a flood, then it maybe that TPC would not be able to use the Village Hall due to access and would have to build a relationship with a place within the parish. Need to see what comes out of the September meeting.

Cemetery Meeting – Chair and Vice Chair will be elected at the next meeting as a second representative from Swarland PC needs to be appointed. Work has started on preparation for the Remembrance Day service.

Planning Issues:

Eshott Airfield – new structures on airfield and treatment plant – NCC are looking into this but stating the new structures have been installed by the owner not the operator. Clerk has raised the issue that it is a planning condition that any new structures need approval so cannot see why this should make any difference – awaiting a response.

26/00130/ADE – Pumpkin Pie Childcare Signage – gone to appeal – Clerk submitted comments to NCC to be included in response to Planning Inspectorate as direct comments are not allowed.

NCC state that the letter from Pumpkin Pie re removal cannot be included as not a material consideration but the PI will be aware of it following information in the objections raised.

Thirston Garage rent/sale sign – no further information on NCC from this.

24/01178/VARYCO – Installation of footpaths 24 June 2024 giving an extension of 2 years – NCC state that the application maybe looking to vary this condition as they state there are limited things they can do to improve bus stops as no room on the footpaths. They have installed a footpath and dropped kerbs and could not get any further with pedestrian refuge. Clerk stated that this does not address the actual condition of installing footpaths to either side of the estate.
