Rushbury Parish Council Update: Traffic Concerns

Parish Councillors share residents' concerns over the speed of traffic passing through Wall under Heywood and Longville in the Dale and the parish. The lack of pavements for pedestrians and even where there is, the inadequate width available to walk safely is of increasing concern. The Parish Council is considering traffic calming initiatives and attempts are being made to consult with officials from Shropshire Council on the level of measures that can be introduced.

One particular area of note is the pavement between The Plough and the bus stop at Wall-under-Heywood. Where residents may be dog or child walking, it may be better to follow the road round the back that comes back out at the pub. May take a few moments longer but hopefully safer than being on the main road itself.

The Parish Council welcomes hearing from residents of their concerns as this will assist in the discussions with Shropshire Council. These can be shared with the Parish Clerk at rushburypc@gmail.com.

LETTER FROM HEREFORD FOR SEPTEMBER

As we watch without much edification the final weeks of the contest for the leadership of the Conservative Party and observe the confrontational nature of the discourse it strikes me that this is a violent way to choose a leader. As I watch the playing out of events at Lambeth and in Ukraine and as I follow online commentary and dispute on all manner of things from The Commonwealth Games to the Women's football team and the latest garment espoused by the latest celebrity it strikes me that verbal violence is endemic. In almost every sphere, often sadly including the church, there is more rancour than unity, more vehemence than graciousness, more arguing than listening. We do verbal violence to each other almost as a matter of course. Sometimes it is the verbal equivalent of a load of thugs setting upon their victim and beating the holy carp out of him in broad daylight. Sometimes it is slow undercover poison, administered to destroy with sly violence someone's reputation.

We need to learn how to speak with courage and integrity-dare one say with Godly wisdom? The Book of Proverbs teaches "sagacious discourse" and well it might, for such discourse sustains the community. Whenever speech loses its integrity, so also do the relationships that uphold the community. Ask Boris. Or Kier Starmer.

Proverbs 15 has much to say on the subject. The very opening verse says "a soft answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger." A soft answer might not be 'nice' but it will always be devoid of moralistic judgements and accusations and will be humanising. It seeks not to threaten or blame but to restore connection. Those who blast others with red hot anger deepen division to everyone's detriment. Moral outrage threatens relationships when it is allowed free reign. Those who listen to themselves, notice their anger and transform it into passionate care are likely to diffuse tension and foster connection.

Proverbs 15: gives us another tip. Wise speech is honest and accurate and shares knowledge with others. The best teachers communicate truth and cultivate morality. They exude honesty and accuracy.

We tell a lot of lies in the church- often to protect people's feelings. Lying, gossip, flattery and slander are all identified in Proverbs as negative. Intentionally obscuring the truth is an act that stems from disdain. Flattery is a form of lying. It is deceptive in its intent. Gossip may be accurate but it is spoken out of turn, inappropriately and without care and so fails to contribute to others' wellbeing. Slander aims to hurt directly; a little whisper, sowing seeds of doubt about someone's character, destroying their reputation is folly. Speaking before listening, sharing information without consideration of its impact, interrupting are all lethal and erode relationships and even erects barriers between us.

Our need for sagacious discourse is acute. Think of the venom spewed on line, the ad hominem attacks made on individuals by news crews, the malicious slandering of political opponents and the rapidity with which we vilify those who disagree with us and who we then label as enemies.

We are conscious that we are working to a budget, and that this is not a good time to be raising prices.



The Honeypot Book Reviews

The Treeline by Ben Rawlence

I became aware of this book when it was featured as "Book of the Week" on BBC Radio 4. Published in 2022 it is available in various formats and from some public libraries. Ben Rawlence is a co-founder of the Black Mountain College, near Talgarth, Brecon, which aims to educate the next generation of leaders about climate change. The book describes his travels across Wales, Scotland, Norway, Russia (particularly Siberia), Alaska and Canada. Along the way he meets indigenous people, including the Sámi (the reindeer herders), Koyukon (Alaska), Nganasan (Siberia) & Anishinaabe (Canada), who are learning to cope with climate change. He is passionate about trees and he describes in detail how each region has par-

ticular geographical features and various dominant tree types. He describes the recent changes in the forests and trees that form the northern tree line in the boreal (northern) regions of the world.

In some places the trees are moving north and up into the mountains; this is presumed to be due to warming of the climate. Ben hints that while his focus was on the northern boundaries of the boreal forest that the southern boundaries will also change and move north – trees can not always cope with hot weather and limited water.

You will find many complimentary reviews about this book. Climate change can be a daunting, sometimes difficult topic to read about. Ben maintains a positive stance that while change is here that we should embrace the facts and, in particular, appreciate and look after the trees!

Healthwatch are hearing mixed feedback about emergency care in Shropshire, Telford & Wrekin

People who have needed emergency medical care have been telling Healthwatch Shropshire and Healthwatch Telford & Wrekin about their experiences of ringing for an ambulance and going into hospital. They have highlighted some great care but also some issues of a health system under pressure.

Lynn Cawley, Chief Officer of Healthwatch Shropshire, and Barry Parnaby, Chair of Healthwatch Telford & Wrekin, explained, "We would still like to hear from people, including professionals who have called an ambulance for someone in their care, for example in a care home or receiving care in their own home, so that everyone's voice can help to inform the efforts being made to try and improve services.

We want to hear from people about where things have gone well and where they have not gone so well. It's an opportunity for patients and their families, as well as professionals to share their stories and tell us what is important to them in those worrying times when they need emergency help.

We know that the demand on urgent care is high at the moment and it is having an impact on the whole health and care system but we can then share those experiences with service providers, those who pay for the service and those who regulate services such as the Care Quality Commission to ensure the patient voice is at the centre of efforts to improve services for all.
