Wander along the High Street and take the opportunity to leaf through a tempting variety of plants for sale and enjoy our Arts and Crafts exhibition in The Reading Room. A garden-themed raffle will take place on Sunday.

Tickets and parking

Tickets at £6 per adult (free to under 16s) are valid on both days so what you don't manage to view on one day, you can do the next. Full information about each garden and a map of where they are located will be attached to your tickets. Tickets will be on sale on the day or in advance at Berwick Farm Shop.

You are most welcome to bring your canine friends as long as you keep them on a short lead but please check that every garden is pet-friendly.

There will be plenty of free parking in the clearly signed car parks plus convenient parking for disabled badge holders. This year we are offering free transport within the village to facilitate movement from one end to the other.
