WEST ILSLEY IS SEEKING A VOLUNTEER FLOOD WARDEN TO SUPPORT THE COMMUNITY

This is an interesting role where you will learn more about water, flooding, and sewage than you ever imagined! There are flood wardens for every village along the Pang Valley, and they are all members of the Pang Valley Flood Forum which meets several times per year.

During the flooding and sewage discharges this winter/spring the flood forum has been an invaluable source of support to the villages.

long-standing flood wardens are very knowledgeable and support people who are new to the role. This includes advice about the responsibilities of the local council, Thames Water and the Environment Agency so you can work out who does what, when and why, plus practical hands-on help in the event of flooding. For example, in East IIsley this spring there was a power cut and the water pumps wouldn't work, but flood wardens from other wards turned up with generators. The flood forum website www.floodalleviation.org is packed useful information for residents. The flood forum organised an exhibition earlier this year in Hampstead Norreys which was extremely popular. There was information about how to protect your house, projects to mitigate flooding, and information about Thames Water plans to improve the sewage network.

COUNTRY NOTES

The burdock is in flower along Old Street, pale purple florets with white forked styles, tiny snakes' tongues that reach up to lick pollen from the air. The red & green berries of white bryony hang like traffic lights from the hedge. Unlike traffic lights they turn from green to red with no amber warning. The red a warning that they are poisonous.

Sit at the top of Old Down to sketch the sinuous tracks that snake upwards from the Copperage valley through Wether Down, West Ginge Down, Sheep Down, Cow Down and Bury Down on their journey to the Ridgeway. Tracks that take one up the downs. These ancient routes once trodden by Britons, Romans, Saxons, Norsemen, and Normans, whose countless feet have cut through the downland turf to the white chalk beneath. They do not follow the straight field edges, and they do not angle around field corners, they were here before the fields. The poet Edward Thomas describes a chalk path's motion through the land as "a white snake on a green hillside". I attempt to record their serpentine journeys with white pastel squiggles on a wash of green water colour.

Over Big Heath a raven mobs a kestrel, over Sheep Down a lesser black backed gull mobs a kite, it's a day for mobsters.
