From your Parish Council

You may remember that, last year, I kept you updated about the impending changes to/reduction of the finances of Boughton Malherbe Parish Council, and many of you signed a petition showing your support for the Parish Council against the imposition by MBC of these changes. Unfortunately, despite much protest, the Parish Services Scheme has been imposed. The Chairman of Maidstone KALC has made the following statement:

The Chairman of the Maidstone Area Committee of the Kent Association of Local Councils (KALC), Cllr Geraldine Brown, wishes to thank residents for supporting their Parish Council by signing the recent petition and for turning up en-masse at the Town Hall to show that support to Maidstone Borough Council. She further comments:

"Parishes will be aware that Maidstone KALC and its Parish Council members have had serious concerns about the Parish Services Scheme (PSS) that has now been imposed by Maidstone Borough Council as a replacement for its previous funding scheme for Parishes. That funding has been reduced from £500,000 in 2010/11 to just over £140,000 for 2013/14.

In many Parishes, this will have a severe impact on Parish funding and could lead to a substantial increase in Parish precepts to the extent that such funding-reduction cannot be met by further Parish cost savings. Parishes are at the sharp-end of delivering local services and do not have inefficient costs to shed, noting that Parish Councillors themselves are not paid.

Maidstone KALC continues in dialogue with the Borough Council to try and improve matters in subsequent years, but, in the meantime, recognises that Parish Councils must ensure that they can meet the service needs of their local community and may need to significantly increase the Parish Precept for 2013-14."

At the last Parish Council Meeting, Finance Committee Chairman, Mike Hitchins, gave the following presentation:

In previous years the Parish Council has had two sources of funding:

- 1. Concurrent Functions Grant This was provided by Maidstone Council £3,150 in 2012/2013
- 2. Parish Precept This is raised through the Council Tax system £2,100 in 2012/2013

Therefore the total funding the Parish Council received in the current financial year was **£5,250**

In the next financial year the Concurrent Functions Grant is being replaced with a bid based system called the Parishes Services Scheme. There have been many meetings with Maidstone Borough Council officers to discuss the implication of this new scheme and it has become apparent that Boughton Malherbe will almost certainly receive very little from this new scheme. 10

As the Parish had to submit its application for precept funding by the end of January, the possible additional funding under this new scheme was discounted for purposes of Budget planning.

This left only the Parish Precept as a source of funding for the Parish Council.

At a recent meeting of the Finance Committee to discuss the budget for 2013/2014 the following was proposed:

A balance of approx £1600 is expected to be carried over from the current financial year: this will be held in reserve. We have not, in the past, held any reserves but in the last audit of the council's books by the Audit Commission the lack of any reserves was highlighted and deemed to be an issue.

The total proposed budget is £5,000

For the year 2012/13, the Precept was **£2100**. That equates to £9.25 per dwelling at Band D. That, divided into income at Band D, gives 229 dwellings.

At the proposed 2013/14 amount of **£5,000**, divided by 229 dwellings, the proposed figure for a Band D dwelling will be £21.83, an increase of £12.58 per year or 24 pence per week per dwelling at Band D.

A great deal of time and thought has been put into formulating this budget. We are fortunate, in Boughton Malherbe, that the rise is so little - only 24p per week. However, it is still an increase that has been imposed on us at a time when extra money can be hard to find, and the Parish Council continues to do all it can to keep costs as low as possible.

. Neighbourhood Plan

Neighbourhood Planning may sound dull, but keep reading! - it is actually an exciting new way for communities just like ours to decide the future of the places where we live and work. Across the country communities are being encouraged and empowered to prepare neighbourhood plans which, the Government says, will enable communities to:

- Choose if and where they want new homes, shops and offices to be built
- Have their say on what those new buildings should look like
- Grant planning permission for the new buildings they want to see go ahead
- Preserve areas they don't want changed
- Define areas that can be used for leisure or other services that benefit the whole community

Once a neighbourhood plan is in force, it carries real legal weight. Borough decision-makers will be obliged, *by law*, to take what it says into account when they consider proposals for development in the neighbourhood.

At the Parish Council meeting on 20th November last year, it was agreed that a group be formed to work on a plan for Boughton Malherbe. So far that group consists of myself, Sylvia Close; John Collins; Mike Davidson; Ian Shaw and Robert Turner, and we hope that more will join. Although Parish Council led, this is a real community venture in which we all have a say - it is you, and not the Parish Council, who decides the content of the plan! Before finalized, a referendum will take place calling on the opinion of all parishioners.

On Monday 25th March, at 7.30pm in Grafty Green Village Hall, Brian Lloyd from CPRE (Council for Protection of Rural England (Kent Branch)) is coming to explain what the Neighbourhood Plan is and now it might work for Boughton Malherbe/Grafty Green. Do try to come along to listen, and ask any questions you may have - this affects you!

Pop ups and Adverts

Are you getting annoyed with pop ups and adverts when browsing the internet and asking why the anti-virus software installed on your computer doesn't block them.

Anti-virus software will block malware. Malware (derived from the words "malicious" and "software") is the general term used for any software that is written with the sole intention of disrupting, stealing information or controlling your Computer. Malware therefore covers everything, including viruses, spyware, ad-ware, root-kits, keyloggers and many more nasty programs.

There are some adverts and pop ups that are not considered malware by the virus checker, for instance Norton would not block its own adverts.

So the best way to deal with these unwanted adverts and pop ups is to install an Independent blocker like Spybot. Because it is independent it picks up those things that the other anti-virus checkers leave behind, because it blocks whatever it considers intrusive or even just annoying. Unfortunately it can't pick up everything because adverts in general are not malware and notoriously difficult to get rid of, but it does make a big difference, especially when you are doing your on-line weekly shopping.

There are many other products available to help with this, some may be more difficult to set up than others.

Before installing anything like this do some research and ask people what they have found best. Personally I installed Spybot just after Christmas this year and it made a big difference to the number of annoying adverts and pop-ups I get when using the internet.

Warning: Toolbars

When installing software from the internet, be careful not to install unwanted toolbars. Toolbars will install all sorts of spyware, so unless you know that you want it, always say no to them. Sometimes you install something and forget to un-tick the box that says "do you want our toolbar", the trouble is if you say yes to toolbar software you are effectively saying yes to the spyware/ad-ware portion. If you like the toolbar then you have to live with the pop-ups. The well-known ones are not malicious, just annoying. Some of the others you just can't get rid of even if you uninstall the App/toolbar. You will have to search for special software that gets rid of it for you.

The March Night Sky

The **Sun** is in the constellation of Aquarius at beginning of March, and moves into Pisces towards the end of the month.

The **Spring Equinox** falls on Wednesday 20^{th} March, so after this date the days will grow longer than the nights. **British Summer Time** begins on Sunday 31^{st} March, when clocks go forward one hour.

New Moon occurs on Monday 11th March, and **Full Moon** is on Wednesday 27th March when in Aquarius.

Mercury rises in the southeast just before sunrise in the constellation of Aquarius, so again will not be easy to see in the twilight.

Venus rises in the southeast at sunrise in Aquarius, so will not be visible this month.

Mars again rises in the southeast at sunrise, so will also not be visible this month.

Jupiter is well placed for viewing in the evenings this month. It is high in the western sky at dusk and is brighter than any of the stars. Relative to the stars it is moving westwards in Taurus. Through a telescope you should be able to see the dark and light bands together with the **Great Red Spot**. It may also be possible to see, even through binoculars, Jupiter's four major moons.

Saturn is rising in the southeast in the late evening, and is well up in the southern western sky just before dawn. Relative to the stars it is moving very slowly in the constellation of Libra. Through a telescope you should be able to see the famous rings together with many of its moons.

Most of you will be aware that last month the asteroid 2012 DA14 narrowly missed the Earth. It was the size of a school gymnasium, travelling at 18,000 mph, within 17,200 miles of Earth, closer than many of our satellites. Now, however, there is an interest by a number of companies to harvest asteroids for mineral wealth in what they hope will be a $21^{\rm st}$ century equivalent to the oil and gold rushes. They intend to deploy small satellites to prospect asteroids, and effectively lasso them, and transporting them into Earth's orbit.

Christian message March 2013

Easter people living in a Good Friday world

Swedish people call Good Friday "Long Friday". When I lived in Sweden my students asked me, puzzled, 'Why is it called **Good** Friday in English?'

Living in the vicarage can sometimes feel heavy. There are funerals to be planned, people in hospital to visit, stories of tragic family circumstances, ill-health and unemployment, loneliness and depression. These are the heavy burdens that come to us all at different times in our lives, that we all have to live with. We are called to share in these circumstances and offer Easter hope.

But how can we be Easter people when we live in a Good Friday world?

And why is Good Friday 'good'? Good because, by dying, Jesus somehow breaks through the barrier between man and God. Good because at the moment of Jesus' death, the curtain separating the holiest part of the Jerusalem temple from the area where the ordinary people could go spontaneously rips in half, symbolizing that we can now all approach God without the need of sacrifices and ritual. Good because, with hindsight, Jesus broke through the final defeat of death and came out alive on Sunday morning,

So the truth is that, as Christians, we are Easter people living in a Good Friday world. Every year the world seems more of a Good Friday world with tragic events in Syria, Mali, London. Beloved parents dying, friends with sick children, neglected babies in orphanages in Guatemala; things that make no sense when you think about a loving God. But during those long hours of Long Friday Jesus was sharing and somehow carrying all the pain and suffering of the world, showing that new life can come through suffering and seeming defeat.

God, you see, loves us unconditionally. Being an Easter person isn't something you need to dress up for, like going to a party and putting on your 'party face'. It's a 'come as you are' party where you are accepted as you are and gradually changed into who you are meant to be.

FOOD FOR THOUGHT...a real life case

A lady was referred for help with food. She had escaped from her abusive partner and had been placed in a safe house with her three young children. The family had to escape quickly from the abusive household which meant that they had what they stood up in. The flat was empty, no cooking facilities, no furniture, no curtains, no beds, no comfort after trauma, no food.

Staff at the Maidstone Centre found a kettle, toaster, cups, plates and cutlery. A bundle of clean towels, some warm blankets and toiletries were also provided. Fortunately a large amount of toys had been donated through an external appeal and some were given to the children. Mum was pleased to receive sufficient food to keep the family going for a few days. Nappies and other essentials filled another box. Their trauma will continue for a long time but the immediate assistance given in the first few days made their situation more bearable until the specialist agencies could put more permanent help in place.

Recently Sally Alexander and I attended a reception at Maidstone Day Centre. The object of the gathering was to thank all those who are involved in anyway in the work of the Centre. Mike Fitzgerald, Chairman of the Maidstone Christian Care, spoke about the work of tackling homelessness with the object of ending poverty.

The Mayor of Maidstone and the Chairman of KCC praised the Centre's work and the commitment of the many volunteers who ensure that the work goes on.

The thanks of the hungry and homeless extend to YOU, the readers of this magazine. Beginning with a box in Grafty Green village shop over a year ago much non-perishable food has been collected and taken to the Centre by Sally. At the reception we were able to see the impressive food store and learned about what has been achieved. For example, showers make it possible for those sleeping rough to prepare themselves for a day at work.

As the recession deepens more food is needed. In addition to the box in Grafty Green shop. And we thank Rob and Hazel Eastwood for their continued support there are now collecting boxes in Boughton Malherbe, Lenham and Ulcombe churches. Gifts of food can also be taken to the Len Valley Benefice office in Harrietsham Village Hall.

In Jesus' parable of the sheep and goats the King says, 'I was hungry and you gave me something to eat' (Matthew 25:31-46). Let's do just that!
