

	County Councillor Darby Please find my report for Harby Parish Council – unfortunately, I am on babysitting duties this evening. Last week, I was appointed to the Children and Young People's Select Committee at County Hall. As a mother and grandmother, this is a subject close to my heart. Since the start of the pandemic, there has been a significant rise in free school meal claimants in Newark and Sherwood. 1 in 4 children now claim them as the cost of living crisis gets worse. I will use these meetings to champions our local schools across the Collingham Division. I want to champion our young people, fight for improve life chances and for extra resources for our schools. I have particular focus on ensuring the nutritional value of school meals. I am meeting with the Chief Executive of Sherwood Forest Hospitals who run Newark Hospital and King's Mill Hospital on Tuesday. I am also meeting with Lucy Dadge and her team at the Clinical Commissioning Group to talk about access to GPs and other health care service. As my previous report said – the state of Harby's broken roads and pavements remains the biggest issue in my postbag. I continue to report problems with our highways to Notts County Council who are responsible. Over the next few weeks, you will receive a highway's survey through your door as we get to grips with these issues.
