Brian Jordan

Brian sadly passed away peacefully in the Rainbow Rooms at West Berkshire community hospital on Thursday 28th March 2024.

Brian was born on Friday, April 17th, 1942, in Little Bedwyn. He was the first child of Harry and Joan Jordan, who evacuated London during the Second World War to enjoy the safety of the countryside. After the war had ended, the family returned to London for a short while but they missed the country life and decided to leave London and move to Great Shefford. Brian attended Lambourn School.

At the age of 15, Brian started his apprenticeship as a carpenter and joiner at FJ Lewis and Sons a building company in Great Shefford and in 1960, Brian met the love of his life, Cynthia Cooley, in Chaddleworth, where Cynthia lived. They fell in love and were married on April 4th, 1964. They lived in Chaddleworth while Brian was still working for FJ Lewis

Brian and the family then moved to Tadley in 1970, where Brian trained and became a Master locksmith.

After two years, they decided to move to Newbury and Brain start his own company, Jordan & Searis, in partnership with Mick Searis, the company went from strength to strength, and in 1992 they won Master Builder of the Year for the whole of the UK doing many projects in the Village.

Brian enjoyed windsurfing, Darts down the Ibex, 10 pin bowling at RAF Welford, clay pigeon shooting, fishing, and golf.

In 1987, Brian and Cynthia, moved back Chaddleworth to Broxton. Brian worked hard to make Broxton a good family home, a meeting place for whole family to have big Sunday roasts around the grand solid oak dining table which he made, he enjoyed this some much!

Brian enjoyed moving back Chaddleworth with family close and seeing old friends while making new ones. He loved walking down School Hill to The Ibex Inn and having a few pints, spoofing with the locals at the bar, playing darts, and filling the fruit machine up. Brian found himself a key member of the village and helped with many village events such as fetes, discos, auctions, go cart races, playing for the cricket team and many more events. He was one of the founder organizers of the Senior Citizens Christmas lunch, which is still going more than 30 years later, a member of the Village Hall Committee and was also the Chairman of the Chaddleworth Parish Council.

Brian helped for 10 years to run the Village Shop and Post Office with Cynthia while still working and running Jordan & Searis. After a while Brian and Cynthia decided to retire and sell Broxton, the shop and wind down Jordan & Searis. This would mean leaving Chaddleworth and starting a new set of exciting adventures. They decided to travel around the UK in a motorhome, creating many new memories with Jake the Labrador but still coming back to the village for many events to be with friends and family.

Brian and Cynthia then decided to move closer to the family and moved to Worlds End in Chieveley. Life did slow down a bit for Brian at Worlds End but he found a great hobby in Woodturning that he was amazing at and it showed what a skilled craftsman he had been throughout his whole life. He joined Kennet woodturners to show off his craftsmanship and enter competitions, winning the woodturner of the year and producing lots of turned master pieces that are in lots of our homes. You could see him displaying this skills with his family at Village Fetes as "Turning mad Jordans"

Brian had many friends and enjoyed a good social life. Sadly Brian's final months were in hospital, Brian remained a true gentleman, appreciating all the care and love shown to him by those around him.

Brian will be dearly missed not only by his wife of 60 years Cynthia and all his family and friends.

West Berkshire Council

Parliamentary elections Thursday 4th July West Berkshire set to choose their representatives in the Houses of Parliament

West Berkshire Council is gearing up to hold parliamentary elections following the announcement of a general election on Thursday 4th July in Chaddleworth Village Hall as polling station open from 7am to 10pm.

Residents are encouraged to register to vote now if they are not already on the electoral register. Registering to vote takes only a few minutes and can be done online at https://www.gov.uk/register-to-vote.

If you are unsure if you're registered to vote or you need help you can contact our Electoral Services team on 01635 519464 or by email at vote@westberks.gov.uk.

Residents can also vote by post in advance of polling day or nominate someone to vote on their behalf (a proxy vote) with more information about how to do this available on https://www.westberks.gov.uk/register-to-vote

This will be the first general election at which voters are required to show Photo ID.

Information on accepted forms of Photo ID can be found on the Electoral Commission website https://www.electoralcommission.org.uk/voting-and-elections/voter-id. You can also visit the website to apply for a free Voter Authority Certificate if you don't have another acceptable document to show.

West Berkshire Council's Chief Executive Nigel Lynn will act as the Returning Officer overseeing the election. Speaking about the plans he said:

"A parliamentary election is something we knew was coming and we have been preparing for it for some time. Following yesterday's announcement we will be putting this plan into action ready to welcome residents to polling stations on Thursday 4 July.

"With only a short time until the election it's important that residents are ready for it. I would encourage everyone to register to vote if they have not already done so and to consider if they need a postal or proxy vote. Happening during the summer holiday period, it may be people will be away so please don't leave it to the last minute if you need to arrange to vote in advance or arranging for someone to do so on your behalf."

For the first time, residents will be electing Members of Parliament for the constituencies of Newbury, and Reading West and Mid Berkshire. Since the general election in 2019, the two new constituencies have been created as part of a national boundary review to rebalance the number of electors in each area. The two constituencies span West Berkshire along with the wards of Kentwood, Norcot and Tilehurst within the Reading Borough Council area. West Berkshire Council will be administering the elections for both constituencies.

- Registering to vote by Tuesday 18 June
- Applications for postal votes by Wednesday 19 June at 5pm



'D' Day Landings, a 'History Bit' Feature

As some of you know, if not all, back on March 23rd 1944, a huge military exercise involving the 101st Airborne was held on land adjacent to RAF Welford, belonging to the Baylis family at Court Oak Farm.

The air drop was by the 2nd and 3rd Battalions of the 506th PIR, from Ramsbury and Aldbourne, and also the 377th PFAB from Benham Valence near Newbury.

Along with these, the 1st Bn. of the 506th and further units of the Regiment stood in line for inspection.

Sir Winston Churchill, Eisenhower and all the top brass were there to witness it all, as shown in the first photo. Welford would be around to the left of the photographer in this shot, so they are all looking East here. Boxford would be along to the right.

The second photo is from the museum, hence the caption. The third photo shows Churchill shaking hands with Brigadier General Don. F. Pratt. He was the first top brass man to be killed when his Waco glider crashed on landing in Normandy. He was sitting upright in a jeep at the time.

O. of 101st Airborne Division accompanied by General Eisenhower, Brigadier General Don F. Pratt, Assistant Divisional Commander of 101st and a British Naval Commander as Churchill's Aide.

(Brigadier General Don F. Pratt was the first American General to die in the D-Day invasion when his glider, Fighting Falcon, crashed into a hedgerow on landing near Hiesville. He had been sitting on a parachute in a jeep at the time)



Anyway, the Baylis family visited our museum vesterday and there are big plans afoot to put up display boards on and around the drop zone, giving the details of that historic day's exercise, in preparation for D-Day. Alan Baylis was an 8-vear-old at the time and he and his family were invited to watch it all, by standing in a hedge alongside the drop zone. Jenny Smith, nee Baylis is coordinating everything so, on June 2nd, there will be conducted guide tours around the drop zone, and of course, on June 6th, things will be in full flow. This all happens on both sides of the Hangman's Stone Lane that runs past RAF Welford to Boxford, just past Bradleywood Farm on the right, or between the Leckhampstead turning and the M4 motorway bridge. As I've previously mentioned, the USAF at Welford have no plans of their own to stage anything there on June 6th, but along with our museum, will be joining forces with Greenham Control Tower group to stage a big spectacular there on June 6th.

Federated Primary Schools 'Living life in all its fullness'




We could not be more proud of our fantastic Year 6s who this week approached the SATs with resilience, determination and a balanced attitude.


