At the parish council meeting on 17th January 2022 the councillors debated and finalized the Precept Budget for the financial year 2022-2023 and set it at £6,472.00.

This is an increase of £1,102 over last year's budget due largely to rising overhead costs. A copy of the budget is available to view on the parish council's website and is detailed in the Minutes of 17th January 2022's meeting, also on the website.

The February meeting was on the 21st February, 7.30pm at Ticklerton Village Hall when new planning applications were considered. The council will also have considered the provisions of the Community Governance Review, which requires the parish council to consider whether any of its boundaries need amending/re-aligning and whether it wishes to amalgamate with any adjoining parish or town councils. The parish council's conclusions can be debated by parishioners at the Annual Parish Meeting on 16th May 2022 at Hope Bowdler Village Hall.

The March Meeting is on Monday 21st March, at 7.30pm in Hope Bowdler Village Hall.

Dear Friends,

Just yesterday I noticed this little pot of miniature daffodils in bloom just outside my kitchen door and felt I had to share it with you as I prepared to write this letter. I'm sure many of you have spotted snowdrops in bloom and crocuses and other spring flowers in bloom in woods and gardens. Though we might have chilly weather ahead yet, before Spring can truly be said to be sprung, the signs and heralds of the coming season are well and truly 'springing' into life for us to see.

And church seasons are changing too of course – at the end of the first week of this new month Lent begins and continues through the whole of the month and a couple of weeks beyond, of course, towards Easter.

Do you have commitment to giving something up for Lent?

So many of us do, but I wonder how often the commitment either doesn't last all the way through the six weeks or, if it does last, it simply feels pointless in the end, offering you no lasting benefit whether it be in increased physical or mental wellbeing or in spiritual growth.

I read something recently that suggested a possible different way of looking at this period of fasting – instead of 'giving something up', why not 'take something on.' It might be a commitment to a time of reading or a regular period of exercise, a commitment making a small daily contribution to others: to helping out – volunteering in your community perhaps; or making a donation in cash or in kind to a food bank or other charity. The thing that might suggest itself to you will probably be different from what might appeal to someone else. Maybe, I wonder, might you feel after the forty days of Lent that you have gained more out of that sort of fast, than the 'same old same old' pattern of trying to give up chocolate (or whatever) again.

And to those of you who read this and think, 'That's what I do every year!' I truly commend you – and this year I hope to join your number...

... I pray for God's help in achieving it!

INSTEAD.

As I write this, it is 'blue Monday'. A university professor managed to precisely calculate which day is the most depressing one of the year! This is apparently the third Monday of January every year and it has been given this accolade due to a combination of cold dark nights, the sense that Christmas is over and the arrival of credit card bills with our Christmas spending!.

By the time most people read this, it will be a distant memory, but as I talk to people after two years of the COVID pandemic, there is a level of uncertainty and anxiety, which fuels a sense that our world is out of control. It can feel much the same in church with numbers and activities curtailed in many places and recovery feeling very fragile. Uncertainty in our lives can make us all feel somewhat anxious about the future, and when we feel that we are not in control, that can lead to worry and doubt. Jesus reminded his disciples that God understood their needs.

"Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food and the body more than clothes? Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they? Can any one of you by worrying add a single hour to your life?

Matthew 6:25-27

Jesus teaching is very simple as his followers are to live simply a day at a time and recognise that whatever our circumstances, his love and mercy offer hope for the future. We are called to look for the Kingdom to find those places where God is at work in our world and join in. Even when we do not feel we have anything to offer or the gifts and skills to make a difference, we can pray, and our presence can be a calming influence.

We also need to recognise that ultimately we are not in control. If we call ourselves Christians, then we have voluntarily passed control of the direction of our lives over to God. The Holy Spirit lives within each of us to equip, empower and sustain us on the journey of faith and to be a guide for daily living. Paul understood better than most what trouble and anxiety mean, yet he wrote one of the most encouraging passages in the New Testament.

"For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor heavenly rulers neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord."

Romans 8:38-39

Given that God cares for us so much, we need not doubt that there is a better future, and our role is to point people to the hope that is within us. We all feel 'blue' from time to time, but it will never overcome our hope in Jesus, as Peter tells us in his letters:

"But in your hearts revere Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect,..."

Local Health Champions want to hear about NHS psychological services

Depression and anxiety levels in Shropshire, Telford & Wrekin have increased since the start of the pandemic. The Shropshire Primary Care Psychological Therapies Service (also known as IAPT) and Telford IAPT are at the forefront of support and therapy to help people to deal with mild and moderate depression and anxiety. People who want help contact the service directly themselves. The NHS is looking at how these services are organised and are keen to understand people's experiences. Healthwatch wants to hear from people who have used the service or are waiting for therapy, what went well, what didn't go so well and any suggestions for improvements.

Lynn Cawley, Chief Officer of Healthwatch Shropshire, said, "We want to ensure that the patient voice is at the centre of any service development and would encourage anybody who has used the service to get in touch. All experiences will be shared anonymously."

Frances Sutherland, Head of Transformation and Commissioning (Mental health, LD & A) Shropshire, Telford and Wrekin Clinical Commissioning Group, said, "We want to ensure these services are easily accessible and support people in the right way which is why we want to understand more about how it feels to be treated by our local services. We are really pleased that Healthwatch have agreed to undertake this work. We want to hear the views of people who have used the services now or in the past so that we can design our service to best meet their needs."

Barry Parnaby, Chair of Healthwatch Telford & Wrekin, said "Your local Healthwatch and NHS Trust are committed to ensuring the delivery of care is as good as it can be, but to do this, we need to hear from those who have experienced the service. Please get in touch and help to make a positive change."


With walks from half a mile to twelve miles plus long, and a note of suitability for pushchairs and wheelchairs, everyone can find a walk to enjoy.



I didn't know Geoff well – scarcely at all in fact – he was very much involved in Eaton's church as I was at Cardington, but there were times when our paths would cross: benefice events like Rogation walks, fetes, open gardens and so on. And then he and Jenny moved away to Munslow so it was only Jenny I saw, usually collecting the Eaton mags, or the few times a year when it was that teams' turn to collate them.

So the impression I had was that he was reserved, shy even, and I had no idea until reading the memoir that Jenny and the family finished for him after his death that there was a whole other reason. I had known somewhere along the years that he had grown up in a children's home/been adopted -that sort of thing, but his life story revealed to me his absolute survival through childhood was due to an acquired skill at distancing himself from hurt – and there was plenty of it.

But he did survive as we all know, and seeing him in his own words has revealed so much I had never known about him. It's a story of a remarkable yet unobtrusive man: a man who overcame the odds and made for himself a fulfilled and happy life, full of the love he was never shown.

I liked him and wish so much now that I had known him better.
