



THORNEY SPOTTINGS (8) - Janet Collins

About twenty minutes after e-mailing Ann my last copy of Thorney Spottings, in which I mentioned my disappointment at seeing no dragonflies this year, I was delighted to see not only two emperor dragonflies patrolling my neighbour's field, but also a slender, red- bodied darter. I assume this was a male common sympetrum, because it is the only common darter of a noticeably red colour. Darters are about half the size of most hawkers, and tend to spend more time on vegetation, and less time wandering away from the water's edge.

In several places around the village, green woodpeckers have made their presence known by their distinctive laughing call, hence their common name 'yaffle' bird. Did you know that this woodpecker rarely drums on the trunks and branches of trees, unlike its smaller relative the great spotted woodpecker? So they are easily distinguished, even when not visible!

Now is the time to be looking out for fungi along the lanes. There are plenty of shaggy inkcap and parasol mushrooms popping up around the village, together with boletus.

Boletus are usually easily distinguished from many other fungi, because they have a sponge-like appearance under the cap, rather than the more usual gills.

The delicate, white shaggy inkcap is an edible variety while young, but not good once it starts to deliquesce. When this occurs, a black, inky liquid appears at the base of the gills, which begin to turn upwards, giving these mushrooms a wig-like appearance. Colloquially, it is referred to as 'lawyer's wig' mushroom.

Parasol mushrooms (an obvious umbrella shape, once open) come in many varieties, but our most common one is the shaggy variety. This appearance is due to the splitting of the outer skin, which breaks on the surface into pale brownish patches. It grows up to 15cm across. There are plenty growing along the hedgerows and woods all the way from the Thorney crossroad to Doddington Road. Although relatively few common fungi are considered lethal, whereas many varieties are edible, with some classed as 'excellent', there are several which may give unpleasant side effects. So they are best avoided, unless you are out spotting with an expert.

Wild blackberries seem late this year, although one or two plentiful supplies are appearing. The season will probably stretch well into October, looking at the size and colour of many of the berries. Some are only just coming into flower. They will give a welcome late season feed to many of our common birds, taking over from the elderberries they are currently enjoying. Let's hope the 'season of mists and mellow fruitfulness' will help them survive the winter!

<u>Thorney Bird Feed Group.</u> We have found a source of good quality feed at very reasonable prices. However, we have to buy in quantities that would need some logistics worked around the payment process. In the meantime, we are hoping to pass on information about the cheapest **local** sources for purchasing the various feeds people want.
