Introduction to the Digital Inclusion Initiative



- · Local and national services continue to migrate to online
- Breckland Council's Customer Access Strategy calls out the intention to make all services online and its intention to have 50% of residents engaging with it via online channels
- Danger that not all residents will want, or be able to engage online, leading to isolation
- The Digital Inclusion strategy mitigates against this danger

Most at risk sections of our communities

These can be split in 4 Categories

- Job Seekers 18% of UK adults claiming benefits have low or no digital capability at all
- Low income families Households earning £40,000 per year are 47% more likely to have full basic digital skills
- Older people 28% of those over 60 are not online, 84% of this group say 'nothing could motivate them to get online'
- People with disabilities- People with a registered disability are four times as likely to be offline*

However the single biggest barrier to digital inclusion is motivation







19,000 households at risk of digital exclusion in Breckland

What is the risk of Digital Exclusion in Breckland

 In order to quantify the number of digitally excluded households the Breckland residents have been characterised into the following Mosaic segments:


Working in the community to improve digital inclusion

 - Developing a network of Digital Champions who can help us help residents





