 $\sqrt{}$ all suspicions and allegations of poor practice or abuse will be taken seriously and responded to swiftly and appropriately

 $\sqrt{}$ the importance of working in partnership with parents and children and adults at risk and their carers or advocates.

 $\sqrt{}$ the effectiveness of our policy is reviewed annually and a responsible person shall be appointed as:
