Police report

Recently, there have been reports of a male acting suspiciously around the Bramley area, which has caused some concern, particularly among females.

There appears to have been some confusion and misinformation spread across various social media platforms, linking this male to another that Surrey Police were trying to apprehend and advertised via a social media campaign. This, in turn, has caused extra unnecessary concern for residents. To clarify, the male subject to the Surrey Police appeal has been apprehended and has no apparent links to Bramley. Concerning the suspicious male, we have been conducting extra patrols in the area, particularly around the High Street and the downlink, which will continue.

Should anyone see anything suspicious or have any concerns when out, please do call police at the time.

Concerning the graffiti, without any evidence to suggest who may be responsible, there is limited action that police can take at this time. Should any residents have evidence of the persons responsible, please urge them to contact us.

I am aware the old Station platform and the nearby car park is an area where persons like to attend to smoke cannabis. During patrols, officers have stopped and searched persons with drugs on them. Each was dealt with appropriately.

Hopefully, this will help deter them from using the area in future. We will continue to bear it in mind when out and about.

Bramley Library Report

Our SCC CPL contact, Marc Muller, has resigned effective mid-October. SCC are recruiting internally for the role. While wishing Marc well, we are disappointed to lose him; of course, it's yet another change for us.

The Summer Reading Challenge finishes on 23rd September, when certificates will be presented at our planned activity hour. Participation and completions are up on last year, probably owing to the school visits done by volunteers before its launch.

As a new development, we held an Open week in August with a different activity each session. The aim was to increase library awareness of footfall and issues while hopefully recruiting new volunteers. Feedback on the week was very positive, and the statistics on the month regarding footfall and issues were rewarding.
