Welcome to your new Parish Councillor

At the last meeting, Andy Hayden was voted on as a co-opted member. Andy moved to the village recently and brings with him a wealth of knowledge from his working career. This brings us up to a full complement of councillors for the remainder of the term. We would like to take this moment to welcome Andy onboard and look forward to working with him over the next few months.

As a reminder, all Parish Councillor positions are up for re-election in May 2024. If you think you have skills and the time, please consider applying for a position. Further details will be advertised as soon as they become available. If you are interested, please do get in touch with your current Councillors who will be more than happy to answer any queries you may have.

Don't lose your vote

With District Council, Parish Council and Police and Crime Commissioner elections coming up next year, check now to make sure that you are registered to vote.

Letters have started to make their way to your door for you to check your details, but if you want to check or even update your records ahead of the letters, you can do so at www.gov.uk/register-to-vote

Recent home movers in particular are urged to check their details. Electoral Commission research has found that recent home movers are less likely to be registered than those who have lived at the same address for a long time.

Also, this time, ID will be required for you to be able to vote when you get to the polling stations. This can be any Government issued photo ID, even ID that has expired. Alternatively, if you do not have any, there is a scheme in place that allows you to apply for a voter authority certificate through www.gov.uk/apply-for-photo-id-voter-authority-certificate

Planning – have your say about Flexneys Paddock

As most of you will be aware, a planning application has gone in to WODC for 19 houses to be built in Stanton Harcourt and this has attracted some negative comments on the planning portal from villagers. Because of the objections, the planning application is now going to the planning committee. This committee is open to the public who wish to voice their thoughts. The committee will meet at WODC offices, Wood Green, Witney on 4th December at 2pm. If you do wish to attend and have your voice heard, please be aware that parking onsite is limited but street parking is available.

Next stage for the Local Plan

To make sure that our planning policies and proposals are up to date and effectively tackle vital issues such as climate change, health and wellbeing, housing and the economy, we are preparing a new Local Plan covering the period up to 2041.

The following key dates for drawing up the new Local Plan are expected to apply:

- Initial scoping consultation (Regulation 18): August – October 2022 (COMPLETE)
- Focused consultation on draft plan objectives, pattern of development and call for ideas, opportunities and sites (Regulation 18): August – October 2023 (COMPLETE)
- Consultation on preferred policy options/approaches (Regulation 18): Winter 2023
- Publication of pre-submission draft Local Plan (Regulation 19): Summer 2024
- Submission for independent examination: Autumn 2024
- Examination and adoption: 2025

Welcome the Warmth this Winter

Oxfordshire County Council has received Government funding to provide grants for residents to improve the energy-efficiency of their homes. Some of our Stanton Harcourt and Sutton residents may be eligible and interested in applying.

In a bid to help low-income households improve the energy efficiency of their home, bring down the cost of their bills and reduce their carbon footprint, the County Council is offering grants to fully fund the cost of improvements such as installing solar panels or heat pumps.

The County Council has created a designated website, Welcome the Warmth, to share more information about the scheme and who is eligible to apply for it. Generally, grants are only available to those living in a property with a D,E,F or G EPC rating and with a household income below a certain threshold or receiving certain benefits. The exact details are available on the website: Am I eligible? | Welcome the Warmth

For those who believe they are eligible and would like to take up the offer of a grant to make their home improvements, it's advised to contact the team via the freephone number 0800 038 6775 or by sending an email to info@welcomethewarmth.org.uk. While not all of our residents will be eligible for these grants, we hope that those who are can take advantage of them and make the improvements that could save them money and improve their carbon footprint for many years to come. THE EYNSHAM LINK Giving lifts to and from Eynsham

The Eynsham Link has been in existence for over 6 years. It was set up in response to the withdrawal of the Route 18 bus service by the

County Council – largely because patronage was low and the subsidy the service required was very high.

But without the bus service villagers who don't own cars, and villagers who temporarily do not have access to a car, find it difficult to get to Eynsham and the main centres of Witney and Oxford. For many the bus services from Eynsham to Oxford, Witney, etc are good so the prime need is to get to and from Eynsham

The First and Last bus service, which started in 2022, was welcome and has part filled the gap but it only runs to Eynsham 5 times a day Monday to Friday so there are many other times when villagers need a lift. The Link works through a WhatsApp group so anyone needing a lift puts a message on the App giving the rough time they need a lift and this alerts all those in the group who have cars. They can respond if they happen to be going to/from Eynsham around that time and they then communicate via the App with the person requesting the lift as to the exact time and pick up point.

For this to work consistently there needs in our estimation to have a minimum of 100 villagers in the scheme/on the App. We need more villagers who own cars therefore to volunteer to give the occasional lift- and very importantly anyone who doesn't own a car to join the scheme.

So if you are willing to offer a lift from time to time please join the Link. And if you regularly or occasionally need a lift please join the Link. Apart from having a smart phone the only requirement is to contact John Brown at jbrown1uk@yahoo.com and he will add you to the group.



FIRST AND LAST MILE BUS SERVICE

First and Last Mile has recently changed the 418 timetable to increase capacity into Eynsham in the mornings. It is now easier for commuters from Stanton Harcourt and Sutton to travel to Eynsham and beyond using our community bus.

On schooldays there will be an additional service leaving Flexneys Paddock at 08.15 as well as the usual 07.55 service. The 07.55 is open to all but on some schooldays this bus is full on reaching Stanton Harcourt. The second bus ensures that no one will be left behind as it has plenty of room.

The last bus back to Sutton and Stanton Harcourt now leaves Eynsham Church later - at 18.15 - to provide more time to connect with the bus from Oxford.

Finally a very delicious-sounding Christmas recipe sent in by villager, Ginny Prentice... "Here's my great-gran's (Sarah Puddifoot) stuffing recipe for Christmas dinner. We didn't stuff the bird with it, just had it on the side of the plate, and as a crunchy savoury snack, it was more popular than crisps or nuts!

GRAN'S STUFFING

6-10 fresh sage leaves very finely chopped. // Three quarters of a loaf of white bread, made into breadcrumbs (stale is better) // Couple of eggs, beaten (but add one at a time; may not need both; see how wet the mixture is) // Handful of 'Atora' shredded beef suet (but OK with vegetarian alternative), Salt and pepper. Two large onions chopped fine-ish.

The quantities aren't precise; use your judgement. Mix all ingredients together except eggs, then add one at a time; you don't need a very wet mixture, but it has to bind the crumbs together. Bung it all in a (slightly greased) Pyrex dish and cook in a hot oven, pulling the rack out every ten minutes or so to stir the mixture up with a fork until it gets all lovely and golden and crispy.
