PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE

Many thanks for everyone's input over the last couple of weeks on dog waste not only on the Recreation Ground but in the village and surrounding area in general. The Clerk contacted West Berkshire's Dog Warden and a meeting was arranged, which was attended by a few PCs to discuss next steps. We are also collating data provided by yourselves so that we have a better understanding of the problem. We intend to implement the following; install additional signage; add stickers on bins and other street furniture and provide additional bin(s) at key locations. We will continue to monitor the situation and if this initial approach fails then we will have to escalate matters and implement stricter controls. I trust everyone will work together to avoid this as the vast majority of dog owners are responsible and clean up after them.

On a more upbeat note the Queen's Platinum Jubilee takes place in 2022, with an extended bank holiday weekend running from Thursday 2nd to Sunday 5th June. Therefore we are looking for a team of volunteers to plan a village celebration. Please support our Parish Council – your view counts Our Parish Council (PC) comprises 6 residents who have stepped up to run our parish for us. They take actions and make decisions which they believe to be in the best interests of the village and spend our precept where they feel it necessary.

Also working for the village are the various committees and groups which run village amenities and clubs on our behalf — these committees and groups look after: the church, village hall, tennis court, cricket club, fete and netball. The village also benefits from the Evergreens, Table Tennis Club and Under 5s which are not solely run and used by villagers, but from which our residents benefit.

The PC along with support from WIN have decided to carry out a village survey to determine the villagers' priorities so that the PC can better understand what in the village means most. This information will be collected **per household**, is confidential and once collated will be published in the WIN.

PARISH PLANS AND NEIGHBOURHOOD PLANS

West Ilsley Parish Council recently discussed the possible benefits to the community of Parish Plans and Neighbourhood Plans.

A Neighbourhood Plan is a document that sets out planning policies for the neighbourhood area — the planning policies are used to decide whether to approve planning applications.

A Parish Plan or Community Plan is a 5-year vision or blueprint of what residents want to see delivered in their area; this could be anything from a better recreation ground, a new village hall or just more social activities.

WIPC agreed that West Ilsley does not need a Neighbourhood Plan at this time, as West Berkshire Council's (WBC) Local Plan does not identify any sites within the village for possible development and runs until 2037. WIPC has agreed to review this decision every 5 years.

WIPC felt that there may be some benefit in the village producing a Parish Plan. However, in order to produce a plan, there would need to be sufficient volunteers in the community - usually approximately 6-8 people - prepared to drive the project forwards, seek views from the residents of the parish and create the plan. If completed, this plan may be used to secure funding towards the projects identified in the plan.

We might be a small village club, but to get your name 'On the Board' should be something all of us – young and old – should aspire to.

This is our cricket club and it will always be my club. I hope you feel the same.
