Parish Council Update

The Parish Council was delighted at the number of residents who attended the March meeting, which resulted in a lively, good-natured, and stimulating discussion about many local issues of importance. High on the agenda was the considerable traffic congestion that brought the village to a standstill on 12 March, the ongoing problem with parked vehicles blocking the junction of the High Street and the Old Marlborough Road, and the overflowing dog waste bins, which the PC is aware of and is being investigated to find a solution. Residents are reminded and encouraged to report issues such as traffic congestion on the My Wilts App here www.wiltshire.gov.uk/mywilts-online-reporting It can also be used for abandoned vehicles, fraud, weather emergencies, fly tipping, dog mess and graffiti. The more reports they receive, the greater the likelihood they will act on them.

Parking appears to be getting worse in our village, so residents are kindly reminded of the following traffic regulations and asked to ensure that all their visitors comply with them as well:

- You MUST NOT park on a road at night facing against the direction of the traffic flow unless in a recognised parking space.
- Avoid parking on pavements where possible.
- Avoid parking opposite or within 10 metres (32 feet) of a junction

The Annual Parish Meeting will take place at 7pm on Thursday 9 May in the Village Hall and will be followed immediately after by the usual PC meeting.

Right of Way near Barbury Castle

The Parish Council has been contacted about the following matter. Since about 2017, landowners have fenced off a section of byway which used to lead from Gypsy Lane, across the top of Burderop Down above the Barbury Shooting School and end on the road opposite the entrance to the Barbury Hill car park. The landowners now want to close this byway and create a new one slightly downslope to the north. This would formally re-open a route for walkers, equestrians and cyclists, with landowner agreement. However, there is a risk that Wiltshire Council may not be able to agree legally to the proposed change if there is no evidence that people have used this slightly more northerly route. The Parish Council Clerk would be interested to hear from anyone who can remember using this route before it was blocked off. School Report

Poplars (Years 5/6) visit to Pewsey Church

On 5 March Poplars attended Pewsey church and toured the exhibition stations of Jesus's life. They used interactive devices to explore some of the stories of the bible and to discuss some of the teachings of His life. There was live voting about the class's understanding and a poll about what they thought Jesus's life was about and the lessons we could learn from it.

Whole School Drumming Workshop

We secured a grant from Wiltshire Music to fund a musical activity, so in March we welcomed Alex from Kaya Drumming with his huge collection of hand drums and percussion. Each class explored making, following and layering rhythms, starting and stopping music and adding song and dance to rhythm. Children took turns on different instruments and explored each sound. These rhythms and instruments form an important part of many cultures, so this musical day enriched our learning about different parts of the world. We were glad that so many parents could join us for our school community drumming circle and no one was left empty handed - drums, bells, shakers or boomwackers aplenty! It was an impressive sound.

World Book Day

'Glamorous, Clatter, Clumsy, Carnivore, Discombobulated, Curious and Creative'. Not a reworking of the Seven Dwarves, rather some of the imaginative characters to walk through the gates on World Book Day. What a joy to see all the teachers and children make so much effort. Ogbourne well and truly wowed with their wow words! We had a fun workshop where the children shared their ingenious costumes with each other and then did some writing based on a story from another culture. We also tucked into some beautiful and delicious cakes, so thank you to all the bakers who sent them in.

Little Dragons Update

Some of the children will be transitioning to Ogbourne School in September, and they began this process with a visit to the school and Acorns, the reception class. They watched a play and listened to a story, which they thoroughly enjoyed. They also met their new teacher Mrs. Procter and the children who left last year. The warmer, sunnier weather (at last) has enabled the children to be outside much more, and they recently enjoyed a lovely morning painting pictures of the daffodils and violas in the garden.
