Clubhouse Security

A message from our president:

"A few years ago we had a break in at the clubhouse, after which we had an alarm installed as a condition of the Club's insurance policy. If the door is not properly locked and/or the alarm is not activated by the last person to leave the clubhouse, this invalidates our insurance and means that the club would be liable for the costs of any break in.

Also the barrier into the Car Park must be locked properly (i.e. the latch must be pulled over the barrier and padlocked), it was found recently padlocked without the latch pulled over which in effect leaves the barrier still open, allowing anyone into the car park.

Whilst we all like to get home as quickly as possible, we must all be vigilant and take care to ensure that the clubhouse and premises are secure.

Please Note


