



**MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF MICHAELSTOW PARISH COUNCIL HELD IN  
THE CONFERENCE ROOM AT TREGAWN FARM at 8 PM on THURSDAY**

Item	<i>Discussion / decision</i>
<b>1. Public Session</b>	The meeting started a couple of minutes early as all attendees were present. There were 2 members of the public present, Mr. A. Button and Mr. S. Fuller. Mr. Button wished to check that plans were underway to move the plaque from the chapel to the church. He was also concerned that leaving grass long on Glebe Green might encourage ticks. Mr. Fuller was concerned by vehicle occupants using the layby next to his pepper farm as a public toilet. He was also attending to ask the council if anything could be done about the speeding and dangerous driving present on the B3266 through Michaelstow. A discussion followed since this item had been on the agenda for many meetings. Councillors were not satisfied with the responses they had got from police regarding traffic calming. Cllr. French Blake would start drafting more letters on this subject.
