# Bell Ringing World Record attempt at Charlton 10/5/25

The last Parish Chat had a notice about what is happening in Charlton on May 10th.

Since then we have delivered a written notice to all houses in Park Street and a good few throughout the rest of the village, but not outside, so here is a chance for everyone to hear what is happening at Charlton Church and the Village Hall, and also in 22 other Churches that circle around us, on the second Saturday in May.

Firstly, the World Record will be to get the most number of Bellringers to ring for 5 minutes each, in bands of 6 at a time, as we do all the time anyway, with not requiring anything more than ringing 'Rounds', 123456, but some bands may choose and be able to ring something a little more interesting, either Call Changes, where the 'Conductor' calls the bells into different sequences, so the ringer changes the speed briefly, to go faster or slower, to change the order, or some may choose to ring a 'short touch of a chosen method', where the sequences change on every 'stroke'. Ringing has its own language!

The bands will have pre-registered a time slot, as we will be having to be very organised, and we will have to be very strict to speed up the changeover, so as to not get behind. 10 bands in an hour, from 9.00 am till 9.00 pm, has the potential for 120 bands of 6, so with a possibility of 720 participating. There are 1100 members of just the Glos & Bristol ringing Association alone, and we already have people interested to come for the day from as far afield as Lancashire, Sussex and Cornwall.

The second reason that some will be coming, is that we are also organising 22 other Church Bell Towers to be available for timed periods throughout the day, that will

attract 'Tower Grabbers', like me, that enjoy visiting and ringing other towers, and there are over 6,000 worldwide. We also have the Touring Tower coming, a Mobile Belfry, that has been built for promoting bell ringing, as they are much smaller bells that even children can learn very quickly on, that will be at the Village Hall, where there will be refreshments, and the Car Parking will be, as we will apply for a Road Closure Notice, to prevent visiting bell ringers from blocking up Park Street, which doesn't take many cars to achieve. We will also put in some temporary 'Sound Control' to reduce the already quite quiet bells from disrupting the residents near to the Church.

This whole event is to raise funds for the Church to replace the now old LPG heating system, that is in the North Porch, so that we can install an Accessible Toilet with provision for baby changing, and a Kitchenette for providing drinks and light refreshments, and somewhere to wash up! We hope that everyone can get behind this unique event, and there is still just enough time, that if anyone would like to participate, with a concerted effort, we could get them to ringing rounds and

becoming a World Record holder, with a Certificate to prove it. I was lucky enough to take part in a similar event on a racecourse in the West of Ireland, where 154 of us shore sheep with Hand Shears, which is recorded on YouTube, and we intend to try and Livestream this.

### CHARLTON PARISH CHAT FEB-MAR 25 - PARISH COUNCIL NOTES

## **Shindig Festival**

- Another festival is coming to Charlton Park (we assume all residents know that WOMAD has moved elsewhere – though first taking a year off, this year).
- This is Shindig Festival (look it up on the internet), 22-25 May. They claim to be a family-friendly festival with lots of activities for children – and for that reason they schedule themselves in half-term.
- They were previously in Somerset. We have found no evidence to dispute their claim that they had a very amicable relationship there.

- The PC was consulted about their licencing application and had no comment.
- The Festival intend to allow free access for parish residents on the Thursday.
   Full detail of the arrangements will be in the April/May Chat.
- · Incidentally **Existance festival** will be returning this year 12-15 June.

### Precept 2025/26

• The PC has set the precept for the coming year. Being aware that Wilts Council has lost a lot of central Govt funding, as have the police, and that both are likely to need to increase their Council Tax by the maximum allowed, the PC decided to set our precept at a figure that leaves residents' payments unchanged. This means a reduced precept of £9,888 (is £10,000 in the current year)

### Elm Hill Defibrillator

- The PC has decided to buy and support a 2nd defibrillator, for the rural area of the parish.
- It will be located at the Elm Hill area (SN16 9DS), at the junction of Pink Lane and Pond Lane, on an external and easily-accessible wall of Great Elm Farm (with the kind permission of the farmer).
- It will take time to arrange. It is hoped it will be in position and operational before the next (Apr/May) issue of the Chat.

### **PC Facebook Page**

- The PC is going to start a PC Facebook page. The intent is to improve communication between the PC and residents.
- Only the PC Chairman and Clerk will be able to post items to this page. Readers will be able to comment. It will therefore be free from business advertisements.

### **Parish Council Website**

 The Parish Council website address has changed. It is now www.charltonnorthwilts-pc.gov.uk.

### **Defibrillator Training**

- There will be (free) defibrillator training in the Village Hall on Sat 29 Mar 9.30-11.30 am.
- Readers should bear in mind that 80% of heart attacks happen at home, so you may be the one to save the life of the person you live with! A good reason to attend the training every couple of years or so.

## **Parish Council Election**

- · Local elections are on 1 May 25. This includes both Wiltshire Council and all Town and Parish Councils in Wiltshire including Charlton PC.
- All of our current Parish Cllrs will stand down and those who wish to stand again must complete nomination papers. Similarly, anyone else who wants to stand for election must complete the nomination papers.
- Nomination papers have to be hand-delivered to Wilts Council in the period between 12 Mar-2 Apr, between the hours of 10am-4pm.
- · If you wish to stand you should look at the Electoral Commission website guidance www.electoralcommission.org.uk/guidance-candidates-parish-council-elections-england.
- · You should also keep an eye on the Wiltshire Council website www.wiltshire.gov.uk/local-elections .
- · If you have any questions, contact Wilts Council Electoral Services. The Parish Clerk can also give some advice.

Firstly a happy new year to you all from the Charlton Recreational Centre committee!

Since the last issue of the Chat, the hall committee held its AGM (December). During the meeting both Anne Holland and Helen Sunderland decided not to stand for re-election. Both stated that they would like to help out when needed, but after being highly valued members of the committee for many years the rest of the committee passed on their gratitude for all the work and efforts they had contributed to the committee and hall. The committee also took the opportunity to vote in Mrs Vanessa Rawlings who has kindly offered to take up the role of committee secretary, leaving Tracey Hobbs with the role of booking secretary.

The recent changeover of committee members have left a few vacancies, so if you would like to join our small team trying to

With the lack of committee members, we are still to decide on how to spend the two grants kindly donated by the Malmesbury area board, however the expectation is that they will be used to improve the hall lighting and possibly make a few small changes to the children's play area.

We are also looking for volunteers to assist in any future use of the hall as an emergency hub. We are merely looking at holding a list of people who may have some skills that could be used in a local emergency. The Parish council are looking at buving some emergency equipment that will be used once the hub is set up. The only work needed will be once the hall is setup as the emergency hub, so please don't hesitate in adding your name to a standby list.

Regarding the hall and surrounding area, the Avonvale FC are still looking to use the area directly at the back of the hall for the rest of the football season and we have been approached by another cricket club who have expressed a wish to ground share with our local club, more to come as plans are progressed!

Other updates around the hall include the recent damage to the car park light. The storms towards the end of the year led to the wooden pole holding the car park light to fall over. We are currently waiting on 2 quotes before looking to replace the pole and light. The committee have also seen that the car park is being used by unapproved users. The car park is only to be used by hall hirers or if visiting the play park. If you want to use the car park overnight, please gain the committees approval by sending an email to the gmail account above.

The committee have also been informed that some dog owners are not cleaning up their dogs mess from the playing fields.

There are fixed penalty fines for this, however with many people looking to use our local facilities, including our children, could you please ensure that you pick up after your pets.

The committee are also looking at getting some professional assistance to help with some of the trees surrounding the playing field. The expectation is that this will be completed by summer this year.






