After the chaos caused by two days of snow at the start of March, it's a relief to be well into spring, and on the verge of welcoming summer to our Parish. The HBeeT project is well underway with a steering group formed to take forward a wealth of ideas for improving the environment for our insects and wildlife. For the first time, the Parish Council will be at the Village Show on 14th July, showcasing some of these plans as



well as giving some prizes for entries to categories with an environmental theme, to help encourage involvement. Reinstatement works to the River Swift have also been planned, with financial assistance from grants applied for from the Environment Agency. & TVBC. These works should help protect the villages from the same levels of flooding we saw in 2014. You may notice that the precept—the income the Parish Council receives from you, the electors—has risen this April, the first time in several years, and which only equates to about £1 per household. You have a say what should happen to this money, so we are always happy to see new faces at our meetings and hear your ideas. We cordially invite you to our Annual Parish Meeting in May - especially as there will be light refreshments afterwards and the chance to say hello (details opposite). H Wildlife Group


Following the open meeting held at the George & Dragon in February a steering group has now met to formulate plans to help wildlife and biodiversity in the Parish. Some initial projects and events have been identified:

- * Habitat projects at KGV Playing Field and Dene Green will see planting of nectar rich, insect friendly shrubs, bird boxes and
- * Guided Bird Walk on Saturday 19th May led by Hurstbourne Tarrant's ornithological expert David Ellis
- * Village Show environmental garden competition
- * Bee Discovery Event to be held in the Autumn
- * Other events being investigated Bat Walk, outing to Hawk Conservancy, wild flower walk – more information to follow.

March Spring Clean ... in April!

Thank you to everyone who took part in our Parish Working Party day on Saturday 7th April ... delayed from March owing to our two bouts of snow which hampered the clean-up. Three groups met at Dene Green, Ibthorpe and King George V Playing fields and carried out maintenance and litter picking. In total, 30 adults and children turned out which was a fantastic effort. And a big thank you to Fiona Holland who organised Upton's clean up on 24th March.

We aim to organise the working parties twice a year—spring and autumn. As the Chairman mentions above, with budget cuts, many services are being devolved down from our local authorities so if we want our villages to stay looking in tip-top condition, and places to be proud of, many tasks will be down to us to complete.

It is about how planned development should be carried out, so that it is in harmony with its setting and makes a positive contribution to the local environment.

Fly tipping ... and dog fouling

If you are a Facebook follower, you may have seen the issues we had earlier in the year with fly-tipping along Common Road at the top of Hurstbourne Hill, towards Pill Heath. Tyres and other rubbish was dumped within the space of a week after being cleared away by volunteers. Test Valley Borough Council were contacted, and got involved, and at present, this appears to have stopped. Fly tipping is a criminal offence and is taken seriously by enforcement agencies, so please do report any information, anonymously if needed - either to TVBC, the police, or the Parish Council.





Another antisocial problem which has increased recently around the Parish is dog fouling. Not only are dog owners not clearing up their dog waste, but some bagged waste is being left on footpaths, pavement verges, and around the edge of the KGV field, despite there being 8 bins in the village for this use. The Parish Council's efforts to put up signs reminding dog owners about their duty to clear up were ripped down on the footpath up towards Doles Wood. We will be working with the TVBC Dog Warden over the next few weeks to try to find some solutions.

Hospital & Doctor Transport Volunteers



The Parish Council has been asked to look at a possible solution to the problem which some people face with transport to hospital and doctor appointments, especially those who live alone. We will investigate how this might be coordinated and would be keen to hear from anyone who would be prepared to go on a 'village register' of volunteer drivers, helping people to get to appointments at local surgeries and hospitals.
