## Rector's Letter



### Tweets not the way to world peace

Last month I wrote about us all appreciating more the things we have in our lives, and at the same time thinking about some of the concerns in our world right now - giving examples of the opening of the US Embassy in Jerusalem and the violence it has triggered in Gaza, and the talks between the US and North Korea seeming to be in jeopardy.

Hard though it may be to believe, we have just witnessed a direct meeting between President Donald Trump and Kim Jong-un, the President of the United States of America and the leader of North Korea, in Singapore. There was sabre-rattling on both sides in the build-up to this; there was name-calling of the sort associated with a school playground; Trump vowing to release "fire and fury" if Pyongyang persisted; Kim calling Trump "mentally deranged" and a "dotard" (definition, for those who might be interested: an old person, especially one who has become weak or senile). A year ago you would have got very long odds on such a face-to-face meeting taking place!

More recently, President Trump managed to upset all the other members of the G7 in a quite spectacular outburst following the summit in Quebec. The message, and the delivery, again being worthy of a school playground spat, but using current technology - a social-media outburst that can never be taken back. A Tweet of 140, or even 280, characters is no way to conduct international communication and diplomacy; if only it wasn't all so serious, it would be laughable.

However, credit has to be given that the meeting between the leaders of the USA and North Korea did take place. That must be good - communication is not only good, it is essential. Good communication, though, is not about sound-bites or point-scoring or photo opportunities.

Good communication is about speaking and listening; really hearing what the other person is saying, thinking and feeling. With Trump and Kim, we can normally expect a lot of talking but not much real listening, but maybe this time that wasn't the case. If this meeting had broken down amid playground point scoring, it would have been an incredible opportunity missed. French President Emmanuel Macron said, following the G7 Summit, that international cooperation could not be "dictated by fits of anger and throwaway remarks. Let's be serious and worthy of our people."

I hope that by the time you read this we will be discussing something very positive coming out of this historic meeting in Singapore, and not lamenting a wasted opportunity; that this will be remembered as a step forward in the goal of world peace and eventual denuclearisation, and not remembered for more cheap point-scoring. It's far too serious for that.

## Just a Thought



### It's good to talk, and to listen

I have just bought a new filing cabinet - one whose drawers move smoothly and where the files don't keep dropping off the rails. During the inevitable sorting out I found the following note I made many years ago after a chat with my daughter, who was about six at the time. Small ones can have profound thoughts.

"We had just finished our night-time bible story. B was looking thoughtful.

B - 'Why do bad things happen to people like illness, and disasters, and attacks and things that don't seem to be fair? Why does God let it happen?'

I muddled through an answer that I thought was at her level. I didn't feel very satisfied with it and neither did she. She pondered some more.

B - 'They are like words really aren't they - all the things that happen to people.'

Me - 'What do you mean?'

B - 'Well words can be long or big or short or small and they often don't make sense at all on their own, but if you put them all together then they do make sense, like a sentence or a book.' With that ticklish problem solved she dropped off peacefully to sleep."

We find ourselves talking to children quite a lot but do we spend much time talking with them? I was lucky. The family often used to have long chats whilst driving for miles through the African bush. On one memorable journey, when my boys were about 12 and 13, we found ourselves exploring the possibility of the existence of a fifth dimension! My daughter, aged three, was more concerned that her beloved seal's eye was loose. People do not need to go that far or to such extremes to chat, but, there is a problem.

During a recent radio programme children were asked what they hated most. One seven-year-old girl answered: "My mum's mobile phone." I am assuming that she was not jealous of the model or its bundle of latest apps but that the phone had replaced her in her mother's attention. How sad both for mother and child. There were no mobile phones, iPads or any such thing when my children were small, but nowadays the pace of life is truly hectic and the temptation of instant connectivity is considerable. Just look around in a café - the adult engrossed in a phone and a bored child sitting dangling their feet and fiddling with the sugar or staring into space. It is not just being there but having face-to-face interaction that matters. Obviously not every chat with a child is stimulating and precious but surely opportunities should be made.

Just recently, whilst sitting on the sofa, a two-and-a-half-year-old confided in her mother: "I love my brother, mummy, because he's beautiful, because he cuddles me,' - pause - 'and I cuddle ... so I am beautiful too."

Out of the mouths of babes and sucklings ... We need to talk and to listen - just in case.





## Neighbourhood Development Plan

It takes a Neighbourhood Plan Team ...

There are a fantastic bunch of people on the NDP team and they are all working very hard on behalf of the entire Parish. As work intensifies, I thought I'd give you a pen picture of what we've been up to.

Our five Working Groups (WGs) are busy assessing the character of our buildings, the landscape in which they are set and the sites that have been offered to Tunbridge Wells Borough Council (TWBC) for development. On top of this we have teams looking at infrastructure capacity now and future demand, and how to ensure Benenden is a thriving place to do business. These assessments are almost complete, and we can start turning thoughts into policies.

We recently held a workshop on Policy Writing. Whisper it quietly in front of planners, but this is a very dry subject! Despite the risk of boredom, 22 people from across each WG turned up, listened to our expert consultants and then set about sorting out the detail of what we are trying to achieve. We need joined-up thinking between the WGs.

Local business owners met with our Business & Economy WG on 14 June. They were briefed on the outcome of two surveys, one on the needs of local business and the other on the needs of local workers. They also heard about the concept of Live to Work units, a home/workshop concept.

The Housing Supply WG have been meeting those landowners or agents who offered TWBC land under the Call for Sites process. These talks have been useful to them as they complete individual site assessments. They will be working hand-inglove with the Design WG, who have produced a character assessment of the homes and buildings within the Parish. We

want new homes that work in our village setting. You'll also see an article in this magazine from the Green/Landscape WG, showcasing some candidate views and green Spaces we want to protect.

Another workshop was set up between Benenden NDP Team and the TWBC Planners. We worked hard in preparation for this crucial session. You will remember that TWBC have assessed how many houses we can take based on the amount of land offered, and Benenden landowners offered significantly more land than other parishes.

TWBC's initial proposal was over 200 new dwellings for Benenden. We have used the detailed local knowledge built up by following the NDP process to challenge this initial assessment. It is still early days and we have a great deal of work to do, but TWBC are keen to get their decisions right and use our input to do so, as long as it is objective and fair. You will hear more about this in future editions, and on our new website:

The people who are working alongside me on this important task are doing a great job. I take my hat off to them all and you can learn more about them on the website.

I will be out of circulation for a few months as I am away on business a fair bit through the summer. Tom Dawlings will be chairing the NDP in my absence.

### Thinking of view

All the attention has so far been on the planning aspects of the Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP). However, it has other important sides to it, not the least of which is the impact of any development on the environment. The residents of Benenden have clearly stated, several times, that one of their top priorities is to preserve the rural nature of the Parish. To that end the Environmental Group have been carrying out an environmental audit.

One of the more enjoyable tasks allotted to the NDP's Environmental Group has been to walk the many footpaths and note the ancient woodland, mature trees, hedges, ponds and pits which articulate the landscape around Benenden.

It is said we have more than 26 miles of footpaths in the Parish, an offshoot of which

has been the requirement of the Plan to note any views of importance. It turns out that we have more than our fair share and I'm sure everyone has their own favourite (see below).

Almost everywhere you go, you turn a corner and spread before you will be vistas of the Weald, with steep-sided wooded gills, undulating fields and trees and ancient farmsteads nestled within a medieval fieldscape; or looking south the countryside falls away towards Romney Marsh.

Due to our location, draped over a series of ridges, the views are often much more than just a glimpse of a well-known landmark, like the Sandhurst windmill or the clock tower of Saint Ronan's, in the distance. From the footpath north of Hinxden Dairy, you can look north, south and west, a sweeping

of Parsonage
Wood you can
take in fields
dotted with
sheep and the
rise and fall of
the countryside
beyond; and



from the road to Dingleden a tree-filled landscape that looks as if it hasn't changed since Saxon times.

Views are important to the identity of the Parish and luckily they are valued in the NDP. The question is which ones to choose? A number of views have been already mapped and

registered and will be included as being of special significance and therefore to be given protection; developments will be restricted or refused if they interfere with them.

The Environmental Group would welcome suggestions from readers of the village magazine about which views they feel should



be included. Please send a photo, together with a description of the view and where the photo was taken, to the Editor (contact details p.1).

## **Local History**

## Oast houses

Oast houses, with their pointed, usually conical, roofs and white cowls are a familiar, if not ubiquitous, feature of the landscape around Benenden. Every farm would have had an oast or two to process the hops grown in abundance in Kent and Sussex and needed for the brewing industry. Famously, pickers would arrive from the East End of London for their annual hop-picking holiday. Sadly, there are few hop gardens left in Kent and the majority of oasts are no longer working but have been converted into houses.

The original oasts were simply converted wooden barns and followed on from the introduction of hops in the mid 16th century. To start with, oasts were therefore square but they soon gained height and their distinctive pointed roofs to improve the flow of air.

By the early 1800s, round oasts were being built in the belief that they were more efficient. The earliest surviving oast is at Golford and dates from the 17th century. In the majority of Kentish oasts the roundels are built of brick, though occasionally ragstone, often associated with weatherboarding for the cooling area.

Most of us know oasts were used for drying hops - when picked they have 80% humidity which has to be reduced to about 6% - but have only the vaguest notion about how it was done. In fact, this was almost an industrial process carried out on a vast scale. The green hops were bagged and taken up to a gantry from where


they could be brought in to the upper level of the oast and spread out over a floor in the

roundel consisting of batons covered with a horsehair cloth to allow the heat from a brick kiln below to rise through.

The coal-fired brick-built kilns could be internal or external. You may have noticed the external kilns when visiting the gardens at Sissinghurst. The hops were raked out into a layer about 12 inches deep and dried before being raked again onto a separate floor to cool, then bagged in large jute sacks, known as pockets, for sale or distribution.





### Prepared for the future

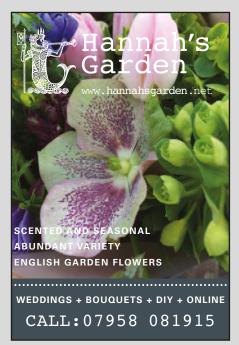

So Lasting Powers of Attorney can be an invaluable provision to put in place to safeguard your future, especially if your assets are solely in your name. You'll be secure in the knowledge that those you trust can manage things on your behalf. However, you can only put this arrangement in place whilst you still have mental capacity. Without a Lasting Power of Attorney, if your family needed access to your funds to, for example, pay for your care they would need to apply to the Court of Protection for a Deputy to be appointed for you. # Food & Drink No nostalgia for the dark days of Kent cuisine

There was a time, not so long ago, when good food and good drink were devilishly hard to come by, in Kent as in the rest of the country.

Devotees of decent beer will remember the late 1970s as an era when proper ale came close to extinction; wine in our shops was limited to sickly German nonsense; and the closest we came to exotic comestibles was a Fray Bentos meat pie.

A few decades down the line, it's hard to recall the era, post rationing, when the cheese industry was all but defunct in this country and Elizabeth David's world cookbooks read like an encyclopaedia of the unattainable. In fact, take a teenager to the supermarket these days and you run the risk of sounding like your grandmother, as you reel off the list of foodstuffs that you "just didn't get back then".

In 2018, you can hardly turn round without bumping into an eco-friendly cheesemaker or a craft brewer with edgy facial hair, and at Biddenden vineyards recently they were out in force for the 12th annual Food and Drink Day, where we were promised we might "taste the best of Produced in Kent", which itself is a







"non-profit organisation working in partnership with Kent County Council and Hadlow College" to promote the best our county has to offer (producedinkent.co.uk).

So much for the blurb. This was a chance to go deep into the subsoil of Kent's revived agricultural and artisanal tradition, at a 'domaine' that has long been at the forefront of the movement, with fine domestic wine and cider, not to mention non-alcoholic stuff. "It's the same apple, the same juice, it's just not been fermented," was the first sales pitch I heard from the man on the Biddenden stall, which sent me scurrying for a sip of the 8.4% Strong Kentish for reassurance.

Had I not been designated driver for the day, I could have done some serious damage on the booze front, but my designated taster assured me that the wickedly fruity Anno sloe gin from Marden was the pick of the day, while I contented myself with unsweetened cherry juice from trees grown in Sandhurst and Northiam by Dallaways. Apparently it's good for "recovery after vigorous exercise", although I didn't risk it.

It's tempting to stick to what you know, and it was reassuring to see Benenden's own Dee Manford in attendance with the best of Hinxden Dairy, along with KC Charcuterie from Cranbrook, but the point of these fairs is that you get to see just how big and multifarious

the Garden County is and how much exploring there is to do.

Rochester Organic Root Ginger, from the badlands of north Kent, is a feisty cordial that belies its non-alcoholic status with a substantial kick; Goody Ales from the Bleangate Brewery in faraway Herne were so in demand that they were sold out by the time I arrived, but come with a fine reputation; last but foremost, the unpasteurised Ashmore Farmhouse from Cheesemakers of Canterbury epitomised the rude health of the artisan British cheese industry.

There was even turkey, in wraps, rolls and pies, from Tony Fleck's free-range Kelly Bronzes at Woolpack Corner Farm, a stone's throw from the vineyards. Now, turkey in summer, that's something you never used to see when I was a lad.

## Argentine wine touched by the 'Hand of God'

Argentina may bring to mind many associations, both famous and infamous: football, the 'Hand of God', corned beef, rugged gauchos, parlous economics, the Falklands (not Malvinas) and of course wine.

Riding like a cowboy on the back of the imperious Mendoza Malbec revolution, the Argentinian wine scene has burst fruit-throttled into our supermarkets and wine glasses. Amongst the good, the bold and occasionally ugly, are some fantastic wines that break the mould and offer finesse as well as power, and at an affordable price. In this hope, 50 of us gathered to be regaled by visiting winemaker and silver fox Patricio Gouguenheim (as part of a world tour that also took him to Selfridge's), who showcased eight fabulous wines for us to enjoy.

We began in France with a welcoming rosé from Domaine de Pellehaut which was as sunny



as the occasion and as refreshing as an ice lolly; well worth £7.85 from Benenden's and ideal as a pre-barbecue tipple. Patricio, with his winning charm, then introduced us to his own fabulous wines. The sparkling Malbec rosé was quite a revelation and will be available soon at Benenden's.

The remaining seven offerings, from six different varieties, revealed the breadth and depth of Argentine wine. My highlights included the honeyed and stone fruit

intensity of his Torrontes at £9.60 - if you enjoy rich whites with body then you'll be sure to like this discovery. The Malbec Reserve (£13.40) is closer to what one might expect of Argentina, with its delicious blueberry sweetness and wonderful mouthfeel, making it a perfect accompaniment to steak. The showstopper, for a bargain of £13.95, was



Gouguenheim's five-year-old Cabernet Reserve, which balanced cassis flavours with gentle tannins for an altogether hedonistic experience. All the wines are available at the village shop.


Where else can you try a total of nine wines, meet a winemaker, enjoy breads, cheeses and fabulous beef, and then buy discounted wines, all for only £15 a ticket? The next village tasting, including a barbecue, will be with Australia's Mitchell Wines on Friday 31 August. For a fabulous, vinous evening, pop to Benenden's and a get a ticket.

#### **Bird Notes**

#### Two interesting visitors

Nearly every autumn there is an unusual occurrence of birds visiting our islands. Some of these are quite regular such as the irruptions of Waxwings landing in high numbers about every three years. Three years ago we had a visit from a Siberian Accentor (a close relative of our own Dunnock); although it only involved nine birds, widely distributed, it was a first for the UK. Last year it was the turn of the Yellow-browed Warbler, which, although a regular autumn visitor again from Siberia, has never occurred in such large numbers. Last autumn the prize goes to the Hawfinch, which descended on our shores in unprecedented numbers. There were reports from the northern isles to Cornwall, with some flocks in Surrey achieving over 200 birds.

There has never been anything like it before. Our own breeding population of 500 to 1,000 pairs only move locally into winter roosting sites such as the well-known one in Bedgebury Forest. In recent years only a few birds have been seen there, as the UK population is in fast decline for reasons unknown. There are only a handful of ringing records from northern Europe and our



understanding of their migration habits is therefore very sketchy. However it is well known that the Russian population deserts its breeding areas to winter in warmer climes stretching from Spain to Taiwan. Was the invasion last autumn due to lack of food in southern Europe and birds moving to our shores in search of food, or a massive navigational error?

Some Hawfinches were seen locally, with a few in Hemsted Forest, and I saw a few in a local orchard. Fortunately one male bird perched on top of a tree long enough for me to train a telescope on it. Its massive beak was very prominent and in winter was pearl in colour. Its rusty brown head, black bib and very broad white wing bar made it look very handsome and as it turned, its prominent

white-tipped tail was very evident. The beak can exert enormous pressure to crack both cherry and plum stones and has been estimated to bring to bear about 40kg force. This is a bird that likes a wide range of berries and kernels, hence its name, but I have mostly seen it consume the keys of hornbeam trees.

Hawfinches are difficult birds to locate as they are not very vocal and spend a lot of time in the canopy of trees. When they do vocalise, their call has been likened by some bird guides to jabbing a spike onto a piece of granite. They often make this call in flight, which, with a trained ear can be picked up, and once seen the profile is very obvious, with large beak, short tail and stocky appearance. I hope that some will choose to stay here rather than go back to their northern breeding grounds.

I love to pick up a field guide and casually peruse the images, so there are a few species I look at with great envy and think it would be brilliant to see one day. Well one of those dreams came true very recently. I had read one of these birds was seen in Denge Gully near Dungeness and I thought it had got to be worth a go. It was a very cold but bright day and I walked along the road parallel to the gully, which was partly filled with water and the banks well covered in gorse bushes.

There were quite a few other bird watchers doing likewise, and more pairs of eyes are always a help, so it was not long before the bird was spotted on the opposite bank in a little clearing. What a stunning sight and even more brilliantly coloured



than the field guide itself. It is not often I have had so much pleasure bird watching as I did observing this Robin-sized bird with a magnificent blue throat and breast that just knocks you over! Lower down the breast, the blue is bordered by black, white and red, which just adds to the overall magnificence of the creature. Not surprisingly this little gem is called a Bluethroat.

The Bluethroat is a summer visitor wintering mainly in the African Sahel region and breeds in northern Europe and Asia in soggy birch forest. There are a few pairs breeding just over the Channel and two pairs bred successfully in Scotland in 1985 and 1995. There are two subspecies, White-spotted and Red-spotted, which refers to the spot in the middle of its blue throat. The Denge bird probably blown here by the 'Beast from the East' was the White-spotted variety, which only revealed its white spot when it lifted its head. It is a regular spring and autumn migrant, with a bird ringed in Slapton, Devon being recaptured two years later, demonstrating that the UK is a regular migration route and not just a blown-off-course one.

I mentioned at the beginning of this article unusual autumn occurrences; the Bluethroat's year was 1965, when over 100 were seen in early September, but this pales into insignificance beside 1985, when over 480 were seen in May in Scotland. This was the Red-spotted sub species - which migrates later, as its breeding range is further north - one pair of which stayed and bred.

## Local Enterprise ... Enterprising Locals

REBECCA MANFORD BSC HONS MSST OF R.M. SPORTS THERAPY A NEW BREED OF ENTREPRENEUR

Rebecca Manford (BSc Hons MSST of R.M. Sports Therapy) is

from one of Benenden's famous farming families and grew up at Hinxden Farm Dairy. She joined the Romney Marsh Pony Club aged three and by the age of eight had started competing in tetrathlon - the discipline requiring an athlete to ride, run cross-country and shoot as well as swim. She went to Angley School and was swiftly streamed not only as a Gifted and Talented student but as an elite athlete.

Later Rebecca added dressage to her riding skills, successfully representing the British Dressage Regional Squad, Romney Marsh Pony Club, Rother Valley Riding Club and her school at national level. The native ponies she rode up to the age of about 16, mostly Connemara and New Forest, were trained by herself, then she was gifted her first proper dressage horse and continues to compete.

Rebecca worked as a 'gappy' at

Saint Ronan's and Marlborough House before her gap year travelling round New Zealand - a year which was to prove formative as, early on, she cut her hand very badly and had to undergo extensive rehabilitation. This so inspired her

that she decided to make it her career.

The next step was a BSc in Sports Therapy at Coventry University - thanks in part to the support of grants from Benenden's Gibbon & Buckland Trust - where



she was also part of the university riding team.

When asked how she differs from a physio, Rebecca replies that the training and treatment is similar, but physios are generally hospital-trained whereas sport therapists are trained in the university injury clinic and in the field - literally in her case, as for sports therapy university placements she was

attached to the rugby league team and to the Birmingham City Ladies Football Academy, the latter with players from age 7-17, thus gaining experience of almost every type of sports injury, assessing and treating everyone from large hairy men to petite little girls.

She graduated with a first in the summer of 2016 and by October had started practising from home as a sports therapist. She has ambitions to build a treatment room in the garden, but hasn't abandoned her farming roots, marketing and promoting Hinxden Farm Dairy products in Kent, East Sussex and into London, as well as helping to feed the calves, tractor driving and manning the Dairy's stand at the village fete and other food fairs.

Rebecca works from home but she also travels to people's houses for almost 50% of her business and is extremely busy due to social media, word of mouth - and thanks in part to her regular ad in this magazine - with clients ranging in age from 9-90. And, yes, I asked what sport had caused injury to the 90-year-old: bowls, of course, I always thought it was a dangerous game!

Treatments vary from massage, taping weak joints and providing muscle-strengthening

exercises to improving flexibility and balance. Rebecca can also help people who have long-term aches and pains, poor posture or repetitive strain injury with sports massage. Minnie Garnier
