From the Vicar

Dear friends

I hope you are all well, and that you had a good summer.

Last month, I wrote about how quiet Cuddesdon seemed, after a large cohort of ordinands and families left the College in June. I'm delighted that new ordinands have now arrived, and continuing ordinands returned, and the college is a hive of activity. I've really enjoyed meeting some of the new ordinands, and their families, and College staff, and I look forward to getting to know them a little over the next couple of years.

We celebrated our Harvest Festival and College Welcome service on Sunday 24th September, which was a very joyful occasion. I was delighted to see so many people from the village and college, and a number of visitors from further afield, too. The Church was beautifully decorated for Harvest, and the choir really enhanced our singing, as they celebrated their first anniversary. Many thanks to all involved. We also enjoyed a lovely Harvest Supper in the Village Hall – many thanks to Mark and Linda, the Village Hall Committee, and various helpers. It was a great evening.

The nights are getting longer, and the days shorter, I turn my mind to our autumn services. This year, the Benefice Service of Light, at which we remember our loved ones, friends and neighbours who have died, will take place in All Saints' Church, at 3pm on Sunday 5th November. It occurs to me that we usually have a bonfire and fireworks on the recreation field on that Sunday – but I hope people will be able to attend both. St John's Gospel begins with its wonderful prologue about the Word who became flesh and dwelt among us, and the light which shines in the darkness and cannot be overcome. At the Service of Light, we give thanks for those who have died, and we remember that, in the darkness of death and grief, Christ's light continues to shine. Jesus' resurrection gives us reason to hope and trust that death is not the end, and that our loved ones are not lost, but rest in peace, in our Father's house, with all the saints who have gone before us. And on the morning of 5th November, we will celebrate All Saints' Day, our Patronal Festival, in our Parish Communion service at 9:30am. All are welcome to all our services.

The following Sunday, we mark Remembrance Sunday, after which we will begin to look towards Advent. I hope that we will have our usual Advent Carol Service, on Advent Sunday; and this year I am looking forward to a traditional Village Carol Service of Nine lessons and Carols, on Saturday 16th December. I'm also very much looking forward to the exhibition of prints and engravings depicting the birth and early life of Jesus, which will take place in Church from 4th December – further information to follow next month!

As the nights lengthen, and we journey into October, I wonder if you, too, find yourself spending more time in reflection, remembrance and prayer? If you want a quiet space to reflect and remember, All Saints' Church is open daily. You are welcome to pop into church to pray, or to ponder, or to enjoy some peace and quiet. We hope to prepare a new prayer space soon, with a book for prayer requests and, perhaps, some prayer candles. Do let us know if there are any other prayer aids, or anything else you would find helpful, to support you in prayer and worship.

Huge thanks to Mark Chapman for “Masterchef-ing” another Harvest Supper – his last! Thanks too, for the amazing array of desserts provided by all the pastry chefs. Over 40 of us had a thoroughly enjoyable evening and left extremely well fed!

The profit of £288 will be split between the Church and the Village Hall.

Parish Council

Evie Bennett, Philip Spinks and Louisa Vincent have been co-opted onto the Parish Council. They join Robin Baylie, Stuart Flockton, Chris Luke and Arthur Smith-Fitchett as councillors, so the Council is now at full strength.

The final version of the application for the Bat and Ball to be registered as an asset of community value has now been submitted. The District Council has said that they will decide whether they will approve the application by the end of October.

Admiral are being very tight lipped about their intentions for the pub, but it has been discovered that the annual rent is £73k although this will be reviewed in two years time.

Further work on the ACV project might include assessing the commercial viability of the pub and forming a group to consider how funding its purchase could be achieved.

The District Council has approved the planning application to run a solar farm cable under the road through the parish (P22/S2220/FUL). This cable will carry power from the proposed solar farm near the motorway at junction 7 to a substation in Cowley. I will try to find out when the cable laying is likely to take place and how much disruption there will be.

Following clearing of the back of Cuddesdon Green, it has been suggested that a Green Group should be formed to look at further improvements in the area. Two trees on Denton Green have been pruned to make them safe and the dead tree near the churchyard entrance has been removed.

The County Council will be adopting the verges near the road at the Dove House development. They have been applying pressure to Natta to have the area landscaped before adoption takes place, and have had some success. Magdalen College own the land further back and they have also had some success in getting the area improved.

I want to thank everybody who served on the previous PC team – David, Richard, Colin & Paddy – who helped us through the covid pandemic as well as all the regular parish business over the extended last term of 5 years (and terms before that, amounting to decades serving Cuddesdon & Denton). Thank you for your time, resources and expertise helping the community and I hope we can call on all of you at times in the future.

While the new PC has some difficult issues to deal with, including the ongoing pub closure, Autumn does bring a few community events as well. We prepare for Bonfire Night on Sunday 5th November and then Remembrance Sunday on Cuddesdon Green a week later.

Happy October to all in Cuddesdon & Denton. Aside from Munich, obviously, there's no place I'd rather be at this time of year. Wouldn't it be great to have a beer though?

John Howell MP writes... September 2023

Just as school were due to return, and the sunshine that many had been longing for came we hit the problem of the safety of school buildings due to concerns over reinforced autoclaved aerated concrete (RAAC). The potential disruption to education and the timing of the problem caused inevitable and understandable frustration. The Department for Education had been working to identify buildings which may have RAAC over the last year but the problem escalated with cases that came to light over the summer and at the end of all establishments with buildings with RAAC confirmed by a surveyor were advised to take the affected space out of use until suitable mitigations have been put in place. I think that this was a sensible precautionary step to protect the safety of everyone whilst adequate mitigations are being put in place. Whilst the concern was widespread thankfully once the list of affected places was published I was relieved to see that no schools in this constituency were affected.

Following the media coverage of the introduction of Ultra Low Emission Zones (ULEZ) I received a number of emails from constituents. I appreciate that a number of residents in this area do travel to London on a regular basis. The ULEZ in London means that for those who do not have a compatible vehicle there is now a charge. From early days as an MP I have been very clear that in a rural area such as the Henley Constituency a car is not a luxury; it is an essential means of transport both locally and indeed for longer journeys where practical alternatives do not exist. Whilst we can argue for more public transport the geography and nature of people movement will always make it a challenge to provide an efficient and economic system that meets the diverse travel needs. We need, as always, to find a balance and do our best to bring people with us on change.




