Reminders

The pop-up Post Office is here from 12.45-2.15pm, with the local greengrocer from 11-1pm, Corinne has her local honey and Julie her pottery as well as 'Home things' eco-products (check them out on-line to know more) and locally produced cards, cosmetics and Pluckley tea and coffee. These are well worth supporting. Staying and buying 'local' has never been more important for our well-being and that of our planet!! We can only expand what is needed and what the village is trying to do if we all take part!

The proceeds of the auction, £200, have been donated to Cancer Research UK in Mike's memory and the non-perishable goods have been delivered to Maidstone Homeless Charity.

New Clubs and Societies at the Village Hall



#### **Grafty Gourmet**

Bacon-wrapped sausages cooked in a sherry-laced, onion-rich sauce make this French onion sausage casserole a quick and easy dinner to warm you up on these cold nights.

#### FRENCH ONION & SAUSAGE CASSEROLE

6 rashers of streaky bacon 375g pack of pork chipolatas Vegetable oil for frying 25g of butter 500g of onions, sliced 2 garlic cloves, sliced 1 tablespoon of plain flour 100ml of medium dry or dry sherry, plus an extra splash 1 beef stock pot 3-4 bushy fresh thyme sprigs, plus extra leaves to garnish 8 large thin slices of fresh baguette or similar crusty bread 4 teaspoons of wholegrain mustard 125g of strong cheddar cheese, grated Splash sherry vinegar

1. Cut the bacon rashers in half, stretch each piece by running the back of a kitchen knife blade along it, then wrap one around each chipolata. Heat the oil in a medium hob-safe casserole dish, add the pigs in blankets and brown over a medium-high heat for 4-5 minutes. Set aside.

2. Add a splash more oil if needed, along with the butter, then add the onions and a plenty of salt and black pepper. Fry gently for 5-6 minutes until starting to soften. Stir in the garlic, then cover and simmer for 15 minutes, stirring once or twice, until the onions have softened and turned deep brown.

Stir the flour into the onions, then cook for 1-2 minutes. Add the sherry, stock pot and 500ml hot water from a just-boiled kettle. Stir to combine, then add the browned pigs in blankets and the thyme.

3. Simmer on a low-medium heat for 20 minutes until it thickens. Meanwhile, heat the grill to high. Toast the baguette slices on each side. Spread with the mustard, then scatter with the grated cheese. Cook under the hot grill until the cheese has melted and is bubbling and golden. Stir a splash more sherry and the sherry vinegar into the casserole, season to taste, then serve with the cheese toasts, and extra thyme leaves, if you like.


#### **Volunteer Taxi Service**

# Sue Greenwood reports on the 400<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Honywood and Douglas Almshouse Charity

In 1622 the Honywood Trust was created to provide homes for local people in Lenham and was united with the Douglas Charity in 1996, to provide homes for residents from Boughton Malherbe.

On Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> October 2022 there was a celebration in Lenham. You will have seen the building work at 23 High Street over the past year. The property was bought by the Honywood and Douglas Charity in 2021 to convert into three new Almshouses, making a total of 29 owned by the Charity in Lenham. Each of the new homes has been allocated to new residents, who should be moving in soon. They have an open-plan kitchen/living room and a single bedroom/wet-room.

The Town Crier announced the arrival of Mr. Julian Marczak of the Almshouse Association, who came to officially 'open' the first two dwellings, Honywood Cottage and Douglas Cottage. The third is Flint Cottage, which is nearly finished. As with all the Charity's properties the new ones are for residents who are over 60 and who



have lived in Lenham or Boughton Malherbe for at least two years.

Following the official opening the Charity Trustees and colleagues, with 100 together residents and special guests, held a tea-party the at Lenham Community Centre to celebrate our 400<sup>th</sup> Anniversary.

While enjoying a delicious afternoon tea, the party was entertained with music from a Lenham Primary School choir, and also pieces played by our Lenham harpist, Claire Houston. Guests could enjoy an historic exhibition of some of the Charity's archives and records, and old deeds and maps of the original estate and land owned by the Charity. An enormous amount of research by dedicated historians went into the production of this remarkable display. This very special occasion was marked by the publication of the new '400 years' leaflet outlining the background and achievements of the Charity and its hopes for the future. Copies are widely available.

The Chairman and Trustees and officers of the Honywood and Douglas Charity gave

their sincere thanks to the many volunteers who had helped to make this a great occasion of celebration.

The new almshouses are a feature of our High Street and with the construction work completed existing residents and businesses can now welcome new neighbours and enjoy a return to normality.

The programme includes Purcell, *Ode & Chacony to St. Cecelia*, and Handel's *Trio Sonata in G*.

Saint Cecilia was a Roman virgin martyr and is venerated in Catholic, Orthodox, Anglican, and some Lutheran churches, such as the Church of Sweden. She became the patroness of music and musicians, it being written that, as the musicians played at her wedding, Cecilia "sang in her heart to the Lord". There are various and conflicting tales as to the details and date of her martyrdom. Musical compositions are dedicated to her, and her feast is the occasion of concerts and musical festivals.

# The NHS Waitless App

#### if you need to go to Accident and Emergency or a Pharmancy

This is an extremely useful smartphone app designed to cut waiting times at accident and emergency departments in east Kent.

The WaitLess app combines current waiting times at all urgent care centres – drawn from the official NHS system – with up-to-the-minute travel information, to help people decide which urgent care centre to head to for faster treatment for minor injuries or if you have been told to go to A&E by your GP or the 111 service.

Download the App from Google play or ITunes

Once installed, you can select from the options available or select Proceed to WaitLess to see the waiting and travel times for all the east Kent hospitals.

Treatment centres are shown with the smallest travel and wait times first. You can then scroll right to find the most convenient for you.

The is also a listing for Pharmacies, by selecting the pharmacy symbol (green cross) at the bottom of the app.

Both will show if they are Open or Closed

You can also get directions from the service you would like to use.

And Finally, by selecting

the more Info button you will get additional information eg: what treatments are offered, parking facilities and accessibility.

## The God of Hope

We will all face the merciful judgment of God: we can all share the Queen's hope which in life and death inspired her servant leadership. Service in life, hope in death. All who follow the Queen's example, and inspiration of trust and faith in God, can with her say: "We will meet again."

These are the words with which Archbishop Justin Welby ended the sermon he gave at the Queen's funeral. In his excellent message, he emphasised the place of hope in the life of the Queen.

In life, we all have hope in various things. Some things that are grounding, some that are fleeting and others that are perhaps closer to wishful thinking, for example, the hope of winning the lottery!

In the Bible, the theme of hope is prominent. In the New Testament, the word hope features in almost every book! One of the most famous examples is found in 1 Corinthians 13:13 which we often hear at weddings.

"And now these three remain: faith, hope and love."

The author of 1 Corinthians, the Apostle Paul, clearly sees hope as much more significant than a simple 'hope for the best'. What is it that makes him hold the importance of hope in such high regard? Of all of his letters, the one in which Paul writes about hope the most is Romans. In chapter 15 verse 3 we read the following.

May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.

Paul shows that firstly, hope is part of the character of God himself! He is a God of hope! Paul goes on to say that as we trust God, he himself fills us with joy and peace so that as a result, we overflow with hope! Our life circumstances will at times prove difficult and hard moments come to us all, but there is an overflow of hope that comes as we trust in God.

Many have commented on the joy and peace that the Queen displayed and she certainly did overflow with hope. What a joy it is to us that we can choose to put our trust in the same God of hope that she served and also share in the hope that she had.
