PARISH COUNCIL FINANCE

As always, the Parish Council take the responsibility of managing your money, the parish finances, very seriously. We are in a strong financial position. We have supported the community, but we are very aware of how challenging these times are and, unlike other authorities, we have NOT increased our portion of the Council Tax for three years. This is something we are proud of!

Thank you to all the Councillors and staff who have served Staplehurst over the past four years.

During the last four years the Parish Council has worked tirelessly to improve the quality of life for residents. In October 2019, the PC held a celebration event to mark the 125th anniversary of the formation of Parish Councils; Staplehurst being one of, if not the first, to be formed.

Safe, Clean and Green

- Engaging with the Police, Maidstone Borough Council (MBC) Community Team, Kent County Council (KCC)
 Warden and have improved CCTV in four areas of the Village
- Organising a twice-annual Community Litter Pick
- Regularly working with the Community Payback team to make improvements around the village, especially in the Parade area
- Organising an annual Bio-blitz event at Wimpey Field
- Wimpey Field is now managed by a maintenance plan
- Installing flower planters at the village gateways, Jubilee Field, outside of the former South-Eastern hotel and planting a wildflower garden along the A229 adjacent to Chestnut Avenue
- Improved areas of The Parade including cutting down the planter vegetation, installing flower planters adjacent to Spar and Maddie's Garden and repainting the outside of the library building
- Organising Eco friendly energy supplies to all Parish Council Buildings
- Working with Growing Concern to provide flowered concrete planters throughout the village
- Working to open Parish allotments in 2023

Working in partnership with all stakeholders to enhance facilities

- Working with Play Place to provide a safe and enjoyable environment for the 3-week-long Summer Playscheme
- Lobbying Sainsbury's to build the store and engaging with them throughout the project; this led to Sainsbury's financing the tarmacking and white line marking of Jubilee Field car park
- Working with the JFMC and football clubs to improve the Jubilee Field: new flood lights, dugouts, storage
 facilities, spectator stand, hedge cutting, ditch clearance, internal painting the pavilion and new drainage to the
 football pitch
- Maintaining and annually painting the Skate Park
- Improved the vehicle access gate at Wimpey Field, and installed a pathway for disabled users
- Engaging with MBC to resurface and install white line markings and fencing at Bell Lane car park
- Supporting the Scouts, helping maintain their building and the adjacent land
- Taking ownership of the Youth Club building following COVID and running a very successful Youth Programme
- Installing a new pathway to the children's playground at Surrenden Field enabling residents to access the play area all the year round and encouraging walking to access village facilities.
- Liaising with MBC by putting forward street names for new roads and two pathways: Ashdown Walk and Doutrepont Walk named after the two victims of WWII plane crash into the station ticket office

Supporting our community

- During COVID: supporting vulnerable residents in need by providing transport to vaccination centres; obtaining
 grants to assist those in need; erecting blue lights at the Parade in recognition of the NHS and engaging in social
 media to bring the community together. Staplehurst Emergency Help Team and Community Hub received two
 prestigious awards for their services to Staplehurst
- Assisting the Women's Institute by installing a bench and tree, planted in honour of their hundred-year anniversary
- Brightening up the village each year with Christmas motifs, a Christmas tree and lights at the Parade
- Supporting the Village Remembrance Day Parade
- Improving communication via the SPC website, social media and the Village Update

Working in partnership and planning for the future

- In February 2020 hundreds of residents gathered to hear the presentation of SPC's reaction to the latest MBC 'Call for Sites' and overwhelmingly supported the stance of SPC in refusing all new sites for Staplehurst
- Engaging and working with our partners including KCC, MBC and Helen Grant MP, in relation to planning applications, litter bins, street lighting, refuse collections, roads and pathways, hedges and green space and to seek grant funding to deliver improvements and to lobby on behalf of Staplehurst
- SPC Planning Committee engages with the various authorities relating to drainage and such issues and supporting residents, Councillors attend MBC Planning Committee and Appeals to try to achieve the best outcomes for our residents
- Regularly reviewing our Neighbourhood Plan and updating accordingly

ROAD SAFETY GROUP



Following the 'Stay Safe' exhibition and subsequent national press and local TV coverage, the SPC formed a Road Safety Group to look at all aspects of safety in our community. This group has been busy. We have been working on the Sainsbury's shuttle bus to try and make it more effective for the residents.

'Seasonal weather' potholes continue to be a problem, but if you report them to Kent Highways online, they are usually pretty good at filling them in.

If you know of any RTA's (Road Traffic Accidents) let us know via staplehurstroadinfo@gmail.com . It's useful to build up a picture enabling us to lobby Kent Highways about areas such as the Hawkenbury Bridge. We also have

a Speed Watch Group who are trained to monitor traffic through the village, encouraging everyone to drive safely. Please do contact us if you would be interested in volunteering.

YOUTH CLUB

Staplehurst Youth Club continues to grow. It is open to all aged between 13-17 years and meets 6pm 'till 8pm on Tuesday evenings (7pm - 9pm in the Summer). There is no entrance fee, but all attendees have to be logged in. This is a joint venture by Staplehurst Parish Council and Kent County Council Youth Services.

The evening events include outdoor and indoor games; table football, Wii games, cards, pool and table tennis have been the most popular during the winter, including occasional knock-out tournaments. There are often joint cooking sessions and pasta bakes of various sorts have been particularly popular lately. WI-FI is available on site.

We are also planning other events for young people in the village including a repeat of the summer "Fun Day" at Surrenden Field, open to all ages, which will be held on August 3rd this year. Hundreds of youngsters, toddlers and their parents attended last year. Let's hope for a hot day again.

3G ALL-SPORTS WORKING GROUP

A small team of villagers, including Parish and Borough Cllrs, have been working for some time on bringing forward a proposal for a 3G pitch at Jubilee Field. This would provide an all-weather facility for everyone and make more use of the boggy ground at the back of the field.

This is a complicated process, as the project needs first to be considered by the FA as viable. Then it requires speaking with various funding bodies to see what project they would be most likely to support before liaising with MBC to see what funds are available from village housing.

Potential designs and costings are now being provided so that we can go out to everyone across the village to ensure any redevelopment meets people's needs. We know that we all want to see more facilities in our village so we hope to bring forward a proposal for consultation shortly.

My thanks to all those who give up their time to work on this group, including Nicola Stonebridge and Lee Seal of the Monarchs Football Club - Senior and Junior teams.

We now have a draft document which, with agreement from SPC, will be forwarded to the proposed consultant. SPC have agreed to our request for a Housing Needs Survey as our last one was in 2016, and the world is a different place, so we look forward with interest to the results. The group are looking to a two-day consultation in the autumn for you to view the plan and have your say.
