**The grave of Lt Paul Mervyn Pascall MC, Middlesex Regiment & 1st/2nd King's African Rifles in Dar Es Salaam CWGC War Cemetery**

Paul Pascall died in the East African campaign after a heroic incident where he was commanding his column's Stokes Mortar Battery.

During the heaviest battle of the campaign he remained on his own on the mortar line to face an enemy attack, and fired all his bombs at the enemy. He was covered by a small party of 1st/2nd KAR Askari and he broke up the enemy attack.

He must have been killed or mortally wounded during or just after this incident.

Can any Member advise why he was awarded a Military Cross, reference London Gazette 4th June 1917, page 5483.

His Medal Index Card indicates that he transferred from the Middlesex Regiment to the 2nd West India Regiment, but his headstone details show him as being in the King's African Rifles.
