EXCITING NEWS: we are delighted to announce that we have been awarded a substantial grant by WREN – the organisation which helps fund projects in communities close to landfill sites (www.wren.org.uk). We have been allocated the full amount that we applied for, which puts us in a position to be able to go ahead with developing the proposed play areas on Jubilee Field and The Leys. Hurrah!

WHAT NEXT? The final drawings have been prepared for the sites and are currently out to tender so that we can select the contractors to carry out the work once the quotes have been received.

PLEASE DONATE NOW! Thanks to the support and generosity of many people in our community our local fund-raising total stands at nearly £12,000. To reach our target of £20,000 would be such a reward for everyone who has been involved: meaning that we can turn the full designs into a reality. NEXT PC MEETING

SHAPE SUCCESS

The Parish Council are thrilled to congratulate Clare Rich and members of her senior and junior SHAPE team for their fantastic funding success and we look forward to progressing together plans in the near future, now that we are close to achieving the total required to develop the play areas.

STANTON HARCOURT & SUTTON GIFTED A LIFELINE

The Parish Council are extremely pleased to announce that an anonymous donor has very generously gifted an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) to the Parish Council.

AEDs work by delivering an electric shock to restart a person's heart. The small, portable machines give clear, spoken instructions and are designed to be used by anyone, even without training. They are placed within a secure box in a public area, with a code to access the box that can only be obtained from the ambulance service. When someone goes into cardiac arrest time is of the essence. For every minute that passes where there's no active treatment, the chances of a successful resuscitation reduces by 10%.

AEDs are proven to dramatically increase the chances of survival in the case of cardiac arrest and can be used with no previous instruction or training as the equipment is designed to tell users exactly what to do at the time of use.

In cases of emergency, people should always call 999 in the first instance.

Defibrillators are of vital importance in a rural Parish like ours and this appliance will make our parish one of the safest places to live if you suffer cardiac arrest.

The unit will be located in a central location in the village (in principle, the Village Hall- to be confirmed).

Training will be provided to raise awareness about AEDs and teach local residents how to give initial care should a cardiac arrest occur – dates of training will be publicised when known – please make every effort to attend a session!

WODC LOCAL PLAN CONSULTATION

Further consultation on the emerging West Oxfordshire Local Plan is due to take place shortly, with the consultation period provisionally set as being from Monday **28 July** with the deadline for responses being **Friday 19 September 2014**.

The Plan will address many pertinent issues including:

- Gravel extraction
- Housing
- Highways (ie Sutton Bypass)
- Public Transport
- Amenities...and many more important issues

The Openness of Local Government Regulations 2014

Today Cllr. Hilary Fenton and I become some of the first District Councillors to be affected by legislation that came into force on 8th August that henceforth allows for the live filming, recording, broadcasting, tweeting, etc. direct from the Council Chamber, or meeting room.

Some folks have expressed concern at this new "openness" but for my part I welcome it wholeheartedly. To my mind council meetings that are open to public scrutiny allows the electorate to more easily see and understand all the hard work that Councillors undertake on their behalf.

To open up the town halls right across England to give the man in the street the right to film, blog or tweet at council meetings is very significant in clearly demonstrating an "open community", especially as in the past some councils have infamously preferred meetings to be held in smoke filled rooms, behind closed doors.

I shall be interested to see the new legislation in action for the first time today at our Planning meeting. No doubt there will be a few teething troubles, for example there is to be an area set aside specifically for those wishing to film, positioned so as not to show the faces of members of the public in the audience, but I am sure we will all get used to it soon.

Who knows, perhaps having read this you might consider attending a council meeting sometime and recording it on your iPhone. Sometimes it's dramatic, quite often it can be heated, occasionally it's very funny and, at its best truly gripping stuff that affects us all deeply.

Anyway, I must dash now and get myself along to make-up! Lights, Action, Cameras.


The Page 3 Bird

Recipe of the Month!

Easy Chocolate Cookies

Ingredients:

3oz (85g) Soft Margarine

4oz (113g) Sugar

2oz (57g) Soft Dark Brown Sugar (or whatever you have)

1 Egg (metric or imperial egg will do, let the chicken decide!)

5oz (142g) Self Raising Flour

1oz (28g) Cocoa

4oz (113g) [1 bag] Chocolate drops, chips, bits or chunks!

The Daring Doo!

Get the oven nice and hot beforehand ~180°C / Gas mk 4
Mix the ingredients together one by one in the order above, sieve the dry ingredients if you can be bothered and beat the egg as you put them together.

You should end up with a stiff dough (unless you have a large egg in which case it'll be a bit runny!)

Make the dough into blobs about the size of a golf ball and space out on a greased or lined baking tray (if a bit runny just dollop a spoonful on well spaced out!) you should end up with about a baker's dozen (a dozen plus one for the chef!)

Pop in the hot oven for approximately 11 minutes, until risen but before the edges burn too much, take out and allow to cool (they'll be soft and harden on cooling – if you've done it right they'll end up hard on the outside and a bit gooey on the inside – Yay! Then find someone to share them with!
