On Sunday 13th June, 7 members continued weeding the long border, and planted out cranesbills, osteospermum, pink strawberry and rosemary. Various shrub borders below Woodend were weeded and tidied up and three bags of litter collected.

On Thursday 24th June, 5 members completed the weeding of the long border.

We have a working party this Sunday (4th) and we intend to start with a walk round the park to pinpoint areas we can work on and identify a place where we can put a seat where disabled access would be relatively easy to achieve. We will finish at the shrub borders near the Crescent and work on those.

Last month it was the turn of the shrubs to put on a display. The azaleas have looked spectacular and the weigela and senecio, while not quite as stunning have added splashes of colour throughout the park.

The foxgloves in the Woodend Tower bed seeded themselves into cracks and crevices and have put on an impressive show. The shrub beds, while in need of a tidy up, are very colourful at present. Watch out for the charm of goldfinches that have taken up residence in the gardens.
