PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE

The Parish Council held a meeting in August and appointed two new Councillors. We welcomed Mr. Simon Hulber and Mrs. Samantha Wilkinson, on to the Council, bringing the Council up to its full complement of 11 Councillors.

For your information I have been informed by Rachael Whaites, Countryside Manager for Somerset Council, that on the 11th and 12th of September 2023, there will be a temporary closure of Ham Hill's Lime Kiln car park to allow large plant vehicle access to the site to undertake ground tests for the new Visitor Centre. The company involved has been requested to approach the site via Odcombe, but this is not guaranteed.

At the beginning of September, work will begin on the repair to the windows in Hamdon Youth and Family Centre. Let's hope the weather blesses us with a supporting dry spell!

When walking around the village, several people have mentioned to Councillors that there is quite a lot of overhanging vegetation obstructing public pathways, which is making life difficult for pedestrians. Can residents please ensure that all vegetation is cut back to their boundary lines and not overhanging the pavements. Thank you in anticipation of your cooperation.

It has also been reported that there have been several instances of fly tipping which I have only just become aware of. The Parish Clerk has now reported this to Somerset Council, but if you do happen to see items that have been tipped, then please take a photo of it and send the picture with its precise position to the Clerk.

At the beginning of October, the Parish Council will have a new home which will be at Unit 7, North Street Workshops (slightly delayed due to Duchy Safety Checks). The Community Help Project will also be based there, but the details of this service are continuing to be finalised and will be detailed in the near future.

My personal apologies to anybody who may have sent information to me prior to the appointment of the new Parish Clerk. I am just unearthing some of these messages now.
