The Clerk reported that Patrick Purnell from 7 Beacon Park had made contact to inform the Council of an incident that happened on Monday 4th December 2017 where his motor home was set on fire. The police believe this was a targeted arson with intent to danger life. At the time of speaking to the Clerk, the police had a suspect which is linked to the neighbour at number 8 Beacon Park. Patrick wanted to inform the Councillors in order that the incident was made aware of within the village. The Councillors felt regret that the housing appears to have a change

of allocation as previously allocated to the elderly. The Clerk will send an email to the housing association to express regret in this change of policy and to see if it can be reversed.

1801/11 Members' Questions

Cllr Bennett raised various Highways issues:

Reiterated the issue regarding the curb stone in the layby by Beacon Park which has previously been brought to the attention of Highways

Excess water on Cllr Bennetts land (back lane) following work completed to pipe the water away from the wall at Sowenna, Boyton

Drainage not working by Timber Factory with large water pools. Cllr Bennett has checked the road and advised that the drains are not blocked however since the road has been resurfaced, the drainage is not working how it should be

Cllr Blaney advised that the layby passed the school has large pot holes.

The Clerk will email Highways regarding these issues

1801/12 Public Participation (Standing Orders in abeyance)

It was noted that there is a large Pot Hole on the B3254 outside Bennicott Lake (by the Dog Kennels). There is a warning sign on the Northern approach but not on the Southern approach – this is causing traffic to swerve into the middle of the road.
