Introduction

"Nothing has captured the hearts of city people as much as the brand new hydrotherapy pool."

This was the headline in the Peterborough Evening Telegraph on the opening of St George's Hydrotherapy Pool in 1976 and the sentiment has held true ever since.

Originally a school hydrotherapy pool for children with special educational needs and disabilities, St George's opened to the wider community in 2011 so it could benefit more people. Since then, the fully accessible, warm water pool has delivered improved health and wellbeing to over 4,500 local residents with disabilities and health conditions. It has also brought fun, friendship and joy. This very special facility has enjoyed continued support from the community.

This can be seen by the array of kind messages received when St George's celebrated its 10th birthday as community pool on 23rd March. This was despite the pool being closed owing to the coronavirus pandemic.



However, these are just a small sample of all the people and groups who supported the pool in so many ways over the years. People like the Art and Graphics students at Peterborough Regional College who have so generously given their time and expertise to design this celebration of the St George's years.

The Beginnings

1976

The original hydrotherapy pool opens at the St George's School after two years of fundraising and campaigning across the city. It even featured in The Peterborough Evening Telegraph who wrote "Nothing has captured the hearts of city people as much as the brand new hydrotherapy pool."



Officially Open!



After having making a huge difference for many self-referred patients, in 2012, the pool accepted its first patient funded by the NHS.

2004

The pool remained in constant use until 2004 when the school closed. The pool was then used for respite care.



2009

When the pool closed in 2009, a new campaign began. The community was determined to get a hydrotherapy pool for the city to help all those who need it.



On 23rd March 2011 St George's pool was reopened by the council for the community, a positive result of all the hard work for the city and the community.







2014 brought some tough challenges for the pool. The community campaign to keep the pool open gained 3,600 signatures in just two weeks.





However, the pool pulled through allowing us to host a successful Fundraising Open Day and welcome our 2000th user.


St George's Service Users Rehabilitation Forum (SURF) was changed to St George's Friends and Service Users in 2013. This was so they could better represent the interests of the hydrotherapy pool's customers and raise money to buy vital equipment for the pool making it better for future users.





The team also took part in a sponsored skydive to raise money to buy a defibrillator for the pool.

Community Power!







In 2015 the pool held a second fundraiser which was once again met with overwhelming generosity from the community. This allowed us to continue to provide a vital service to the community and help improve the lives of many people.



Thanks to the work of the fabulous Network team, St George's Community Hydrotherapy Pool had new showers fitted, improving the experience for all users.

2017 was a challenge for the pool and community when the pool developed a leak and had to close temporarily.





However, between Peterborough City Council and The Friends and Service Users, funds were raised to have the pool relined.



Vivacity took over the management of the pool in 2018. Some exciting new classes and sessions were introduced at the pool. When a new poolside hoist was needed, the Vivacity St George's team took part in the Deepings Raft Race to help raise funds. With the generous support of the local community and especially Goldhay Arts we very quickly reached our target and bought a new hoist.

Furthermore, the Friends and Service Users produced their Health, and evaluative Social Return on Investment (SROI) report. This showed the pool delivered £1,5250,000 per year of social-economic value - a return of £16 for every £1.





In 2018, as part of a school project, a group of the pupils of Heltwate St George's School designed and constructed a fabulous new garden area for customers to enjoy.

Not only has the pool helped my well-being. But it is clear that all users benefit.





It gives me the gentle exercise I need to keep as fit as possible. Other exercise classes are too much for me. Hydrotherapy is the only exercise I can manage from which I benefit greatly. The warm water eases joint pain. The aqua fit exercises build muscle strength.



Hydrotherapy provides an opportunity to exercise and improve mobility which "dry land" exercise opportunities do not offer me.

St George's helps me as it helps me relax. I can have a dance in the pool when the music is on too. $^{'}\mathrm{I}$ do have autism so being at St George's swimming pool calms my anxiety.



Hydrotherapy gives my service user a chance to my service user a chance to access a swimming pool in a controlled and an un-overwhelming environment and with a strong staff team with a lot of patience for him. It creates a refaxing environment without the need and stress of rushing about.



Love coming and meeting people, it is relaxing and I feel good afterwards





The social interaction improves mental health.

My son loves coming to St George's because the water is warm and he finds other pool large and intimidating. Having smaller groups has helped him to become more confident in the water. He has a better weekend and copes better at school /more attentive when he has been to St George's.



Since I started attending St George's I have noticed such a reduction in pain.
