<u>Safer Neighbourhood</u> <u>Information</u>

West Mercia Police is appealing to the communities of South Shropshire to remain vigilant following a spate of rural burglaries in the area, which have targeted outbuildings, insecure barns and sheds during the hours of darkness.

Tools, farm machinery, and diesel are just some of the items which have been stolen by the criminals, and Crime Prevention Officers are urging residents to follow these simple security measures in order to reduce the risk towards their property.

- · Ensure that all outbuildings are locked when not in use. Try using weatherproof padlocks and reversing the hinges on shed doors so that they cannot be unscrewed.
- · Ensure tools and machinery are locked away and out of sight when not in use. As well as being at risk of theft, tools can be used to gain access to surrounding buildings.
- · Do not leave keys or valuables in farm vehicles/machinery.
- · Keep gates padlocked shut.
- · Install solar-powered dusk-todawn lighting on outbuildings to deter intruders.
- · Ensure any tools or valuables are security marked and display signs around your property to inform potential thieves.

Sgt Murdoch of the Shropshire
Harm Reduction Team stated "The
police are conducting extra patrols
in these areas to provide
reassurance to the victims and the
communities as a whole. To assist
us in our efforts to apprehend
these criminals I would appeal to
the residents of these

rural areas to be extra vigilant and to report any suspicious activity or vehicles they see to the police" In an emergency call 999, For non-emergencies call 101.

Stockton Parish Council

The Parish Council held their by-monthly meeting on the 6th July 2016 at Norton Village Hall with a full public gallery of twenty plus Parishioners wanting to express their frustration in terms of the continual speeding along the A442. Those present agreed to look at forming a campaign group to keep the pressure on those in authority to reduce the speed of vehicles. The Parish Council continues to play its part and has responded to Shropshire Councils consultation to regularise the speed limits so the Police can better enforce both the 30mph and 40mph speed limit on the road. The A442 will remain as a constant feature of the agenda until resolved with regular feedback from those concerned with the issue.

Cheswardine Lane also featured in the public discussions in terms of the speed at which both delivery vehicles and farm contractor traffic appear to 'wiz' down the lane, it was agreed in the first instance to raise this as a matter of urgency directly with Apley Estate to see what could be done to resolve the speeding matters.

Several Parishioners had contacted the Parish Council to place on record their thanks for the free Queens Birthday Medal, and Parishioners are reminded to return the Smart Water forms to the Village Hall as the Parish Council has only to date received 15% return to date.

Dog fowling around the village and on the football field was discussed. Dog owners are reminded that it is a fineable offence whilst walking a dog not to clear any deposits up and dispose of them in the appropriate way.

The by-monthly report was received on the condition of the Jubilee Play Park, some items of equipment are in need of refurbishment and works will commence over the next few months. The Parish Council agreed to support the Princess Royal Hospital campaign and would encourage Parishioners to do so at **#PRH4Me** campaign.

The Parish Council have also supported the planning application for the development of four older people's properties within Norton. .....FROM the RECTORY

Dear Friends

Congratulations to two local churches - Tong and Boningale - who have received grants for roof repairs from the government scheme. Only 10 churches out of 37 who applied from the Diocese of Lichfield received grants, so to have two in our local area is remarkable.

Sadly Stockton Church was one of the 27 which did not receive a grant. This is the third time that St Chad's Church has been unsuccessful with funding requests for its £100,000 roof repairs project, despite the hard work put into the application by Lord Hamilton and our architect. Ryton Church received a grant from English Heritage four years ago, and the fund raising team ("FOSACRAG" = Friends of St Andrew's Church Ryton and Grindle) have just organised a very successful *Open Gardens* afternoon last month.

We now wait to see what the 'new' government offer by way of grants and funding for historic buildings. All of our six church buildings are 'listed' and therefore deemed to be of historical interest. But there is only so much money available with government cut-backs. Of the Church of England's 16,200 parish churches and 43 cathedrals, 12,500 of these are listed; nearly half of all the country's Grade 1 listed historic buildings are churches or cathedrals. Tong Church and Shifnal Church are both Grade 1 listed, and compared with them our local six parish churches are not so grand nor full of historical features as them.

It is a huge challenge for our small congregations to raise the funds for building repairs. Indeed they are now beginning to struggle with paying all the annual running costs which I outlined in the June newsletter. While there are discussions about toilets and/or kitchenettes being put into our churches (Kemberton is the only one to have a kitchenette, and that was only because it was generously funded by the Eric Lea Trust), the cost of installing such facilities in a listed historic building are high.

Guests for weddings, baptisms and funerals at our churches sometimes need a toilet if they have travelled a distance. So it is understandable that, for other reasons as well, the Church now has fewer special services than in previous years.

This in turn reduces church income, so regular annual costs fall even more heavily on the Sunday service congregations.

The final event of the season was that of Sung Evensong, which many will remember with some fondness from their younger days. This took place at Saint Milburga's, Beckbury on Sunday the 26th June when David Smith a well-known and superb organist from Albrighton joined us. This allowed, Choir Master, Rock Battye to take up the conductor's baton, which he did with his usual enthusiasm. It was with much delight that we also welcomed to the congregation Bob Hodgins, whose idea of a six parishes choir it originally was.

Refreshments were again served giving time for all to socialise afterwards.

The choir together with some spouses and other friends then joined up for a day on the Severn Valley Railway on Monday the 27th June.

This coincided with the WW2 re-enactments that were present at all stations from Bridgnorth to Kidderminster and back. Both lunch and cream tea were very acceptable. A real bonus and a great day out.

The choir now rests until the autumn when rehearsals recommence.

All who may wish to join in the pleasure and satisfaction of singing are most welcome to join.
