## WIDER CHURCH NEWS

#### Her Late Majesty Queen Elizabeth II

Just after publication of our last magazine came the sad death of our Queen on 8 September. In response to many requests, the Sermon given by Catherine on Sunday 18 September follows:-

"That's our Queen!" Shouted my 3 year old son as he saw the photograph that had been placed in memory of Her late Majesty outside his nursery earlier this week.

Queen Elizabeth II is the most recognised face in the whole world. From one small boy in rural England going in to play with friends, to many aged veterans in Australia who fought amongst comrades in the Second World War, to nooks and crannies in all 4 corners of the globe, our late Queen was much loved and she will be much missed.

It hit me, the Queen's death, last Friday morning when I went to pay for some eggs, and looking at the £5 note in my hand I suddenly realised... "she has gone".

I will miss her face, I will miss her hats! I will miss her words of wisdom....

From the very beginning, Princess Elizabeth, guided us as a country, as a nation, as a commonwealth. She showed us the way - the way of HOPE. And showed that way with the beacon that is God.

In her first speech, aged just 14, broadcast as part of Children's hour in 1940, Princess Elizabeth spoke of her love, fellowship and support for others in need. Along with her sister Margaret, Princess Elizabeth's message of hope gave children across the world a sense of support and of love, and that all would one day be well. Her message ended "We know, every one of us, that in the end all will be well; for God will care for us and give us victory and peace. And when peace comes, remember it will be for us, the children of today, to make the world of tomorrow a better and happier place."

That was our Queen! And God DID care for us and give us victory!

On her 21st birthday, Princess Elizabeth vowed, in a wireless broadcast from South Africa, that "I declare before you all that my whole life whether it be long or short shall be devoted to your service". As the Poet Laureate Simon Armitage's new poem quotes, this was "A promise made and kept for life". That was OUR Queen's gift to us.

More subtly though, she quoted William Pitt "that England had saved herself by her exertions and would save Europe by her example". More subtle, because Queen Elizabeth was to make it her **own** life's exertion to be **our** example, and by God's grace, in comparison to the terrible political turmoil around the world, to the end of her reign this country really has been saved. She finished by saying "God help me to make good my vow, and **God bless all of you who are willing to share in it."** 

Oh and Christmas!!

I loved our Queen's Christmas messages; messages full of subtle Christianity, of love for one another and for all people. Gentle sermons from the head of our church, never mind the Christmas pudding, it was our Queen's words that fed us on Christmas afternoons.

My favourite speech that Her late Majesty gave to us was from only a couple of years ago. During the Covid pandemic Queen Elizabeth II again showed us the way, the way of hope. Inspiring us to stay strong, reminding us that "we will be with our friends again; we will be with our families again; we will meet again."

Firm in her faith from 14 to 96, the Queen's life was an example of Christian Discipleship. Hers was a life rooted in the Hope of Christ. In our reading from the book of Revelation today we hear a message of Hope. Of God being and living amongst us mortals, of God making all things new. Reminding us of the hope we find in Christ, that we can trust that we are all beloved children of God.

Her late Majesty's Christian faith was at the heart of all she did. Her faith strengthened her, guided her and inspired her. And we all received the benefits of her faith, of her dedication to love others and help us to be the people God created us to be - Our Queen was a Queen of Hope. In those hope filled words of Christ's, as we hear in St John's gospel "Do not let your hearts be troubled. You believe in God; believe also in me."

#### Our Queen Has Died.

For seventy long years, Elizabeth II served us as Queen. For 96 years she was a child of God here on earth. And now she reigns in heaven with all those who have gone before us in faith. In the same year that we celebrated Her late Majesty's Platinum Jubilee, in the same year that we finally found out what she keeps in her handbag (thank you Paddington!), in the same year that we have a new King. To continue her legacy of living lives of loving service for others is to honour Queen Elizabeth's life, and to honour God. Aged only 14, she asked us to build a better and happier world for the children of tomorrow; a message that is absolutely as relevant today.

Today, a new era, with a new King - Queen Elizabeth II's son, King Charles III.

We know that our Queen would want us to go forward into the future with faith and with hope. She would want us to continue to follow her example of wisdom, of tradition, of the pride in our faith that brings communities together, the pride that breaks down the barriers of this world and brings forth the best and happiest years to come. In Her late Majesty's own words "The pride in who we are is **not** a part of our past, it defines our **present** and our **future**."

With our late Queen's image in our minds, and her life in our hearts, her legacy of building God's Kingdom here on earth passes to us - all of us. May God guide her son, her successor, such that he also inspires us to greatness, and to another 70 years of safety, peace and grace, where my son's own children will point with pride at posters with HIS face on it and say "that's our King!". Amen.

The last few weeks have given us some spectacular sunsets spreading all around from the northwest to the southwest of the Malvern Hills.


Normal second Sunday monthly services continue and we look forward to our first Christmas Eve Carol Service for three years.
