#### DENYSE COLE 27 September 1948 – 26 November 2021

#### **REST IN PEACE**

It is with great sadness that we have to report that our Editor, Denyse Cole, passed away on Friday 26 November. She will be greatly missed by her family and many in the village.

After leaving school Denyse began nursing, but then turned to journalism for a living, working with a local paper in Canterbury. As her children were growing up she took a diploma in horticulture, which led on to a career in teaching, first at The Royal School for Deaf Children in Margate, then at Thanet College, where she taught for many years.

It was after her retirement that Denyse took on the editorship of Monkton News, which she continued for twelve years, right up until a few days before her death.

Denyse came to Monkton over 40 years ago and was always involved in village life, acquiring a vast amount of knowledge of the history of the village and the surrounding area. Her interest in gardening led to her becoming Secretary of Minster and Monkton Horticultural Society, a post that she held for 25 years. She was also one of the gardeners to open their gardens to the public during the very first Open Gardens in 1992.

Denyse was also a loyal church-goer and was a member of the Parochial Church Council of Monkton Church before she became Churchwarden several years ago. This was a duty that she took particularly seriously and was always in attendance at weddings, christenings and funerals. One of her real pleasures was arranging the church flowers, which she did with great skill.

She was a much respected member of our village community and her knowledge and expertise will be sorely missed. She never did write the book about the village that her friends urged her to do!

St Mary Magdalene Church was packed on Friday, 17 December, for the funeral of Denyse Cole. She had fought consistently against the cancer which was first diagnosed in the Spring of 2021 and, despite the enervating effects of chemotherapy she remained active and in good spirits up to the last. One of her last acts was to get the December edition of "Monkton News" off to the printer.

Denyse had served as co-editor of this magazine, with Davina Ransom, since 2009, taking over as Editor in July 2014. We are grateful to Davina for quickly stepping in to produce this February edition of the "News" and are sorry that, in the circumstances, it was not possible to produce a January edition.

Denyse had lived in Monkton for over forty years, starting her married life here, raising her two children, Chris and Lotte, and eventually meeting her partner, David Blackwell. More recently, she rejoiced in spending time with her first grandchild, Theo. A loyal member of Monkton Church, where she regularly arranged the flowers, Denyse was appointed a churchwarden in 2015. She proved a real source of strength and wisdom, particularly with regard to the problems experienced with the new works in the church, completed in 2019. We shall miss her much.

### **OBITUARY**

#### **DOREEN DAW - 1934-2021**

Another well-known former resident of Monkton passed away in December. Her son, Colin, has given us a glimpse into her varied life.

"Mum was born in Bridge in 1934, one of five children who grew up on a farm. She moved to Monkton in the late 1950s and by the end of the 60s she had taken on the role of lollipop lady followed shortly after by the caretaker's role. Bringing up four boys on her own, she also fostered/looked after many more. Other jobs followed; she worked on Fullers, Baxters and Smiths farms, turkey plucking at Monkton Court Farm in the winter evenings. She also helped around the village tending to the churchyard with friends in what spare time she had. In later years she worked in The White Stag, the Foxhunter kitchen and the one at Ursuline college.

Chickens were always in the garden with the eggs sold around the village. There were also plenty of cakes being made and decorated in the kitchen and catering for parties being done with her friends Brenda and Eileen.

Mum retired from school in 1998 and always missed the children. In 2007 mum moved to Minster, still keeping busy with making pickles raising money for The Pilgrims Hospice and always proud of her front garden winning many prizes at The Flower Show.

Even up to last year she would sit in her chair and say she wished she could go back to work!"

#### Covid-19 VACCINATION PROGRAMME - UPDATE IMPORTANT INFORMATION- NEW VACCINE CENTRE

With the closure of the SAGA building in Westwood Cross, it has been necessary to relocate the Vaccine Centre which is now located adjacent to "Wickes Building Supplies" and "Curry's Electrical Store" and will be called <u>"Thanet (Broadstairs)</u> <u>Vaccination Service (LVS)</u>. Once again there will be plenty of car parking on site and it is on various bus routes, AND WILL BE OPEN EVERY Tuesday, Thursday AND Saturday From 8am to 5pm.

Covid cases in Thanet are still worryingly high, especially in schools where coughs and colds are quite prevalent. There is no shortage of vaccines, so if you are not fully jabbed or even double jabbed, get your Vaccination now- no need for an appointment just Drop-In!

#### So who's eligible?

\* Booster Jabs are now available for everyone over 18 but please remember there must be 3 months since your second vaccination.\_\*Older teens aged 16-17 are now eligible for a second dose but must be at least 12 weeks after their first and then likewise for their booster jab \* Those aged 12-15 are now also eligible for a second dose after 12 weeks.

Not had yours yet? There are still many patients who are unvaccinated and many others who have not yet had their second vaccine. So don't wait until it's too late! You can still get seriously ill with Covid or worse infect others!

#### NATURE NOTES FROM CLIVE NUTTMAN

In the coming weeks, as the days get longer and the temperature rises, some of our most charismatic insects will begin to emerge from their over-wintering sites; the much-loved ladybirds will be amongst

them. These colourful little creatures are familiar to everyone and although often referred to as a 'bug' (the American name is 'ladybug'), they are actually beetles and their varied lifestyles and life cycles are very well studied and offer some fascinating snippets of natural history. Ladybirds get their name from Our Lady, the Virgin Mary who was usually depicted in a red cloak in paintings and other imagery; roughly half of Britain's 50+ ladybird species have predominantly red colouration.

Generally, ladybirds are 'helpful' to us; the great majority are carnivorous and the preferred prey is predominantly aphids for many species, some only feeding on a particular type of aphid. Other prey items include other beetle larvae and scale insects while a small number of species are not carnivorous, feeding on specific plants and moulds (a sort of fungus). The help comes in the control of aphids that can do serious damage to plants as the keen gardener will attest. Aphids feed by inserting their mouthparts into the tissues of plant stems and feeding on the sugary products of photosynthesis and the loss of these important building blocks can lead to deformed growth and weakened plants. An individual ladybird – whether adult or the larval stage – can consume 50 aphids a day, a great benefit to gardener and farmer alike; in addition to spoiling garden arrays, aphids can have severe impacts on pea, wheat and potato crops.

Fortunately, ladybirds themselves seem to suffer low levels of predation by other organisms. One factor is their unpleasant taste and it is often the case that bright coloration, especially red, yellow and orange in combination with black, is an indicator or warning colour that helps to ward off would be attackers (although some birds, spiders and ants have learnt to cope with this defence). A direct defence when disturbed is the excretion of a yellowish liquid called reflex blood; this is foul-smelling and has a bitter taste to predators.

A major threat to our ladybirds comes from one of their own kind. In October 2004, the first harlequin ladybird in Britain was found in a pub garden in Essex; this species is described as the most invasive ladybird on earth and has been a harbinger of doom for native ladybirds. A species is deemed 'invasive' if it causes economic or environmental harm if introduced to a new ecosystem; the harlequin was native to Asia but was used extensively by crop growers in Europe for 'biocontrol', to counter aphids that were damaging crop yields. Unfortunately, harlequins are not fussy eaters and developed a taste for aphids away from crops as well as other prey, including other ladybirds! The species has spread rapidly and is now one of the commonest ladybirds have suffered disproportionately, with decreases in the numbers of 2-, 7- and10-spot ladybirds being greatest. Perhaps the harlequin ladybird itself might be controlled by a further introduced species but we should be careful what we wish for!




