Community Hall

It's been a long time coming but the Parish Council wants to get started on developing a Village Hall. The location is to be on the site of the Salto Car Park at the Tesco end. Salto are now able to sub-let the piece of ground (which had been the sticking point) and bilateral discussions are about to take place. Before we go further, it is important to confirm that we still have a mandate from residents for this venture so could you please complete the short questionnaire at Page 4.

Communications

We are not unique but some other parishes seem to have developed a much more informative and dynamic website incorporating Parish Council and Community news/views. Where successful these sites tend to have a **Webmaster**, someone who manages, controls and develops the website – adds the bells and whistles. Charlton Village Community Day - 19 September

Despite the gradual easing of COVID-19 restrictions, we have been forced to cancel the traditional village fete at Charlton Lakes for this year. Instead, it has been proposed that we keep the date and have a Community Street Party event, encouraging all streets (or areas) to run their own event but with some optional unifying themes and competitions (art, cake decorating, floral decoration etc). We would adopt the social distancing guidelines in place on the day and yet still have some fun! The detail is still being worked out but we need an indication of how many streets/areas would be interested. So if your street/area has already decided to take part or if you are a possible, could please fill in the sheet at page 4. This would be in addition to Charlton having a Christmas Market – see below.

A Charlton Christmas Market?

With the Charlton Community Day cancelled for this year, it has been suggested that we put on a Christmas Market/Fair this year. The church normally have a Christmas Fayre and the idea is to

expand on this with stalls outside that will spread from the church, go over the road and join up with the Royal Oak or at least into their car park, subject to their approval of course. We would ask for the road to be closed for the few hours of the market which would be timed so that at least part of it will take place in the dark. There could be a village-wide Christmas lights competition to coincide with it, carol singing, food, games for the children, Father Christmas(?) and much more. In fact, a whole community event. The Community Day was very well supported and enjoyed last year and, because of the coronavirus restrictions, we have not been able to repeat it as last year but this could be a good alternative. My latest information from Test Valley is encouraging:

- Ecology survey works have been completed and report is in hand.
- Bridge has been ordered. We are awaiting final construction details before signing off for manufacture.
- Drawings for the path have been completed and are out to tender
- Environment Agency permit will be submitted shortly

Much of the consultation design work and has been completed and once started it shouldn't take too long to complete.
