



Grafty Geeks – Printing from the iPad

In order to print from applications such as email, photos and the internet, iPads use AirPrint to print wirelessly to Wi-Fi enabled printers.



You will need:

- Wi-Fi network connected on the iPad
- Wi-Fi enabled printer, which needs to be connected to the Wi-Fi network
(This is usually a button on the printer with the Wi-Fi  symbol)
- The iPad and the printer must be on the same Wi-Fi network

AirPrint allows you to select any printer that is on the same network as the iPad, but you **MUST** make sure that the printer Wi-Fi is set up for the same Wi-Fi network, this is usually the one you have set up for general use at home. It is possible to change the Wi-Fi network on the iPad if you are visiting friends or family by using their Wi-Fi network and a Wi-Fi enabled printer.

Once printers have been set up they will be available for printing all types of documents, emails or web pages. All you need to do is go to the documents or pages you wish to print, select the print menu, confirm options, then select print, for example:

Emails: Open the email you wish to print; there is a small arrow in the top-right corner which will display the menu with print options, select the print options required, then select Print.



Google Docs: Open the document you wish to print. In the top-right corner of the document you will see an information symbol. This displays the Details menu; select the Printer icon which will open a new screen to select a printer, select the options required, then select Print.



Google Sheets: The print option is found in the Share and export menu, which is available when pressing the three small dots in the top-right corner, then continue as before.

The key is to find the printer options in the applications you are using, once the printer is set up via **AirPrint** it will be available to use with those applications.

Grafty Gourmet

This is a great but simple recipe, ideal for these cold winter nights. Best made a day ahead and reheated as the flavours develop a lot more.

Simple Guinness and Beef Stew

25 g butter	400 g wild mushrooms
150 g bacon (chopped)	1 litre of Guinness
300 g shallots (sliced)	1 bouquet garni
1 kg stewing beef	

1. Preheat the oven to 160C/140C (fan oven). Put the butter in a frying pan over a medium heat. When the butter has melted add the bacon, followed by the shallots. Cook until golden brown and transfer to a large casserole dish.
2. Add the beef to the frying pan, season with salt and pepper and cook until browned all over. Transfer to the casserole dish. Add the mushrooms to the pan and cook for 2 minutes. Season to taste and transfer to the casserole dish.
3. Return the frying pan to the heat and use a whisk to scrape off all the bits stuck to the bottom of the pan (this is where the flavour is). Pour in the Guinness and continue to whisk for another minute to deglaze the pan. Pour the Guinness and pan juices over the beef and vegetables in the casserole dish. Add the bouquet garni, cover the casserole dish and cook in the oven for 2 hours.
4. When the beef is tender, check the seasoning, remove the bouquet garni and serve with roast potatoes.

Christian Message February 2015

I was reading the New Daylight daily Bible notes recently and was fascinated, and rather alarmed, by the phrase divided-soul found in James 1:8 and 4:8.

The idea of being double-minded is one I can identify with: How often do I fret that I have too much work to do either for my paid employment or college, or too much housework and gardening to conquer and yet, there always seems to be time for another cup of tea, another episode of a favourite television programme, another soak in the bath or another evening out with friends. Asking around about other people's interpretation of the divided-soul, one friend admitted to losing hours on Facebook but merely 'keeping to time' when reading the Bible. Oh dear, I can identify with that one too!

Another friend, when asked about the passage, had a quite different sense of it meaning doing several things at once and cited praying for other road users whilst riding her bike and listening to music. Such a lovely, positive, interpretation; and such a lovely, positive, thing for her to be doing.

So what did James mean by this phrase?

James 4 Verse 8: " Draw near to God, and he will draw near to you. Cleanse your hands, you sinners, and purify your hearts, you double-minded".

"Draw near to God and he will draw near to you"...

That seems straight forward enough. If we invest time in other people our relationship with them will blossom, so it makes sense that if we invest time in God our relationship with him will bloom and grow.

.."Cleanse your hands, you sinners,"...

It is important to seek forgiveness for the wrong things we do and try to do right.

.."and purify your hearts, you double-minded".

I am sure we can all remember times when someone has let us down and said sorry, only to let us down again. I am sure we are all double-minded at times but it is important to really want to change from within and be single-minded in our faith.

James 1 verse 8 is stern: "for the doubter, being double-minded and unstable in every way, must not expect to receive anything from the Lord."

Here, James is implying that unless we believe and practice what we preach, then we will not receive God's blessings. A sobering thought, but turned on its head, if we do ask Jesus into our lives, repent of our sins and try to live our lives according to His will, the blessings we will receive will be infinite and ever-lasting. A really exciting and attractive challenge...
