FROM THE VICAR

Dear friends

I'm writing this on Valentine's Day – Friday 14th February. Some of you may know that Valentine's Day is a bitter-sweet celebration for me, as my mum died in a road traffic accident on this day in 2005. This year, the anniversary has been weighing on my mind more than usual – possibly partly because of the round number (20 years), but I think, also, because of my shifting gender identity.

I am a little sad that my mum never got to know me as 'Tom' – though several friends have reassured me that she probably had some idea of my true identity or, at least, wouldn't be particularly surprised by my discovery that I am Tom.

On Valentine's Day, many of us celebrate love. For couples, this might be romantic love. For those who are single, divorced or widowed, I believe that self-love and self-care are particularly important on this day. I also firmly believe that all of us – regardless of relationship status – should strive to love our neighbours, and be kind to everyone we meet.

This morning, I had the privilege of presiding at an early morning Eucharist, in the Edward King Chapel at the College. It was exactly where I needed to be, on a day which I knew would contain a mixture of emotions, when my mum's death, and my sense of loss, would contend with my desire to celebrate the love which Martin and I continue to share for one another.

During the service, I read out a passage about St Valentine's Day, including the words: "For Christians, this day marks an acknowledgement of an all-loving God who blesses those who love one another, as Jesus implored his own disciples to do." We are called to love one another, not only on Valentine's Day, but 365 days a year.

Yesterday, many from the village gathered in All Saints Church, and later in the college, to give thanks for the life of Mary Palmer. We listened to the well-known passage from 1 Corinthians 13 – about the supreme importance of love; and I reflected, in my sermon, on how Mary embodied love and kindness, and set a positive example for us all.

Perhaps those of us who knew Mary could strive to follow her example, and love and be kind to one another, despite differences?

As part of my ministerial development and ongoing theological reflection and learning, I have been reflecting recently on my identity; on why God called me to be a priest; why God called me to be Vicar of Cuddesdon, Garsington and Horspath; and what my priorities should be during this time of transition.

During the ordination service, priests are reminded that they are called, "With all God's people ... to tell the story of God's love," so one of the reasons God has called me to be a priest, and to be your Vicar, is to tell the story of God's love to the people of Cuddesdon, Denton, Garsington and Horspath.

I wonder if God also called me – Tom – here to cause the people of these parishes to reflect more deeply on that story of God's love: to challenge assumptions, and cause us to consider important questions of identity – what does it mean to be a Christian, and a priest, and a Vicar, and a Trans-man? Can one be all of these things? What does it mean to be made male and female, and to be made in the image of God? Does God's love have limits? Does God exclude anyone from his/their love, or is God's love unconditional? How does God call us to respond to those with whom we fundamentally disagree; and whose very existence challenges our beliefs and values? How does God call us to respond to those whom we find it difficult to love?

These are challenging questions, and I suspect we may never reach agreement on the answers. Nevertheless, I still firmly believe that God called me to be a priest, and to be your Vicar, and I still count it an immense (though often challenging) privilege to be Vicar of Cuddesdon, Garsington and Horspath.

FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL CHAIRMAN

Dear Parishioners,

I hope everyone is well. Lots to report this month, starting with the sad news that our new Parish Clerk is stepping down. Dee has agreed to continue to help with payments while we look for somebody to fill the role. If you would like to apply for this, please use the Parish Council email address below. This is a paid role.

We are also looking for a new councillor to join the team which will be done by co-option after no election was triggered. We are hoping to do this at the April meeting and so if you're interested in helping the community then please apply in writing by 24th March to the Parish Council email address. This is a voluntary role.

In the meantime, we're all concerned about the worrying amount of power cuts we've been experiencing and we'll discuss this at the next meeting. We'll see whether our MP or our elected County and District Councillors can bring any weight to bear too.

At the last Parish Council meeting, a number of issues raised by members of the community were discussed and you will be able to read the outcomes in the Parish Council minutes, which will be put on the parish website. With no clerk, this may take a little longer than normal. So here is a precis:

DISABLED PARKING ON THE HIGH STREET

We are very sympathetic to those who need this but we can't see that it's wise to sacrifice two regular spaces at the moment. We will however look to ensure that the parking authorities do pass our way to check that nobody without a Blue Badge uses the existing space outside the Village Hall. They do have the power to issue tickets. We also hope that everyone organising events encourages people to give lifts to those who need it, so that they don't have to miss events due to parking worries.

SPEEDING

We conducted a traffic survey last year at the Wheatley entrance to the village which showed that the vast majority of drivers were not speeding, and a small number of very irresponsible drivers ignore any limits. We will initially look into adding “countdown” strips on the approach to Parkside after other ideas such as white village gates and electronic signs were found to be prohibitively expensive.

POTHOLES

Unfortunately, as far as Highways are concerned there are no ‘official’ lay-bys on the Mill Road and so they won’t help. David Keene has kindly put scalplings into the passing places a number of months ago and we’ll need to do this again at some point. And, in terms of other potholes, please do report them on fixmystreet.oxfordshire.gov.uk as the more reports the better.

DOG FOULING

We discussed parishioners concerns about dog fouling on the Recreation Ground and it was decided that we would start with signage to remind people to pick up after their dogs. We are concerned about the expense and practicality of fencing, given the extent of the play area. There was also a thought, from some, that much of the mess was likely to be foxes, which would jump the fence anyway. We do ask that all dog owners act responsibly so that we don’t have to revert to dogs on leads on the Recreation Ground. We will keep an eye on this issue.

Apologies that this report isn’t filled with much cheery news but I do hope that we head into the spring with more positivity.

MORLAND HOUSE SURGERY



In December 2024, Nollag McGrath, the MHS Practice Manager Partner, made a presentation to the Wheatley Society on some of the changes taking place at the Morland House Surgery. Below is a short summary.

EVOLVING CLINICAL ROLES

In 2019 the NHS formed Primary Care Networks (PCNs). Morland House Surgery is now part of the Thame PCN, along with the Rycote Practice and the Chiltern & The Brook Surgeries. The PCN has been expanding its clinical team, bringing new benefits and better care to patients and relieving pressure on GPs. MHS now has two clinical pharmacists, one pharmacy technician, two social prescribers, two care coordinators and one paramedic. The role of each team is as follows:

Pharmacy Team: Medication queries and advice; carrying out annual medication reviews; providing medication advice to GPs; carrying out mandated audits; and quality improvement projects.

Social Prescribing Team: Helping to identify practical, social and emotional needs affecting health and wellbeing; linking people to existing community resources, particularly people with one or more long term conditions, and those who need support with low level mental health issues, are lonely or isolated and have complex social needs which affect their wellbeing.

Paramedic Sees various conditions and issues e.g. rashes, chest infections, lumps, migraines, general pains, and high heart rate and wound issues. Also carries out home visits ahead of a GP visit to take vitals and history.

EMBRACING TECHNOLOGY

MHS has been introducing new technology channels for patients to contact the surgery.

The new digital telephone system offers more lines, no engaged tone, call queueing, a call back service, patient recognition and connection with the clinical system and call recording.

eConsult can carry out a free online consultation via the internet at anytime from anywhere for a health issue. Visit www.morland-house.co.uk, click 'Contact us online', complete the questionnaire and submit. Your eConsult will be viewed by a clinician and you will be contacted before the end of the following working day with the next steps.

Contact MHS via the NHS App which is a free, secure tool that allows patients (aged 13+) to access NHS services on their smartphone or tablet. You can book appointments, order repeat prescriptions, choose which pharmacy to collect from, view your GP patient health record, view messages from MHS, register your organ donation decision, choose how NHS uses your data, etc.

Use NHS 111 online to get instant advice or medical help near you.

Other Technology Advancements are text messaging and emails, and text invitations to book appointments.






