

1653. John Robson of Kirk Andrews was buying up lands & houses
May a boat of water at Crago. He died in 1675 his son of
the same name, he too bought Kirk Andrews & land in Crago
& an inclosure on the common allotted him by his neighbours
in exchange for his common rights. He died in 1710 leaving
Elizabeth his widow & 3 daughters who inherited.

1658 Elizabeth Burton relict of Edward Burton of Kirk Andrews
sells land to John Robson yeoman, he hath granted (him)
all that lies a cre of arable land ... in the fields of
Kirk Andrews in severall places halfe acre lying in Gully
-lands adjoining to the lands of Wm Threlkeld on the
east and John Hodgson of Swinfield and Edwin his wife
on the west, Two roods on the Milling side adjoining Stephen
Robson on the east & Wm Burton on the west
The other rood lying on the Brae Crag to Stephen Robson
Elizabeth Burton mark B. Robson mark T Edward Robson. E

March 6. 1666. Bond of Thomas Robson of Kirk Andrews yeoman in
£40 to Robert Robson of the same yeoman, on an indenture of sale
of one cottage & an acre arable, and house in Kirk Andrews
T Robson signs with his mark & hand. witnesses.

Dec. 22 1792 Jane Willis of Carlisle, widow, sells to
Musgrave Lewthwaite of Carlisle merchant for £16
a freehold house with byre and ground used as a
Dungstall at the end of such byre, & ground on the
Opposite side of the road used for setting & staking Turves
& Peats at Kirk Andrews witnesses
