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Halam's 'Thousand Year Bell'

There are two bells in the church tower; the largest was originally inscribed: "God save his church. W. Redman, 1722". This bell was cracked prior to 1965 when Taylor's of Loughborough rehung the bells and recast the 1722 bell. The inscription now reads, "Recast in 1965 in memory of Sir Stephen and Lady Gibson of Manor Farm, also in memory of George Gibson 1868-1961." The bell on the right in the photograph is Norman and is rather picturesquely called 'the bell of a thousand years'. In 1903 The Rev Canon Raven in 'Nottingham Notes & Queries' described it as "rather conical with flat edge, surmounted with six cannons forming a sort of crown, and is a regular petasus." Two narrow bands with ridges encircle it. It is said to be the Sanctus bell which has rung since Plantagenet times. The clock mechanism was attached to it prior to 1965, but now strikes on the 1722 bell. The bells originally hung on wooden beams replaced by steel girders in 1965.

The following article, (provided by Tony Denyer), found in 'The Daily Mail' last year, posed this question and reply:

"Is the 1000 year old Norman Bell in the church of St Michael, Halam, near Southwell, the oldest in Britain?

The oldest tower bell in Britain is one of 50kg at St Botolph, Hardham, West Sussex, still in use and dates from around 1100. The church of St Michael in Halam was completed in the 12th century so it is doubtful that its bell is older than that at St Botolph. Britain's oldest inscribed bell is the Gargate Bell at Caversfield Church, Oxfordshire, named in honour of Hugh and Sibilla Gargate and dating from 1219. A fragile hand bell known as the Iron Bell of St Patrick is dated AD450 and held in Dublin. But the oldest bell in the world is the tintinnabulum in the Babylonian palace of Nimrud, which dates from around 1100BC. The oldest known tower bell is one in Pisa, Italy, dated 1106."

Notice Board and Litter Bins: After site inspection, agreed to mount notice board on verge at church; bus company to be approached re litter bin on bus post at school.

<u>Matters Arising</u>: Hedge on Halam Hill has been cut; clerk to investigate visibility further & if appropriate contact C.C.

Footpaths: 1. C.C. proposal to extend the footpath along St. Helen's Lane to the end of lane - No objection, but write requesting clear signage for the path. 2. Footpath No. 1 – formal notification received regarding diversion.

Open Meeting: Matters raised: 1) Independence needed in preparing village hall feasibility study 2) Length of time taken to get this on P.C. agenda 3) St. Helen's Lane footpath and way marking.

Footpath Group: Many thanks to the footpath group for their hard work surveying footpaths and providing excellent information for the Parish Partnership Scheme; agreed to sign Halam up for PP scheme.

Planning: <u>1. Retention of buildings in paddock & play</u> <u>equipment: Littledale, Mansfield Road</u> – no objection, but comment added - D.C. should clarify what actions need planning permission. 2. <u>Conservatory, Maythorne House,</u> <u>Manor Fields</u> – passed. 3. <u>Planning Decision</u> – Double garage, Ashcroft, Gray Lane: permission refused by D.C.

Finance: Internal Audit: report discussed. No indication of any major problems or shortcomings, but clerk and auditor to discuss areas of improvements & report back to the P.C. Annual Return was signed with minor qualifications. Resolved to pay: village hall cleaners; auditor's fees (2003/04); petty cash (NALC posters). New bank mandates signed to have access to P.C. financial information & allow clerk to monitor bank accounts.

Speed limit/slow markings on Radley Road at Manor Stables – Motion to drop request to NCC for these; 3 for, 3 against - Chairman used casting vote to ask the C.C. to go ahead with these. 2. 30mph limit to be extended further up Halam Hill. 3. Phone Box – conversion to "cashless payment only". PC to write expressing concerns & ask that present coin box be retained. 4. Letter received re slow progress and state of building on Back Lane, including vermin. PC to write to D.C. expressing concerns of residents. 5. RCC AGM 17 October, 7pm in Council Chamber, Gedling Borough Council Offices. 6. Best Kept Village – Halam one of 5 finalists in second round; Judging: 16 July to 5 August

Parish Funded Police Community Support Officer (PCSO): Elston Parish are interested in sharing a PCSO costings requested. D.C., Chief Superintendent Johnson to be invited to Sept/Oct meeting to discuss this. Halam Beat Officer also to be invited re general Halam policing.

Trafalgar Weekend (21– 23 October 2005): Further information to be obtained for next meeting.

<u>New Village Hall – Feasibility Study Draft</u> discussed. A village hall, open space and 4/ 5 houses on the site are proposed. Any scheme would be approached through the D.C.'s Local Development Framework review with local

consultation and parish input. Timescale could be through to 2008. Outline planning will cost approx. \pounds 3,500 to \pounds 4,000. Further information requested from architect & planning consultant – more detailed costing figures; outline plan drawings; access details: highways consultants – to discuss at next P.C. meeting.

Charity Cycle Ride



Church Cleaning Rota



It is approaching that time of year again when our summer bird visitors are preparing to leave. I've not seen a Swift around recently and Swallows and House Martins seem to be congregating on the wires. This year we've heard more Turtle Doves around the village than ever before. Their constant "turrr turrr turrr" sound has even become a bit monotonous at times, yet I was sad not to hear many in 2004! There have been reports of Spotted Flycatchers again this year in some gardens, flitting in & out to catch a fly in the air. Compared to the Common Whitethroat with its scratchy song, the Lesser Whitethroat is a bird that I always struggle to notice, but we've heard one this year on Gray Lane. These will all be leaving soon, but keep a look-out in autumn for the arrival of winter visitors including Fieldfare & Redwing - a sure sign winter is round the corner! - Elaine Gathercole

Parish Paths Partnership Update



In the course of distributing these letters some farmers gave me examples of members of the public, including people from Halam, who are straying from the right of way onto private land. Please help the farming community by sticking to the right of way network and do not divert into other areas, whether they have crops in or not. 



Parish Council Meeting: 8 September 2005

Present: S. Bust, A. Fraser (arrived 7.30), N. Armstrong, G. Herbert, A. Paris & I. Sharman; <u>Apologies</u>, D. Parrish Local Beat Officer: PC Whyke, our Beat Officer based at Blidworth station, outlined the present police coverage of Halam & answered questions re general policing.

<u>Matters Arising</u>: Ian Sharman asked for confirmation that the P.C. were not instigators of the request for the footpath condition to be placed on the golf course planning application. It was confirmed that this condition had come originally from D.C.

<u>Parish Plan</u>: Progress against plan reviewed; Agreed st up a Parish Working Group to consider planning /development issues in Halam including village envelope; protecting village character; important open spaces in the village; sympathetic design of new building. Those interested in joining this group - contact the Clerk.

<u>Trafalgar Weekend (21 – 23 October 2005)</u>: Possible celebrations discussed – beacon(s), BBQ/hog roast – events committee to come up with proposals. Commemoration Service - GH to be speak to the Dean

Harvest Supper: Saturday 8th October in the village hall. Guest speaker arranged. Will at the Waggon & Horses is investigating licence. Raffle, games, food & publicity being arranged by Marina Thompson & Julie Paris; Possible flag competition to be held.

<u>Conversion of Traditional Rural Buildings</u>: Agreed to write to the D.C. to emphasis need for adequate parking attached to any rural building conversion to ensure no increase in congestion/parking problems in rural villages.

<u>Notice Board</u>: Agreed this should have three sections – parish council/general village use/map. Building Better Communities funding may be available to fund a sign as costs are likely to be over £1,000. This may delay the project while the application is processed and would have to be part of a larger project, possibly including new village signs as well. It was agreed to investigate this funding opportunity further.

<u>Road Markings</u>: C.C. have written to inform the parish council that the 30mph speed limit is to be moved further up Halam Hill (to the Southwell side of the Old Vicarage). It was resolved to write to the CC requesting clarification as to whether street lighting is to be extended also, and to request that the separate 'Halam' signs are retained rather than new signs incorporated into 30mph signs.

<u>Open Meeting</u>: Peter Thompson raised the issue of insurance for any Trafalgar bonfire/beacon; Agreed this should be through the P.C. – Clerk to investigate.




Village 'Tramp'



The 'Adam & Eve' Window in Halam Church

Nicholas Pevsner in his book 'The Buildings of England: Nottinghamshire' writes of Halam Church: "In the tracery lights of a north chancel window, four good complete 14th century figures: St Christopher, St Blaise, Adam naked and delving, Eve naked and spinning."

This window was recently carefully restored in The Barley Studios, York, reset, and rededicated at a service in June this year. It is one of the most complete pieces of mediaeval glass in Nottinghamshire, and is very beautiful. St Christopher, patron saint of travellers, carries the Christ child and holds a two-pronged spear with a fish speared on the end. He is in the panel above Adam who is digging with a spade. St Blaise, patron saint of wild animals, stands with a golden crosier in his hand; at his feet is a hog with a bone in its mouth. He was a bishop who was martyred in the 4th century. He is in the panel above Eve who holds a distaff and shuttle. On the outside of the church on this window are the carved heads of two laughing faces. It is really worth taking the time to go and look, as I can only reproduce this lovely photograph in black & white! More information about Halam Church windows can be found on the website:

PC Lindsey Whyke, our Beat Manager based at Blidworth, raised the following points at the September Parish Council meeting:-


- 999 response to Halam would be covered from Southwell or Halam and should be prompt

Realising an Education Dream in Southwell

It has been a long held dream for all involved with The Minster School, to have a single site school with state of the art facilities. That dream is just about to become a reality, as work will start in January 2006, to build a new and exciting educational establishment on the Nottingham Road site.

The innovative design for the new school takes cues from Southwell Minster and will provide sophisticated and flexible educational accommodation as well as significant opportunities for community usage. In keeping with the Minster Schools specialist status in Music and Humanities, these include a recital room, 150 seat theatre, and 500 seat hall along with indoor and outdoor (all weather) sports facilities. The new school will be built at the rear of the current Nottingham Road buildings, so keeping the disruption to the education of our students to a minimum.

The Minster School is very grateful to have received significant funding to realise its dream. This funding has come from: Central Government (£30,930,000), Nottinghamshire LEA (\pounds 1,000,000) and the Diocese of

Southwell (£50,000). On top of this, the School itself must raise £450,000. Two thirds of this (£300k) will come from the Governors capital budget, which leaves £150k to be obtained by way of fund raising, through a concerted effort from the School, the Governors and the Parents working together. A fund raising team has been created (though more volunteers are always welcome!) and plans are being drawn up to appeal to all sections of the school, local and business communities. Education in 19th Century Halam

The earliest reference to a school in Halam is in White's 1844 Directory which mentions a church Sunday school under the care of the Rev. Charles Taylor. In 1854 the directory named Sarah Wright as the schoolmistress. By 1864 White's Directory refers to a 'small day & Sunday School' which Sir Richard Sutton of Norwood had converted from a barn in 1854 and which was under the care of Reverend Tatham. By this time Miss V. Leach was the schoolmistress. In those days a schoolmistress had to leave her post if she married. The barn which was the first school is now part of the property of Hill Farm and stands on what is now School Lane, near to the main crossroads in the village and opposite the School House which was built in 1886 by L.R. Starkey of Norwood. Subjects taught were reading, writing, arithmetic, geography history and needlework. Religious and moral instruction was supervised by the vicar.

In 1886 this first school was exchanged by L.R.Starkey for the present school which was new-built and had a playground and adjoining house for the schoolmistress, at that time Miss Sarah Bradley. The new school measuring 30 ft by 18 ft could accommodate 70 children.

It was officially opened on 7 June 1886. The piece of land it stands on was formerly the site of 5 Poor Houses. The school field was formerly the area known as the Pinfold where stray animals were held. L.R. Starkey bought this land at an auction held at The Plough for £50 in 1885. Problems were mainly to do with absenteeism and these give an insight into the working life of the village. School holidays were connected

with agriculture, especially haymaking and harvest. In September the school closed so everyone could go blackberry picking! Free education did not exist in Halam until 4 September 1891. Prior to this school fees of 3d. and 2d. were collected by Mr Blundell, who was also the attendance officer. Miss Bradley retired 3 June 1890. Mrs E Singleton, Miss A Bradshaw and Mrs M Pippard succeeded her in the 1890's. A school log book dating from 1875 details the full part which the school played in all village activities. (Information is taken from Mrs Coulthard's book about Halam.)

The photograph below shows 'Halam School Loosing' – Halam schoolchildren show their joy as they are let out of school onto Halam crossroads. This photo is on a postcard dated 1907.

Neighbourhood Watch


Dog Poisoned
