WDC – Consideration of WDC's report on Options for modernising local government Cllr Brownridge attended a presentation by WDC on the options for modernising local government in Buckinghamshire. The four District Councils (Wycombe, Aylesbury Vale, Chiltern and South Bucks) commissioned Deloittes to carry out an analysis of the options for reforming the current structure of local government in Bucks. They looked at three options: a single unitary council, a two unitary council where one of the Councils would be based on the area currently covered by Aylesbury Vale Council and the other on the area covered by Chiltern, South Bucks and Wycombe District Councils and a three unitary option based on the area covered by Aylesbury Vale Council, by Wycombe District Council and by Chiltern and South Bucks 	Clerk

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	combined. The report concluded that a two or three unitary		
	option would provide the best way forward. WDC haven't yet		
	taken a decision. WDC pointed out that it is imperative for BCC		
	to do something quickly because they are running short of		
	money. The Districts do not have the same imperative as they		
	have already taken a lot of measures to reduce costs and to cope		
	with the pressures ahead. Districts are querying why it would		
	make sense to give BCC more responsibility when they are		
	already struggling with some of then services for which they are		
	responsible such as Adult Social Care, Children's services and		
	-		
	roads. Districts consider that reorganising without changing the		
	way things are done particularly with regard to Adult Social Care		
	and Children's services won't solve the challenges that local		
	government is facing. There would have to be major changes		
	under a two or three unitary solution as the districts do not		
	currently deal with these services. The Districts envisage these		
	services still being delivered across the four districts but		
	6		
	contracting them out to a different body. The four Districts want		
	to take a more measured approach, taking time to consult before		
	drawing up a more detailed business case. They say that DCLG		
	have confirmed that they will not be making a decision about any		
	reorganisation in Bucks and that they expect any decision to be		
	made locally and be based on local consensus.
