#### CHAIRMAN'S REPORT



### COUNCILLOR PADDY RIORDAN

During the last year the Parish Council has worked tirelessly to improve the quality of life for residents.

This was the last year on the Parish Council of Joan Buller, her knowledge and expertise will be

greatly missed. We will so, so, miss her.

We are delighted to have our Clerk, Richard who joined us last July, and all the team. Deborah, Jean and Paul, who have helped to improve the whole running of our parish office, assisting councillors and residents and helping us press forward with projects which we hope will be a huge benefit to our community.

We constantly engage with the Police, Maidstone Borough Council, Kent County Council, various utility services and authorities to help with the everyday running the village.

We organise a twice a year community litter pick, which I am delighted to say is well attended by our parishioners to try and keep our village clean.

We regularly work with the Community Payback Team to make various improvements, such as painting, cutting hedges, working on the telephone box, cleaning paths and driveways, cleaning gutters, working at Surrenden Field, the Jubilee Field and throughout the village.

The Parish Council Greener Staplehurst group do some fabulous work around the village, maintaining flower planters, planting wildflower areas and trees.

I'm delighted to say we now have some allotments on one of the new developments which the parish council are taking control of.

We work in partnership with all stakeholders to enhance

facilities around the village working with Play Place to find a safe and enjoyable environment for the three week summer long playscheme. We work with the Jubilee Field Management Committee and football clubs to enhance facilities at our sports field. We maintain the skate park.

This year we have taken ownership of the Youth Club building and I'm delighted to say the facility is being enjoyed by many of our young people in the village.

We enjoyed supporting the Women's Institute celebrate their hundred year anniversary, we brighten up the village every year at Christmas time with Christmas motifs and a Christmas tree & lights at the parade, we support the village Remembrance Day parade, we constantly attempt to improve communication with our residents via our website, social media and village update magazine.

We have various projects in the pipeline at the moment. Many of you will be aware of a 3G all-sports pitch we are looking into at the Jubilee Field. We want to improve the damaged brickwork at The Parade area and install bicycle racks at there. We have agreed to install an outdoor adult gym at Surrenden Field, due to open in summer 2023.

The Road Safety Group are constantly looking to improve the road and pavement network, which I'm sure you would appreciate is quite a difficult job at the moment.

We are constantly heavily engaged in planning matters. We are regularly reviewing our neighbourhood plan policy and we are engaging with Maidstone Borough Council in relation to the local plan for the area.

We also run our yearly Volunteer Awards Scheme which was presented to 4 fantastic youngsters for their volunteering in the community plus Christine Ralph for her outstanding service to Staplehurst. She also received the Kent Association of Local Council's Volunteer's Award this year.

#### **GREENER STAPLEHURST GROUP (GSG)**

#### **YOUTH CLUB**

This year has been about settling in to delivering a regular Youth Service to the young people in Staplehurst. The highlights are that we regularly get 15-20 young people attending - sometimes more - and enjoying a range of activities such as cooking, pool, IT games. music etc.

The excellent KCC Youth Service staff are brilliant; leading activities and able to offer assistance in a range of areas to support the young people with the pressure of today's world, including counselling when needed.

We have had a number of events such as the Christmas trip to a pantomime and the Family Funday. We look forward to another Family Funday at Surrenden Field on the 2nd August 2023. We are planning a potential

weekend trip later in the year.

We have also done some improvements including a new entrance ramp to improve access.



## NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN REVIEW GROUP Contact: Margaret Arger

We welcomed two new councillors to the group and one new resident. Sadly, we saw the passing of Robin Kenworthy, a founder member of the group and a strong advocate for the those with disability and a strong proponent on the environment.

We have spent 2022 reviewing our plan and having new eyes has brought fresh ideas and clarity. This was greatly helped by meeting face to face and enabled a free flow of ideas and opinions. We now have a draft document which with agreement from the Parish Council will be forwarded to the proposed consultant. The Parish Council have agreed to our request for a Housing Needs Survey as our last one was in 2016 and the world is a different place, so we look forward with interest to the results and still await confirmation of a start date.

The group are looking to a two-day consultation in the late Autumn for you to view the plan and have your say.

My grateful thanks to the members of the group for their time and effort in getting to this stage in the process. (Members' details can be found on the Parish Council website).

#### **COMMUNICATIONS GROUP**

Staplehurst Parish Council are eager to engage with our residents, using several options available to us.

We continually update our website and put relevant information on our Facebook page.

We do a quarterly magazine, village update and annual report which have lots of interesting and informative information in them.

We join the Borough Councillors at "drop in surgery" at Staplehurst Library 10am - 12noon on the last Saturday of each month, where residents are very welcome to raise issues with us.

We also welcome residents to every Council and Planning Committee meeting where they are welcome to speak at the public forum before and after the meeting on matters of interest or concern.

#### **SCENIC**



This year the work of SCEnic has focused on Surrenden Field. We have installed new benches and bins throughout the area.

We have tendered and agreed the installation a new Outdoor Gym plus the playground

to be improved with new designs on the playground floor – both being installed as we write.

In addition we have installed some new bike racks at the Parade, finished off the telephone booth which is now available for Community Groups to advertise the meetings or events.



#### **ROAD SAFETY GROUP**

The Parish Council's Road Safety Group meet regularly to discuss safety issues in the village and seek solutions. In the 2022/23 we have:

#### Correspondence

Residents' emails and comments to the parish office are forwarded for discussion and include obstructions of the footpaths by hedges and wheelie bins which we try to deal with through a polite letter. The Parish Council can refer such matters on to MBC or KCC as appropriate as they have enforcement powers. Nesting birds should never be disturbed, but where strands of bramble, hawthorn or stinging nettles protrude beyond your boundaries, please snip them off for everyone's safety. For major hedge cutting work, the season is during the six months from the 1st September until the end of February.

#### Highways Improvement Plan

This is KCC Highways' engagement scheme with every parish. Our priority has been safety around the school and we achieved the installing of dropped kerbs for disabled and push chair users at the entrance and the yellow lines at Gybbon Rise are due soon.

We have been lobbying for improvements to the Hawkenbury Bridge for years. Finally improved signage was installed, only to last on the Hawkenbury side a short while before being shunted into the hedge. The repair, reported immediately, has finally been made.

#### **Speed Indication Device**

Three locations for a SID have been identified, consulted on and approved. They are due to be installed in July 2023. This system will be moved between the locations and it will record numbers of vehicles and their speeds as they pass, but most importantly, give a visual numerical speed to the drivers and any passing pedestrians. The battery power available does not make this suitable for use on the A229.

#### Sainsbury's Shuttle Bus

A condition placed on Sainsbury's planning approval was the provision of a shuttle bus service for Staplehurst. We continue to lobby Sainsbury's for a sensible shuttle bus route for Staplehurst.

#### **Community Speedwatch**

Volunteers who have passed the straightforward Kent Police on-line training course are given a roadside induction by our scheme's leader. All speeders are logged into the police database and actions follow for regular speeders. Our role is educational — we do not issue fines or points, but the police can follow-up on the information we provide to add to our efforts. Volunteers welcome.

#### **Auto Speedwatch**

This police-controlled automatic system to support our efforts was installed in Staplehurst in June 2022, only the second location in the county, where 40 mph is the signed limit. Those travelling past at 46mph and above were recorded and a letter issued. In July, 595 vehicles triggered the device. 16 of these had no valid tax and another 12 no MOT. Some of these vehicles were persistent offenders and when the increasingly strongly-worded letters were ignored, a uniformed officer would hand-deliver the next having parked a shiny car for the neighbours to see. One vehicle has been recorded 11 times, but it is encouraging to see that this is the exception. Numbers recorded have dropped as the letters have taken effect. From June 2022 until the end of March 2023 there have been over 2,000 letters sent and over 100 tax or MOT follow-ups.

- Any grant made by the Council must directly benefit the Parish of Staplehurst and its electorate.
- The Council cannot make a grant to individuals.
- The organisation making a grant request should be a non-profit making voluntary organisation where membership is open.
- The maximum limit for Grants is £1,000 per application.
- · The Council will not commit to any continuing revenue expenditure.
- · Grants cannot be awarded retrospectively, after the relevant event or project has been completed.
