# **Great People Great Things**

The refreshed Inn with the Well logo reminds us that we have been fortunate enough to have a pub in our village since 1685. That's 365 years! Each generation has done its bit to ensure this vital community hub keeps going for the benefit of all of us, and it has never been more important to support our local pubs as it is now.

With this in mind, some spirited residents have seized the initiative and set up a registered charity in the community interest. Taking the pub as its inspiration, and with the blessing and support of Mike & Megan, it has been named the 'Old Wellonians', and its aim is to facilitate and support activities, events and excursions associated with the pub.

Its first deed has been to purchase a 17-seater minibus, affectionately christened 'Chantelle'. To find out the story behind this you'll have to go to the pub and ask an Old Wellonian! The bus is an asset of the charity, and both are intended to support both the village and the pub.

Living in a rural area as we do, many residents report that transport can be

the barrier to getting out and about to events in numbers, so these intrepid Old Wellonians are resolving this by procuring this group transport from a business in the village. And it has truly been a collaborative village initiative so far, as not only has the bus been sourced and purchased by villagers, but the logo has been designed by a resident graphic designer, and the charity will be run and governed by villagers in line with proper procedures.



Chantelle's maiden outing was in early April to take members and some village rugby fans to sunny St Austell to watch Marlborough Rugby Club play an away fixture. Day trippers met at the pub starting the day with a hearty breakfast, then enjoyed a scenic drive to and from the Cornish coast and watched a nail-biting game of rugby. It was the purchase of the minibus that made this group outing possible.

Plans for future excursions include a day trip to the Dorset Coast, visits to fairs and festivals, and more locally, shuttling walkers along the Ridgeway.

The charity is in its very early stages, so is accepting applications for membership and welcomes suggestions for events and outings that members and residents would like to attend. So, if you have an idea and are involved with a group of people who could benefit from this transport, then find out more by popping into the pub and asking for an Old Wellonian!

# **Chiseldon Local History Group**

The next meeting is on 17 May in the Church Hall at 7.30 p.m. Nick Baxter will present "Swindon's Other Railway". The Midland and South Western Junction Railway ran from Andoversford (near Cheltenham) through Cirencester and Swindon to Andover. The Swindon to Marlborough section, which ran through Chiseldon, was opened in 1881 and Chiseldon station closed in 1961. This talk will bring back memories for some residents and give a taste of the past for others. Annual membership is £20. Non-members fees are £5 per meeting.

Chiseldon Museum is now open for the summer on Saturdays until 30 September from 2-4pm (closed 6 May). New displays include the Chiseldon Windmill, a display of 20th Century technology, local maps through the ages and a special feature on past Coronations.
