Of a time period where God was doing something new. A time period of transformation.

From stories of the floods in Genesis, to Moses, to Jesus, the number 40 sees us travel through a transition, where we journey from one epoch to another.

As we transition into this new season of Spring, and as we travel into this new season of Lent and then Easter, we pray that it will be a time for you, of reflection, of light, of journeying with God, and of new life.


