## Minutes of the Council Meeting on $6^{th}$ November 2025 at 7.30 pm in Poyntington Village Hall

The following were present: Councillors Perryman, Buckland, Dillon, Lacey, Wheadon and the Clerk

- 25.60 **Apologies for absence:** Cllr Simnett, Stubbs and Dorset Cllr Legg
- 25.61 **Declarations of interest:** Cllr Dillon Solar farm at Wyke
- 25.62 **The minutes of the meeting held 4<sup>th</sup> September 2025** were confirmed and signed.
- 25.63 **Matters arising:**

Cllr Perryman reported that he had taken part in the earthwatch WaterBlitz water testing on the River Yeo in Oborne earlier in the year. The recently published results show a marked deterioration in water quality between the river in Oborne and the next testing point at the Purlieu Meadows in Sherborne. There was a moderately elevated level of nitrate content in Oborne, with the higher level in Sherborne indicating a poor ecological status. Unfortunately 60% of waters tested across the UK were rated poor with unacceptable levels of nutrient pollution. The council thought that the rise in nitrates between Oborne and Sherborne would be due to farming in the Milborne Port area. Cllr Buckland explained that new rules around slurry storage and use should improve matters, but it was also suggested that taking buffer zones along river banks out of farm use would reduce nutrients entering the water.

Cllr Buckland reported on the inaugural meeting of Wild Sherborne. Set up by Neil Walker the group is bringing together all the associations in Sherborne with a sustainability ethos, e.g. The Green Shed, The Repair Café etc. Cllr Buckland represented the parish council. The council agreed that this is a positive development.

The financial report for the year 2025-26 to date was received and accepted. Payments in accordance with budget were approved: Clerk salary: £415.70, (HMRC - £17.20 This will be deducted from the next payment or reclaimed at the end of the financial year), Poyntington Village Hall £20 hall hire.

Payments since the last meeting authorised: HugoFox £100. The clerk explained that the expected £100 grant from the government, for the switch to the gov.uk domain with HugoFox, had been oversubscribed and not issued to Yeohead. However, HugoFox has now introduced a reduced rate for just one email address at £2.49 per month. The clerk has moved the account to this rate from November.
