COUNCIL NEWS

The weekend before the Annual Parish Meeting the Parish Council was informed its Chairman, Simon Hand, had been taken ill and was in hospital. The Council sends Simon its best wishes for a swift recovery.

As a result the Vice Chairman, Sheelagh Cohen, replaced him at the Annual Parish Meeting which included a display and consultation regarding the proposed Community Facility and Library at the former Barclays Bank. The Council has made its own response to the consultation after hearing parishioners views at this meeting. The Council reported its work over the last year and some future plans, such as a Hamble wide consultation to seek parishioners views on priorities for a plan for Hamble in the next few years. A report of this meeting will be in the next Village Magazine.

As mentioned in the Council News at the end of last year, representatives of Foreman Homes attended a Parish Council meeting to inform the Council that it was in preapplication discussions with the planning authority, regarding a proposed development of 50 residential units in the field between the north end of the footpath alongside the former airfield and the houses in Satchell Lane opposite the Mercury estate. Before a recent Council meeting representatives of the landowners made a presentation to the Council regarding their draft proposals. They outlined the constraints and opportunities of the site and a draft proposal to build 70 dwellings of which 40% would be affordable housing. They had identified the access point to be after the bend opposite the Halyards that would necessitate realignment of the road at the bend. A footpath would be provided along the road and around the site.

It might seem some time away but the Council has been working with some parishioners planning for next Christmas and its festive lights. Representatives of the Council attended a festive lights seminar to seek information about best practice and the regulations that must be met. Councillors have also been on a course about the planning process and will be undertaking training to update them on Local Council Finance.



As it is the end of the financial year the Council has been dealing with a number of financial matters such as audit, final end of year accounts and confirming its financial risk assessment. Although the Parish Council can seek advice from Hampshire Association of Local Councils, it has decided to appoint consultants to assist with Human Resources, Health and Safety policies and provide additional advice.

During the last month works to the dropped kerb from the car park at the Foreshore have been completed to improve access to the public facilities. Eastleigh Borough Council funded and undertook the work. This takes us one step closer to the facilities being open.

The Council has agreed to support and give a financial contribution towards the Borough Council's Summer Park Sport 2017 activities, some of which will be held in Hamble.

As is advertised in this magazine the Roy Underdown Pavilion is available for hire and it is now attracting a wider range of users. As a result the Council is reviewing and updating its conditions of hire. Please remember as well as being used by community groups it can also be hired by private groups for events such as parties. Message from the Clerk

So this is the second edition of the magazine in colour. We are still experimenting so you might see slight changes in this edition to the last. When we took the decision to move to colour we said we would do it for 3 months and see what the feedback was like. So now is the time to make your views known. You can drop me a line, send me an email or post a comment on Facebook. You'll find our details in the normal place inside front page of the magazine.

On a similar subject the council is now firming up its plans for the consultation exercise titled WeRHamble - A Community Vision. It will start on the 15th May and run to the 30th June 2017. During that period we want to hear from residents, local interest groups, landowners, businesses and stakeholders. We will be arranging community events and hope as many of you as possible will come along. For those of you that can't make it there will be a range of other opportunities to take part. There will be posters going up over the village during the next few weeks and post cards sent out that will give more details, so keep an eye open for them.

Please make sure you make your views are heard. The responses that we get will help us to shape a vision for the village for the next 10 years. It will help us to understand what you want us to spend your money on and the types of partnerships that will be important in meeting your needs and aspirations. It's easy to think that your views won't make a difference but you'd be surprised at how a comment can trigger a chain of responses that in turn result in something changing for the better. So don't be shy!

Already the team are looking at the replacement of play equipment and the pavilion at Mount Pleasant. The current equipment has served us well but is now looking dated. We want to talk to parents that regularly use the area, the children themselves and the younger people that use the skate park and youth shelters. We have had a chat with the Head Teacher at Hamble Primary School about coming in to speak to the children to find out what they want and we hope that through HYPE (the youth engagement project) we can do the same with young people. We will be looking at funding and grant giving schemes to help cover the cost of replacement equipment and getting support from local people could make all the difference in being successful or not.

As the warmer months draw on you will see the Grounds Team out keeping the village looking at its best. Their work programme is varied from cutting the grass and pruning work, to emptying bins and tidying up around our various open spaces and pavilions, keeping an eye on the allotments, the dinghy park and churchyard as well. We do get feedback on the difference that they make in the local area but if you like something they've done and you get a chance to tell them, please do. They work incredibly hard and are very proud of the village and the spaces they look after.

Finally we are improving the range of information that can be found on the website. It's not always easy to know what information people find useful so there is an element of trial and error. We hope by the end of the year that there will be lots more information about the services we provide, booking information about our community spaces as well as introducing on line payments. We want people to be able to do business when it suits them not when we are open. As things change I'll keep you up dated.

WETWHEELS HAMBLE

Wetwheels Hamble is up and running - a ten metre accessible catamaran capable of carrying up to ten individuals (three of which can be wheelchair users). The aim of this local charity is to provide the opportunity for disabled and disadvantaged people, of all ages to experience and enjoy power boating and thereby improve their aspirations and



ability to enjoy life to the full. The boat has 600hp, twin Suzuki engines with a maximum speed of 40knots (50 mph). Since the boat's launch in June nearly 350 passengers have enjoyed the Wetwheels Hamble experience.

Wetwheels Hamble is the third boat for the Wetwheels Foundation and the boat operates out of the Royal Southern Yacht Club Prince Philip Haven. Where possible the trips are heavily subsidised for disadvantaged groups. The charity is dependent on the generosity of donations and private charters (e.g. fishing) to cover the annual operating costs. EASTLEIGH MENS SHED

Eastleigh Mens Shed was established early in 2014, by it's four founder members Hugh, Bryan, Graham and Andi. From a small group meeting in a pub twice a month we now have approaching forty members meeting at our Hamble base every Wednesday and Thursday.

Eastleigh Mens Shed is a larger version of the typical man's shed in the garden – a place

where he feels at home and pursues practical interests with a high degree of autonomy.

Eastleigh Mens Shed offers this to a group of such men where members share the tools and resources they need to work on group projects or one of their own choosing at their own pace and in a safe, friendly and inclusive venue. We are a place of skill-sharing and informal learning, of individual pursuits and community projects, of purpose, achievement and social interaction. A place of leisure where men come together to work.

A Shed's activities usually involve making or mending in wood (e.g. carpentry, joinery, turning, carving, whittling, marquetry, furniture renovation) but may include metalworking (milling, sheet metal, welding, etc.) bike repair, gardening, electronics, tool renovation, boat

renovation, model engineering (model railways, planes) and even building a car! Reclamation, reuse and restoration will feature strongly – and some say that is true of the men too! Although Sheds mostly attract older men, some have included men of any age, women and young people. Whichever activities are pursued the essence of a Shed is not a building, which some don't have, but the network of relationships between the members.

Hamble Local History Society Netley Chapel

At its last meeting there was a much larger than expected attendance with visitors out numbering Society members. This was because Paul Del-A-More, who is the Hampshire County Council's Senior Project Manager, Country Parks Transformation, gave a talk about the history of Netley Hospital and the current Chapel restoration project. As well as the talk Paul brought along some of the project's volunteers with a display of pictures of Netley Hospital over the years of its existence.

Paul started his illustrated talk by explaining his role in the £3.1 million project and that as a child he lived in Hamble. The need for a military hospital was identified during the Crimean war and Queen Victoria was concerned there was nothing to serve the injured soldiers. Therefore it was agreed that a 1000 bed hospital was required in this country by the sea so the hospital ships from abroad could land the casualties direct to the hospital.

Netley was chosen as a suitable location and in 1855 a hundred and nine acres of land was bought from the Chamberlayne family for £15,000. Queen Victoria laid the foundation stone with a casket of memorabilia underneath it in 1856. Florence Nightingale was critical of the hospital's design and very few of the changes she suggested were implemented. The hospital had its own pier and it was not until 1863 that it was ready to receive its first patients. It had 138 wards on three floors and its final cost was £350,000.

The hospital became a leading centre for medical research and Paul told of the important doctors that worked there and their achievements in medical discoveries. Netley was a training hospital so there was an operation theatre with a gallery for 100 trainees to watch the doctors undertaking surgery. There was also a museum of military surgery at Netley to help with medical research. Paul spoke about nursing as well and that in 1881 the Army Nursing Service was established.

As well as the hospital there was a chapel, cemetery, billiards room, theatre, school and post office.

The First World War was a very busy period for the hospital and by this time it had its own railway station as the larger hospital ships could not land the casualties at the hospital's pier. These ships went to Southampton Docks and the injured soldiers were transferred to Netley by hospital trains. The hospital was expanded into the grounds with a Red Cross hutted hospital.

Paul explained some of the treatments that were undertaken on the casualties, such as a strong magnetic machine that pulled metal shrapnel from patients eyes. The hospital had an asylum for insane soldiers but little was known of mental consequences of war such as shell shock.

During the Second World War the hospital was handed over to the Americans in 1944 but they were not impressed by the quality of the facilities there. It was handed back in 1945. The hospital closed in 1958 and the main building was demolished in 1966, just leaving the chapel and few other buildings.

Paul then went on to tell the meeting about the impressive £3.1 million project he is leading to restore the Chapel, including £355,000 for wider park improvements. There will be four structures to identify the corners of the hospital and another to identify the location of the former pier. These will bring alive the hospital history through images and text and will also tell the story of those who worked there.

At the end of the meeting there was a question and answer session and there was a long discussion about whether an American Jeep had driven along the quarter of a mile long corridor. Paul said as far as he was concerned he believed it was folklore until someone provided any evidence such as a photograph to prove it happened, although a number of the audience disagreed from stories they had been told.

Paul explained the name to be used for the hospital from now will be the 'Royal Victoria Military Hospital', so it can be differentiated and found easily on the internet from a number of other Royal Victoria Hospitals around the world.

It is hoped that the project will be completed by summer 2018, when access to the Chapel will be free but with a charge for people who wish to go up its tower. A very successful talk with an excellent balance between the hospital's history and the current restoration programme.



Do you know anyone with an interest in wild plants or who would like to learn more about them? As the weather warms and the days get longer we are looking for people to help us.

The National Plant Monitoring Scheme is helping us to understand what is happening to different habitats across the UK and is set to run for a number of years. The Scheme has been running for two survey seasons and over 900 volunteers have signed up and been out surveying. One of the reasons the scheme has enjoyed such good success in attracting volunteers is because of the support of local parish councils. Many of these volunteers are new to plant surveying and have found the scheme accessible, are enjoying taking part and are exploring places to close to them and finding out new things. Volunteers are supported by materials which are sent to them, online resources and free training courses.

Do you know somebody who enjoys being outside? There are still opportunities to get involved with the scheme as a volunteer. In fact the more volunteers we have the more information is generated allowing us to get an even better understanding of what is happening in the landscape.

Who we are and what we need:

This scheme is a partnership between <u>Botanical Society of Britain and Ireland</u> (BSBI); <u>JNCC</u>; <u>Centre for Ecology and Hydrology</u> (CEH) and <u>Plantlife</u> and is backed by the government. Volunteers are recruited and supported to survey 5 plots in a kilometre square close to where they live. The plots will be surveyed twice a year. The kilometre squares to monitor have been identified by stratified random sampling. The plants have been chosen as indicators of the health of individual habitats. There are 3 levels volunteers can participate at depending on confidence and knowledge and support will be provided both through training; web and telephone.
