This will comprise of red surfacing with 30-mph roundels marked on the carriageway. We are also advised that Highways agents have been asked to update the previous by-pass study to take account of more recent traffic forecasts and other factors that may have changed. This will enable the Highways Agency to review the inclusion into their programme. Copy letters to be sent to Fiona Jones MP.
- Petition: Complaints have been received that businesses in Dunham had not been approached. It was agreed that the arrangements could have been a lot better. Clir Hempsall reported that the Petition had been presented to the Environment Committee on 10th December.

These details are to be confirmed by letter to the Parish Council.

(i) Highways Agency - Reply received from David Griffiths. The question of safety at Ragnall crossroads is still being examined. The revised Dunham by-pass study is still awaited from NCC. Streetlighting has been looked into but it does not meet current criteria and additional lighting will not be provided at the present time. Surface water problems should have now been addressed. Other areas adjacent to gutters are not considered a safety hazard. No imperfections were found along Upper Row and the surface was shown to be within normal tolerance standards. The manhole covers at Darlton are to be reset. The contractor has been instructed to attend to streetlight 25 at Darlton. Councillors felt that the standard of work had not been satisfactory and that problems highlighted had not been addressed. Further letter to be sent to the Highways Agency.

- (ii) <u>Dunham Bridge Works</u>: The Chairman reported that the engineer in charge of the works at Dunham Bridge had been approached for additional signage. This is to be chased up. Comments were made about problems for pedestrians using the bridge during the works. Signs blown down in the wind had taken five days to re-erect.
