## Tree warden and foot path report

The past year has seen unprecedented use of our footpaths, especially the Greensand Way which was a sea of mud for a number of months over lock down. Activity has dropped back to a more normal level and slightly drier weather has meant that the ground has recovered well. Nettles and undergrowth are now starting make some paths difficult to access and some clearance activity is expected soon but if you find any paths blocked, contact the public rights of way office who will get contractors out or contact the land owner to get paths clear. Any issues with signage or access should also be reported online to the public rights of way office.

Tree health continues to be a concern with Ash die back and horse chestnut leaf miner still affecting many trees around the country. As ever, remain vigilant and report anything online if trees start to look unwell. There are no specific tree related issues in Linton and trees planted last winter are mostly ok despite some dry weather earlier in the year.
