Remembrance Sunday

The 2019 Act of Remembrance will take place on Sunday 10th November starting at 10.50am at the War Memorial in the churchyard. This year's service will follow the traditional pattern after the special format of the WW1 centenary service last vear. The Legion Standard will be paraded, poppy wreaths laid by the Royal British Legion branch and village organisations, and crosses planted by anyone wishing to remember those known to them. After the names of the fallen have been read out and the Last Post played, two minutes silence will be observed. The bugler will play the Reveille and the Standard Bearer will lead the procession into church for the service itself - this year conducted by Rev Nick Ktorides.

What does the Royal British Legion do?

Last year was the centenary of the end of World War One. Next year we will reach the 75th anniversary of VE day on 8th May and VJ day on 15th August. Sadly we have to remember many Armed Forces personnel who have died in military service over the years since then. The Royal British Legion plays a key role in the nation's remembrance, but is also there to support veterans. serving personnel, and their families. As the largest UK Armed Forces charity, the Legion works with a network of partners to provide support wherever and whenever it is needed at any age and stage. Since 1921 the Legion has been a lifeline to serving and ex-serving personnel and their families. The Legion website shows a wide spectrum of activities meeting a range of needs - 'Military Kids Club Heroes', Recovery Centres and 'Battle Back', the Invictus Games, financial and housing advice for service leavers, support to combat loneliness, 'Count Them In' to identify needs of service personnel and veterans in the next census - the list is extensive and new initiatives are developed as needs evolve.

Parish Council Elections 2020

What gives Stanton Harcourt and Sutton the sense of community and makes it a great place to live is its residents. The fact so many of you get actively involved to make our village an interesting and better place to live. We all have different skills and available time to give to our community. Whether you simply pick up a piece of rubbish as you are walking about the village, look in on a neighbour or you put in many hours of community work. Your Parish Council would like to Thank You.

Every four years Parish Councils identify if any members of our community wish to join the Parish Council, if more people would like to be Parish Councillors that there are positions then an election will be held in May 2020. The Stanton Harcourt and Sutton Parish Council is made up of six councillors Parish councils have a variety of powers and duties, all of which impact directly on the community but have very few funds. Funding for the Parish Council to fulfil its obligations is provided by the contributions made by the parishioners in their Council Tax to West Oxfordshire council. It is paid to the Parish Council twice annually and is called the PRECEPT. You will see this mentioned on your Council Tax Bill.

This money is used to ensure that many community facilities are suitably maintained this includes our cemetery, various child's play parks, this village voice is produced and delivered to your door etc as well as working with local government on behalf of our community to ensure they understand the villagers point of view

Last year I saw a short article in the newsletter about a wonderful friendly club for adult musicians and thought that other people might like to hear about it. If you are learning an instrument, it can be quite difficult to find occasions where you can perform, so that when you do get the chance you are overcome with nerves! The club is called the Oxfordshire Performers Club, and every 6 weeks or so, there are informal concerts where any adult amateur musician who has a piece of music to offer can perform, without the pressures of a formal concert. The sessions are really friendly and relaxed: those of us who have chosen to play at a particular session perform to each other, friends and family, followed by an excellent socialising session fuelled with tea and cake. An added bonus for me is that I have been able to meet up with people who are learning other instruments and who want to team up to play duets or ensemble pieces. For more experienced players, it is also a useful forum for trying out pieces before performing them in public. If there is anyone out there who enjoys playing any instrument at an amateur level and wants to meet other musicians I would encourage you very strongly to give it a try.
