

The Council meets on the second Monday of the month in the Thomas Hughes Memorial Hall, at 7.30pm. All residents are welcome to attend these meetings and raise any issues; we will make it easy for you by having an "open forum" session early in the meeting (normally 8pm) at which issues may be raised and discussed. The agenda is published on the Parish Council website and notice board at least three clear days before the meeting. We particularly welcome residents with planning applications that are to be considered at the meeting, to come and tell us about the application and explain any specific points which they may wish to make.

#### **Annual Assembly**

The Annual Assembly is to take place at 7.30pm on Monday 8 April in the THMH; refreshments will be served in the foyer from 7.00 pm. This is your chance to learn about what your Parish Council has done over the past year, its plans for 2019, and the opportunity for you to have your say, and ask any questions you may have. More information will be posted on the website, by e-mail and on the Parish Council notice board.

#### **Local Council Elections - May 2019**

Local elections for district and parish councils will take place on 2 May 2019. Individual nomination forms for positions on Uffington Parish Council have to be delivered to the Vale District Council by 4pm on 3<sup>rd</sup> April. We very much wish to see nominations from residents of Uffington to join the Council – all organisations need new blood from time to time. At the time of writing, we do not know if there will be more than 6 people putting themselves forward for the six Councillor positions, thus triggering an actual election. Updates will be posted on the website, by e-mail and on the Parish Council notice board.

#### **Defibrillators**

In late January the three villages of Uffington, Baulking and Woolstone completed a major project, to install defibrillators. Six defibrillators are now available 24/7, 365 days a year, throughout the 'UBW' villages, located as follows:

- a. Uffington: The Fox and Hounds, Thomas Hughes Memorial Hall, Uffington Sports Club and the telephone box opposite St Mary's Church.
- b. Baulking: The telephone box opposite St Nicholas Church.
- c. Woolstone: The White Horse Inn.

Sudden Cardiac Arrest (SCA) is a condition from which no one is immune. From children to adults, to fitness fanatics and couch potatoes; everyone and anyone is susceptible to cardiac arrest, with over 30,000 occurring in the UK each year alone, with little to no prior symptoms before a collapse. The only definitive treatment against SCA is the life-saving shock from a defibrillator. Pairing this along with effective CPR can help to increase a victim's chance of survival from 6% to 74% if delivered within the first 3-5 minutes of collapse.


Slowly but surely, we're seeing more and more access to life-saving defibrillators available in public locations, meaning quicker treatment can be provided to a casualty and improving survival chances. We hope that our defibrillators won't be used, but we are very pleased that we can now provide life-saving support in case of a sudden cardiac arrest.

Important: Please note that if you need to use a defibrillator in an emergency, you must call 999 first so an ambulance can be deployed straight away, and you will be given further advice on how to access a defibrillator if appropriate.

We would like to thank:

- Nicki Rossiter and Alison Clarke for their persistence in pushing this project, and the many individuals who have contributed to raising a lot of money; this has been used to provide everyone in the UBW villages with contact cards.
- The Russ family who conducted a number of informative and amusing familiarisation sessions throughout the UBW villages, attended by over 90 people. (Strictly speaking, 'training' is not needed because the defibrillators are designed for use by anybody, regardless of training; they tell you very clearly what you must do, once they have been opened up).

#### Parking on Broad Street by the School

**Please do NOT park**, for however short a period of time, on the yellow zig zag lines outside the School, or on the white line which runs from the Church gate back towards the Museum. Both are there for an important purpose - which is to make it possible for children to enter and leave the playground safely. <u>Despite repeated reminders</u>, this request is still ignored by some users of the school. It is a parking offence to park on these lines and you may be liable for penalties.

#### **Speedwatch**

Thank you to those who have put their names forward for training and involvement with the Speedwatch initiative. By the time this edition of the Courier is published, we hope to have completed the necessary training and be moving forward to some 'proper' sessions. We are also looking into the purchase of some equipment for the village, in conjunction with Shrivenham. The intention of course is to deter speeding in the village.

#### **Uffington and Baulking Neighbourhood Plan**

From Robert Hart, Chair of the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group (NPSG):

The Vale District Council's consultation period on the draft Uffington and Baulking Neighbourhood Plan finished on 24 January. The Vale submitted a list of recommended examiners to us for comment and subsequently appointed Mr Andrew Ashcroft as the Examiner for the UB NP in early February. Mr Ashcroft has already visited the village and submitted a short list of questions and requests for clarification, which were returned to the Vale on 15 March.

#### **New planning applications**

We have said this before, but we encourage those intending to submit an application to the Planning department at The Vale District Council to discuss them with the Parish Council at an early stage. We may be able to help you to avoid unnecessary errors which serve to downgrade the quality of the application. There is an opportunity to do this in the Open Forum at every monthly meeting – usually at 8.00pm. If in doubt, please contact any member of the Council.

#### <u> Jacksmeadow – Section 106 Contributions</u>

As part of the planning approval for the development of Jacksmeadow, certain sums of money were required to be paid to the parish, district and county councils as contributions towards the additional infrastructure and facilities required to support additional residents. These facilities may be located within Uffington parish (e.g. Public Art) or further afield if shared (e.g. Secondary Schools or Swimming Pools).

A project to install more seating and two picnic tables on the Jubilee Field has been approved and the equipment ordered; we hope to have them all installed before the Easter holidays.

There is some money left and we would welcome fresh ideas or applications for grants towards projects which would be of benefit to the Uffington community. Please contact any member of the Parish Council to discuss an idea.

From the Vicar

I am writing this on the day we are supposed to leave the EU, and yet the House of Commons, and the country, is still in much turmoil over the issue. Richard Harries, a former Bishop of Oxford delivered his Thought for the Day this morning – he is a wise bird. He spoke of the implications of

'Loving thy neighbour'; that you really have to take the trouble to understand where your neighbour is coming from, to 'walk a mile in their moccasins', before you can think in ways which promote their flourishing.

This willingness to bear with, and walk alongside one another, we know is important to build any kind of relationship. My hunch is that it will go better in Parliament if old and new friendships can be allowed to grow across party lines.

Old friends share some of the same characteristics of old clothes. In the best sense, they're easy. Shared experiences, and deep understanding, mean that an enormous amount can go unsaid. One phrase, or mention of someone's name, can set us off into uncontrolled laughter.

Close companionship fosters intimacy. Shared intimacy gives us permission to be honest with one another. It allows us both to support and challenge one another, because we're working from a position of mutual trust. There is no guile, no agenda. As the Hebrew proverb goes: 'Wounds from a friend can be trusted, while an enemy multiplies kisses.'

We need our friends, and parliamentarians are no different, like we need oxygen. The older the friendship, the more we need to acknowledge it, and them – especially in times of trouble or when the shadows lengthen. Because that's when we need company. There's a verse that is said to come from the novelist Albert Camus or from a Jewish folk song; either way it rings true: 'Don't walk in front of me; I may not follow. Don't walk behind me; I may not lead. Just walk beside me and be my friend.'

Another way of looking at Church or Christianity is that it's about making true friends of ourselves, one another, and of God. Come and try us sometime, you will be made welcome, and not immediately put on a rota! I pray that whatever comes of the whole Brexit process, neither we as a nation, or the MPs in the House of

Commons, and members of the Upper House, don't forget how to love their neighbours, the people they are sitting next to and across the aisle from.

This Prayer for the Nation is on the Church of England website together with some great resources for discussion (look out for our next Holy Moly's date).

God of hope, in these times of change, unite our nation and guide our leaders with your wisdom.

Give us courage to overcome our fears, and help us to build a future in which all may prosper and share; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**

#### **UFFINGTON BAULKING AND WOOLSTONE MINIBUS ASSOCIATION**

Our community minibus, which seats 16 people plus a driver, exists for use by all within our villages and the surrounding area, for social and recreational activities. A team of volunteer drivers operates regular shopping trips, and the minibus may also be reserved by local groups and individual members of the community for their own purposes.

It is necessary for villagers and local groups to join the UBW Minibus Association in order to use the minibus. Membership is available to all, and there is no charge to join.

The shopping trips are to Faringdon every Tuesday and Wantage every Wednesday and Friday. We leave Patricks Orchard, Uffington at 9.30, picking up and setting down members where convenient for them.

The Association is run on a 'not for profit' basis. There is a modest fare for the shopping trips, and Bus Passes may be used.

Group and individual private bookings are charged a flat fee of £20, plus 80p per mile driven, plus VAT. Insurance and fuel are included.

The Association has an ongoing need for new volunteers to drive or assist with administration, in order to sustain our activities. The driving commitment is about one morning a month. A full car licence is required, and training is provided.






