

DODDINGTON PARISH COUNCIL

Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held at Doddington Village Hall on
Monday 9 July 2018 at 7.30pm

Present: Cllr Philip Haynes (Vice Chairman), Cllr Steve Coates, Cllr Graham Cuthbert,
Cllr Peter Duckworth and Cllr Colin Jones and Mrs Wendy Licence (Clerk)

Also present were three members of the public.

1. Apologies

In the absence of Cllr Attwood Cllr Haynes took the chair.

Apologies had been received from Cllr Kevin Attwood (work) and Cllr Kevin Fraser (holiday); apologies accepted.

Apologies had also been received from SBCllr Colin Prescott (at another meeting); apology noted.

2. Declarations of Interest

Cllr Cuthbert declared a pecuniary interest in item 10.i as the property adjoins his land.

3. To Determine whether any items should be discussed in closed session

None were identified.

4. Minutes of the Annual Parish Council Meeting held on 11 June 2018

Councillors **AGREED UNANIMOUSLY** to accept the minutes of the meeting held on 11 June 2018 as a true record of the meeting. The minutes were duly signed by Cllr Haynes.

5. MATTERS ARISING

- The Big Conversation Rural Buses Consultation- Cllr Duckworth will attend the session on 24 July at Ashford, Cllr Fraser will be asked if he would like to attend as well.
- Meeting with KCC re flooding- still waiting to hear back from Alan Blackburn, KCC Highways.

Cllr Coates said there must be a public meeting, residents raised concerns at the last meeting.

Cllr Haynes said the drains are still blocked and the roads have not been swept.

ACTION: Clerk to contact KCC and Swale Borough Council and copy the MP and Ward Member in to the correspondence.

- Water leak- SBCllr Colin Prescott contacted Southern Water after the June meeting and the leak was fixed.
- Church Lane junction

Cllr Jones said he thought the Parish Council was going to contact the farmer.

Cllr Cuthbert said the Chairman had spoken to the farmer in November before the inquest and was told the farmer is working his way down the line of trees.

ACTION: Clerk to ascertain current position from the Chairman.

6. COMMUNITY WARDEN REPORT

Dave Osborne, the Community Warden, was unable to attend the meeting and sent the following report:

One case of fly tipping has been reported in the last month and was along the Ringlestone Road. A fridge freezer had been fly tipped. This was reported to Maidstone Borough Council and was removed on the 22/6/18.

7. NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH REPORT

Apologies had been received from Mrs Jackson, the neighbourhood Watch Co-ordinator for being unable to attend and she reported:

There were two local incidents reported by the Police during the last month.

Between 20th and 21st of June, a green non-registered farm quad was stolen from Syndale Cottages Ospringe Faversham.

Also between 20th and 21st of June, a tree surgeon's truck was broken into overnight in The Street, Newnham. Items stolen were as follows: a Husqvarna 536LIHE3 36V cordless pole hedge trimmer; a Husqvarna battery quick charger QC500; 2 Husqvarna Battery BLi200 36V Li-ion; a Stihl MS 150 TC-E Top Handle Chainsaw; a Stihl Backpack Blower BR 700; a Petzl Vertex Vent Helmet Combination - Chipper Spec; and a Stihl HS 82R-CE hedge cutter (30" cut 22.7cc).

Tree surgeons and others who operate in similar practices are now trying to register all offers of tools for sale as that is a good starting point for tracking down thieves. It would be useful if anyone offered such items reported it to the police immediately.

8. PUBLIC QUESTION TIME

The meeting was adjourned for the public time.

A resident said he has told KCC Highways that should further rain lead to repeat flooding of property and land, he and any neighbours that may be affected will hold KCC responsible and accountable for any and all losses incurred. The drains were meant to have been cleared on 4 July but this has not been done and KCC are unable to provide a date when it will be carried out.

Cllr Haynes thanked residents for attending and said the Parish Council will look into what procedures can be put in place to ensure the flooding does not occur again and will escalate the matter.

A resident asked if there was anything being arranged to commemorate the end of the First World War.

Cllr Haynes said a beacon is being lit and there will be other things going on.

The meeting was reconvened.

9. WAR MEMORIAL

Cllr Cuthbert said he had been contacted by a resident regarding the commemoration of the centenary of the end of the Great War and he was concerned that Newnham has arranged bell ringing and a beacon to mark the event and felt it should be a three-parish event. Church bells will be "Ringin' Out For Peace" at 7.05pm on 11 November. In July 2019, there will be the centenary of street parties across the country.

ACTION: Clerk to ascertain if Newnham has any events planned.

Cllr Haynes reported a further quote has been requested from the stone mason who has indicated he is busy until at the end of the year. Another stone mason has been approached.

ACTION: Clerk to ascertain if the details of the changes are needed before applying for Listed Building Consent.

10. PLANNING MATTERS

i. Ref: 18/503177/FULL

Address: Pine Trees Doddington Lane Doddington Sittingbourne Kent ME9 0AX

Proposal: Single storey rear extensions and addition of skylight to existing roof.

Cllr Cuthbert left the room and took no part in the discussion of decision of this item.

Councillors considered the application and had no objections to the proposals.

Cllr Cuthbert returned to the meeting.

ii. Any other planning matter received by 9 July 2018

Cllr Haynes said he had not received any comments on the draft letter he had circulated. It was agreed for Cllr Haynes to sign the letter and for the Clerk to submit it.

Councillors **AGREED UNANIMOUSLY** to pay Village Hall for hall hire January-June 2018 £108.00 (cheque no 1156).

12. DEFIBRILATOR

There was nothing to report.

13. SPEED WATCH

Cllr Coates said one session was observed by a Councillor Lynsted and Kingsdown Parish Council.

Cllr Jones said the team is trying to demonstrate the impact Speed Watch has had and has asked for statistics, a full report will be given at the Annual Parish Meeting.

Cllr Coates reported that the results to date since 1 April 2018 are that in Doddington there have been ten sessions, one thousand three hundred and two vehicles have passed

through, of these there were seventy-four recorded speeding and twenty received first letters and two received second letters. In Wychling there have been three sessions, with five hundred and twenty-three vehicles of which there were ninety-six recorded speeding of which eighteen received first letters and three received second letters.

Cllr Jones said that drivers recorded are not being recorded twice.

Cllr Coates reported that the Police have been to Wychling with their equipment.

14. PLAYING FIELD

i. Cllr Duckworth's monthly report

Cllr Duckworth reported the swings still have not been painted even though the contractor had said it would be done week commencing 25 June.

ACTION: Clerk to contact the contractor again.

Cllr Duckworth said the date for the play inspection has not been confirmed.

ACTION: Clerk to ascertain the date.

Cllr Duckworth reported the moss was not a problem and the area will be monitored. The football net needs to be secured. The litter bin near Dully Hill is too small.

ACTION: Clerk to contact Swale Borough Council to ascertain when the bins are emptied and if it is possible to have a larger one.

Cllr Duckworth said the pruning of the bushes along the fence to the garage needs to be reviewed.

ACTION: The contractor to be asked for a quotation to prune the bushes and remove the arisings.

ii. To consider request to permit dogs on the Playing Field for the Funday

Councillors considered the further information submitted by the Funday Committee. Concern was expressed that if permission were given for dogs to go on the playing field it might set a precedent. Concern was also expressed about the increase in temporary blindness in children caused by contamination left on the ground after dog mess has been removed.

Cllr Haynes **PROPOSED** that provided there is signage on the gates as well, dogs will be permitted on the Playing Field for the Funday for this year only; **SECONDED** by Cllr Jones: **3- FOR, 1- AGAINST, 1 ABSTENTION- MOTION CARRIED.**

Cllr Haynes said he has complained to KCC Highways about the condition of the roads from Doddington to the M2, there is still debris in the village.

ACTION: Clerk to ask Swale Borough Council when the roads will be swept.

17. ANY OTHER BUSINESS

Cllr Coates said he has received a complaint about the overgrown vegetation at the gas works.

ACTION: Clerk to contact Doddington Place to request it is cut back.

Cllr Coates said concern has been raised that signs on street furniture, advertising Eastling School Fete, have not been removed.

ACTION: Clerk to contact school and request the signs be removed.

Cllr Haynes informed Members that a letter has been received from SBCllr Colin Prescott:
I have to inform you that after due consideration I have decided not to offer myself as a candidate for the Borough Council elections in May 2019.

This has been a difficult and well thought out process. I first considered this many months ago but decided to continue as my love of the ward and my desire to help improve and also maintain rural life was paramount at all times.

I have been a Borough Councillor since 1986 when I was elected to Cherwell District Council until moving back to Kent in 1991. After a short break I became councillor for East Downs Ward in 1992, until the present day.

Representing this ward has been an immensely satisfying role. I have been able to build my electoral base each election, culminating in 2015 with the highest turnout in Faversham of 53.3%. and a personal percentage of the vote of 75.25%

This has only been achieved by diligence and commitment and I am proud that my personal and non partisan dealings within the ward have always been recognised.

This second term as the First Citizen of the Borough has been extremely satisfying, culminating in the largest ever sum raised for the mayoral charities, the second largest was during my first term in 2004-05. I have met many organisations and groups who have approached me to combine forces with them to help them in their voluntary work and the call is impelling. I have also been asked to consider a possible business venture within the Borough.

Recently I was installed as Vice President of Swale Lions and in the next few weeks I am joining several committees within the voluntary sector.

My decision therefore is to continue my commitment to aid and support the community as I have done in my 30 years as a Conservative councillor but in the future it will be in a more varied and useful way.

It has been an honour and a pleasure to represent the people of East Downs Ward for so long but rest assured that if I can be of any help to anyone in the future I shall assist in any way that I can.
