To give a bit of background – parts of Chideock are not able to get “superfast” broadband via copper cable – the “not spots” are mainly North Chideock at all times and Seatown in the holiday period. The Parish Council would like to have an open public meeting at which the ins and outs of how to get a “superfast” connection are explained in layman’s terms. Is this something you could facilitate? There is also another issue, which is BT’s intention to drop conventional copper wire telephone connection replacing it with a digital connection. Many residents are elderly and do not have broadband or a mobile phone and rely heavily on the BT service. Plus, those in the “not spots” with very slow internet. The Parish Council would very much like to hold a public meeting to inform residents about this change and what it means for them. There are a lot of concerns about what would happen if there was a power cut – digital wouldn’t work, some locations don’t get a decent mobile signal and not everyone has a mobile phone. The water in the lagoon stagnates and is contaminated by fertiliser run-off from fields higher up the river and by other farming activity. It may also be contaminated by sewage leakage from dwellings adjacent to the river in North Chideock which are not on mains drainage and have septic tanks. Children and dogs regularly enter the lagoon which has no signs to warn that the water is not safe due to contamination. The Parish Council asks Dorset Council to urgently erect warning signs, as has been done in the past by West Dorset District Council. Please see the attached extract from Google Maps."

This project includes monitoring in three locations over a 12-month period. The monitoring locations have been chosen where we believe there to be high rates of solid fuel burning e.g., using off-grid and HETAS data. On conclusion of this project, we will be able to re-site the monitoring units for further pieces of work.</p> <p>Next year, the target levels for PM2.5 should be in place and we will hopefully have a clearer understanding on the modelling/ monitoring data that Government intend us to use. It will be timely, that in the second half of the year we undertake some monitoring at Chideock. We can certainly work up the details during next year.</p> <p>We are happy to meet with the Air Pollution Action Group but given the summer demands on the service and annual leave commitments would ask for the meeting to be held in September. All I can say is that London's ULEZ and the Clean Air Zones in Bath, Birmingham, Portsmouth, Bristol, Bradford and Manchester must include some trunk roads – so there must surely be some way around this issue. I also note that Dorset Council are going to release new guidance for 20mph zones in Dorset at the end of October and it is possible these may include the facility to introduce them on major roads passing through villages. Please be aware that I have raised a works order to have a minor amount of side verging done to help water interception by the road gullies at or near Vine Cottage. Professor Brunnsden has also agreed to have the silt and stone debris in the water course adjacent to his property removed. From Dave Symonds description of the problem and the pictures supplied by Professor Brunnsden , it would appear that most of the water flooding onto the carriageway is a result of land drainage run off and under capacity both within the culverts and associated water courses. I have cc'd in Messrs Balazs, Probets and Steele to our email exchange and will ask them if they have any records of old West Dorset District Council (WDDC) drainage systems in the area and what action Mr Travers (WDDC) took by diverting surface water flow from Pettycrate lane into the field above Seahill Lane. It was implied that my colleagues were currently building a flood risk model at Chideock and again I will ask them to communicate with both ourselves how far this has now been taken. Once ownership of the drainage system is established it may then be possible to undertake works to reduce the level and incidence of flooding. Currently, from a Highways point of view, although the current situation is undesirable it is relatively transient in nature and although properties have been affected none of the individuals at the meeting stated that flood water had indeed entered their respective dwellings. I would urge any individual who has experienced property/dwelling flooding to compile a SWIM report , I attach a link www.gov.uk/report-flood-cause .
